



















Licenced and Registered Entities

- Across the country there is 19 registered and licensed primary and secondary tobacco and cigarette manufacturers
- ▼ 180 x importers and exporters that deal in tobacco , cigarettes and primary cigarette products.
- ▼ 90% of the manufacturers are based with the Gauteng Region.
- ✓ One tobacco processor and one cigarette manufacturer are based in the Eastern Cape.
- One manufacturer is based in Kwa-Zulu Natal.
- One tobacco processor is based in Polokwane
- Two tobacco manufacturer are based in Western Cape



Importation Overview

Overview of the period 1 April 2018 to 30 September 2018 compared to 1 April 2019 to 30 September 2019:

- ▼ 195.42% increase in cigarette imports under the purpose code/customs procedure code
 DP/A11 from 24 million sticks to 72 million sticks. This is due to the increase of
 imported cigarettes from Switzerland with 233.59%.
- ▼56.93% increase in cigarette imports under the purpose code/customs procedure code WE/E42 from 236 million sticks to 370 million sticks. This is due to an increase of imported cigarettes from China (98.50%).
- ▼0.88% decrease in cigarette imports under the purpose code/customs procedure code
 WH/E40 from 1.51 billion sticks to 1.50 billion sticks. This is due to the decrease of
 imported cigarettes from Tanzania (58.77%).

Exportation Overview

Overview of the period 1 April 2018 to 30 September 2018 compared to 1 April 2019 to 30 September 2019:

- V 0.62% decrease in cigarette exports under the purpose code/customs procedure code ELG/H60 from 2.21 billion sticks to 2.20 billion sticks. It must be noted that the volumes of cigarettes exported above are from duty paid stock. Most of the exports relate to rebate item 470.03 (goods cleared in terms of a permit issued by the International Trade Administration Commission, for use in the manufacture, processing, finishing, equipping or packing of goods exclusively for export).
- 524.37% increase in cigarette exports under the purpose code/customs procedure code EX1/ H61 from 385 million sticks to 2.4 billion sticks. This is due to an increase of exported cigarettes to Namibia (747.93%) and to Botswana (493.38%).
- √ 46.21% increase in cigarette exports under the purpose code/customs procedure code ZE/H68 from 767 million sticks to 1.1 billion sticks. This is due to an increase of exported cigarettes to Zimbabwe (616.89%).

Customs Interventions and Successes

April 2019 to October 2019

No Cases of Seizures of Cigarettes: 306

Quantity of Cigarettes Seized: 44 904 420 sticks

Value of seized Cigarettes: R 40 Million

No. of Cases of Seizures of Tobacco: 23

Quantity of Tobacco Seized: 11 740kgs

Value of Seized Tobacco: R 77 000



Significant Cases

- Western Cape: Container of Cigarettes imported from Dubai was profiled and targeted for Customs intervention, the container was abandoned. The information on the shipping documents as it relates to the importer was found to be false, addresses did not exist. 1000 master cases of Royal cigarette
- Gauteng: 25 master cases of the brand Caspian was found being distributed without the SA diamond stamp and was seized as being non-compliant with the Excise requirements.
- ▼North West: 281 master cases of cigarettes found concealed in a false compartment of a 40 foot container



Significant Cases

- ▼ Gauteng: 165 tons of unprocessed tobacco has been detained at the Customs state warehouse pending finalization of the case for seizure.
- Several compliance verification activities have taken place on the confirmation of consignments of imported cigarettes, these were found to be correctly declared and compliant with the legislative requirements.









Current Operational Activities

- SARS is currently conducting periodic visits to tobacco and cigarette manufacturers and there is currently a static deployment of Customs inspectors to a number of cigarette manufacturing facilities.
- The officers role is to conduct periodic checks on the production, consolidation of tobacco used, the number of cigarettes produced and the quantities removed for distribution.
- Current monitoring and risk targeting methodologies are being employed within the Customs Risk and Case Selection processes to identify high risk consignments of both cigarettes and tobacco that is being either imported, exported of that which is transiting South Africa,



Current Matters in Progress

- Three criminal matters are currently in Court that relates to cigarette and tobacco smuggling.
- Civil matters currently in progress relates to over R 200 Million in losses to the fiscus.
- Current investigations around the movement of raw tobacco that was imported and suspected to be utilized in the illicit cigarette production process.



Current Legislation and Policy Processes

- The implementation of the cigarette manufacturing counters, second round of public comments have been received and will be evaluated prior to implementation.
- ▼ The implementation of tobacco manufacturers Leaf Threshers is under consideration, public comments have been received and is being evaluated.
- The implementation of forestalling regulations that govern the volumes of cigarettes that can be stored by the Manufacturer after being produced.
- The track and trace project is ongoing to address the fiscal marker.
