
Focus Area	Action Plan
Research	Research topics have been reprioritised to focus on research topics that will deal with the most challenging areas in the mining industry such as Falls and Ground, Seismicity, Women in Mining and Occupational Lung Diseases.
	Research topics have also been reprioritised to focus on topics that have high potential to generate revenue for the entity. For example, partnering with private entities for the development of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and other health and safety related equipment.
Human Capital	MHSC has commissioned an organizational efficiency study to allow the entity to be repositioned to be fit for purpose. The structure and roles will be reassessed for purposes of operating with the most efficient organizational design to meet the organization's objectives.
Good Corporate Governance	A social and ethics committee has been established to ensure that the organization's strategic objectives are achieved following good corporate governance and ethical practices.







Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for Women In Mining (WIM)

- Outputs from research conducted on PPE for women included the development of PPE for WIM handbook PPE for WIM guideline. These research outputs are continuously disseminated in Regional Tripartite Forums (RTFs)
- MHSC to consider potential of commercializing and partnering with private entities on the development of PPE and other safety equipment in line with revenue generation strategy









ROCK MASS ASSESSMENT TOOLS

- Falls of Ground (FOG) and Seismicity related incident remain a problem for the mining industry
- The MHSC is undertaking a study to identify & develop fit-for-purpose tools for efficient and accurate rockmass condition assessment
- A prototype camera has been developed and can be utilised to assess rock mass conditions
- MHSC in process of conducting an Intellectual Property (IP) and market assessment study for potential commercialization opportunities





FLAGSHIP MHSC RESEARCH PROJECTS TO RESOLVE MINING ISSUES AND POSSIBLY GENERATE REVENUE

THE MHSC IS ASSESSING THE FEASIBILITY OF DEVELOPING COLLISION MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS FOR SOUTH AFRICAN MINES

The project is undertaken to:

- · Evaluate different collision avoidance technologies,
- Analyse identified scenarios resulting in collisions
- Determine specifications for warning, retarding and stopping technologies based on a combination of simulation and testing and establish a test and simulation capability
- Develop standard verification methods to evaluate collision management systems.
- MHSC in process of conducting an Intellectual Property
 (IP) and market assessment study for potential commercialization opportunities in line with revenue strategy


