Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife

- Conservation Authority for KwaZulu-Natal
- 2. Established in terms of:
 - KwaZulu-Natal Nature Conservation Management Act 9 of 1997
- 3. Primary Responsibility for the implementation of:
 - National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act 57 of 2003
 - National Environmental Management: Biodiversity Act 10 of 2004

- Biodiversity considerations, remediation and legal action held in obeyance until emergency interventions have been completed
- 2. Continue to provide a supportive role thorough providing specialist legal and ecological advice with view to facilitate quick and informed decision-making
- Any decision by Ezemvelo be based on broader values of the system and the uMhlanga Nature Reserve - one of which is biodiversity

Key Considerations – Post Emergency Intervention


- Remedial actions post emergency to restore damaged biodiversity, uMhlanga Nature Reserve and other values
- 2. Restorative justice including compensation, offsetting, criminal liability, etc.
- Cost recovery

- Ezemvelo Rangers discovered the spill (blue water) and raised alarm
- 2. Massive fish die-off
- 3. Water body found to be highly toxic
- 4. Chemicals compounds toxic to both plant and animal life
- 5. Functioning of estuary and NR collapsed
- 6. Extent of contamination and impact still to be determined

Key Considerations – Post Emergency Intervention

- 1. Restore damaged biodiversity, recreational and other values
- Restorative justice including compensation, offsetting, criminal liability, etc.
- 3. Cost recovery
