- Basis of all state and government action is based on Section 26 of the Constitution.
- Our Constitution provides that:
- Everyone has the right to have access to adequate housing
- The state must take reasonable legislative measures and other realization of this right measures within its available resources, to achieve progressive
- No one maybe evicted from their home, or have their home demolished, without an order of court made after considering all evictions the relevant circumstances. No legislation may permit arbitrary



- Comprehensive legal development and interpretation of decisions as well as directives the Constitutional provisions, through a series of court
- In terms of the Constitution, human settlements and **Provincial Governments** housing is a concurrent responsibility of the National and





