REPORT ON THE WORK OF THE NATIONAL COUNCIL ON GENDER- BASED VIOLENCE

04 JUNE 2013

INTRODUCTION

Following the recommendations made by the CEDAW Committee in its 967th and 968th meetings regarding the implementation of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women, where the Committee considered the combined second, third and fourth periodic reports by South Africa, the DWCPD took a decision to establish the National Council on Gender-Based Violence and submitted a cabinet memo in this regard

Cabinet approved the recommendation on the 5th of December 2011 and the DWCPD began the processes towards the establishment of the National Council on Gender-Based Violence. The National Council was subsequently inaugurated on the 10th December 2012.

INTRODUCTION CONTINUE...

- On the 9th of December 2012, the Minister hosted a working dinner for all the members of the National Council prior to the launch on the 10th of December 2012. At the dinner the members were provided with the draft National Council Strategy, the Revised Concept Document and the Terms of Reference.
- The launch of the National Council took place on the 10th of December 2012 and coincided with the closing of the 16 Days of Activism of No Violence Against Women and Children Campaign.
- Subsequent to the launch three meetings of the National Council have taken place and an Executive Committee was nominated to provide strategic guidance to the work of the Secretariat and to also ensure that all outstanding documents of the Council are finalised for adoption by members.

- ✓ The Procedural Guidelines for the National Council
- ✓ Concept document for embarking on a robust campaign to popularise the work of the National Council and to engage on dialogues with communities
- ✓ Funding proposal for the work of the Executive Committee of the National Council
- ✓ Draft Strategic Programmes [pillars] have been identified for the National Council

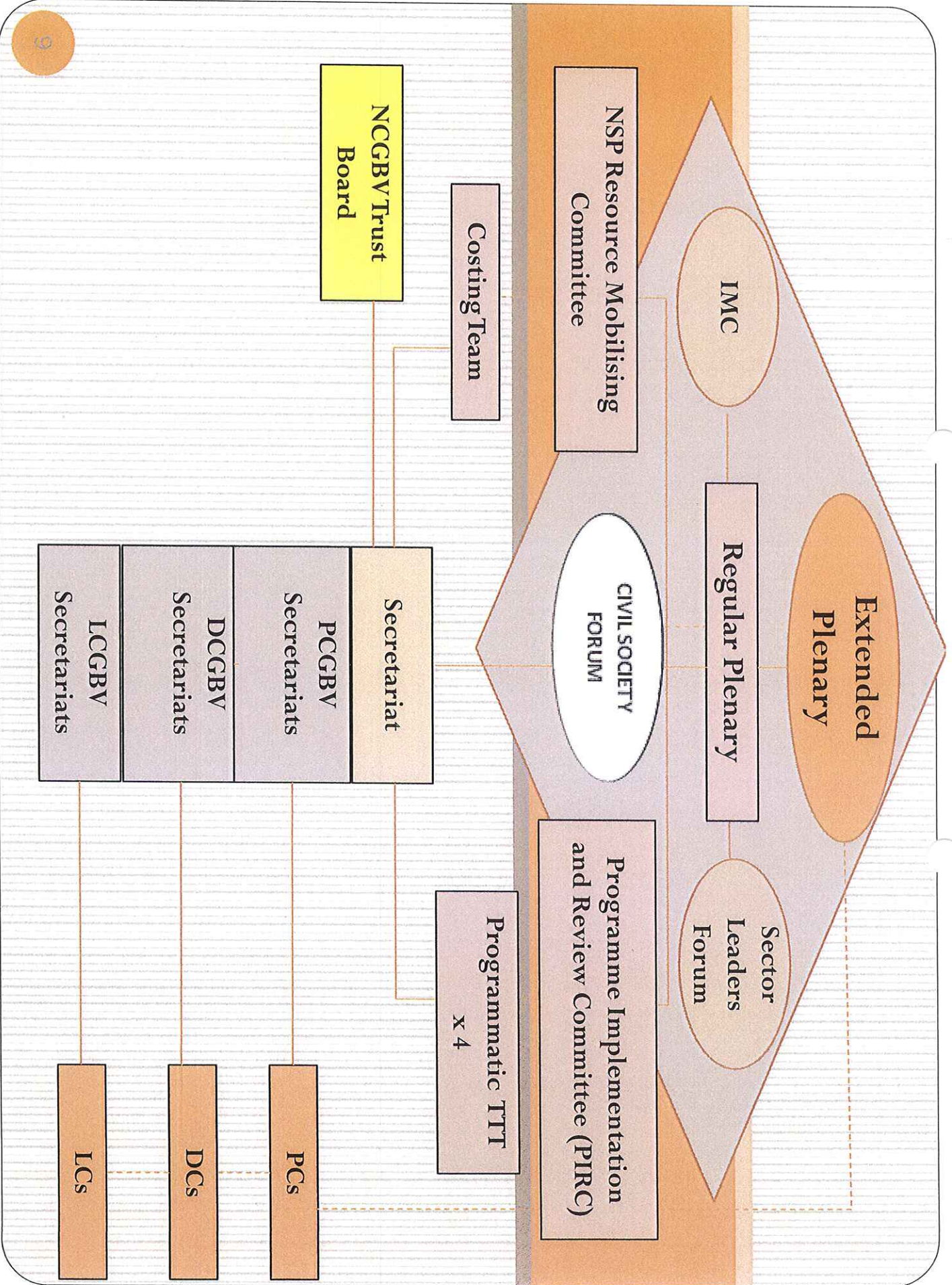
The mandate of the NCGBV

NCGBV EXTENDED PLENARY

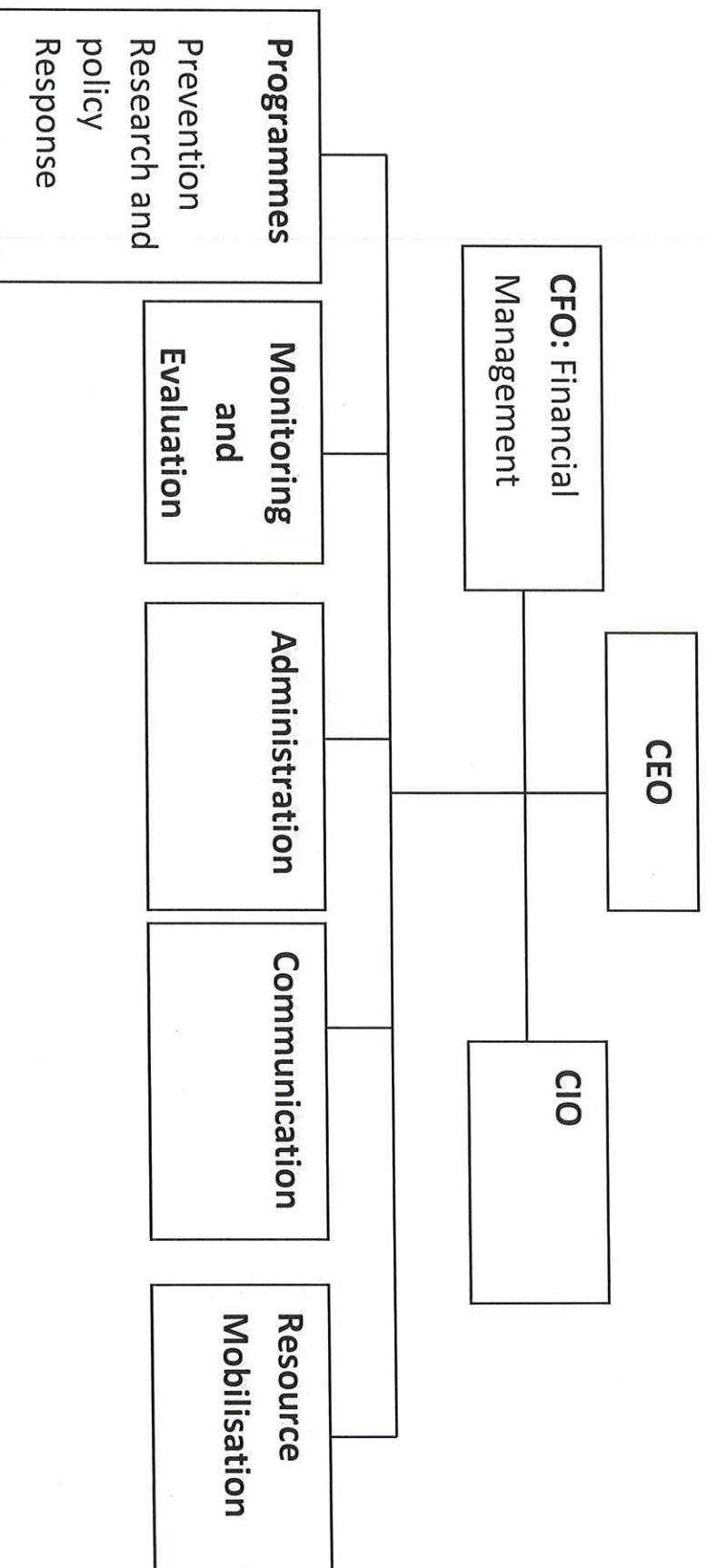
- The Chairperson of the Extended Plenary is the Deputy President
- Deputy Chairperson is from the civil society
- Ministers
- Premiers
- Leaders of Civil Society sectors
- The extended plenary will meet once a year

NCGBV REGULAR PLENARY

- The Chairperson of the Regular Plenary is a Minister elected by IMC
- The Deputy Chairperson is the Civil Society member
- This is the high level structure where the leadership of the various sectors is represented, these are key government ministries, provinces and civil society
- The purpose of this regular plenary is to provide leadership and strategic direction in the execution of the mandate of the Council
- Strategic decisions shall be taken by this structure
- The regular plenary will meet three/four times per year

NCGBV 2013-2014 Priorities

- Approve the proposed Structure of the the NCGBV (approval June)
- Facilitate the establishment of the Secretariat and the Board of Trustees (July-August)
- Develop the National Strategic Plan (NSP) : GBV 2013-2018 (to be launched by Dec 2013)
- Develop and implement the National Vikela Campaign (To be launched by August 2013)
- Develop a National Monitoring Tool
- Develop and complete the mapping exercise of hotspots across the country (linked to the root causes of GBV)
