INTRODUCTION

This report serves to inform members of the Select Committee on Finance on the progress achieved by the Anti-Corruption Task Team ("ACTT") in the Limpopo Intervention and the challenges relating to criminal investigations and disciplinary proceedings.

PRIORITY AREAS

The following provincial departments were identified by National Treasury as priority areas for the ACTT investigations in January 2012:

- Department of Education
- Department of Transport & Road Agency of Limpopo
- Department of Health & Health & Social Development
- Department of Public Works
- Provincial Treasury

During the execution of the investigation in the Limpopo Province, the ACTT also identified the Limpopo Department of Co-operative Governance, Human Settlements and Traditional Affairs ("COGHSTA") as another risk area in respect of developing low-cost housing for consideration.

PROGRESS REPORT

These are the achievements and challenges of the Anti-Corruption Task Team since the last presentation of 15 October 2013 to the Select Committee on Finance until 15 August 2014.

CRIMINAL CASES: CHALLENGES

- Challenges in accessing funding for the ACTT projects. National Treasury to be engaged for assistance to resolve the problem.
- Delays in the procurement processes for engagement of expert witnesses for criminal cases.
- Non- cooperation by certain witnesses
- Certain witnesses being suspects in other matters causes delay in finalization of other cases
- Non availability of prosecutors on certain cases (limited capacity at NPA)
- Non availability of original documents on certain cases
- The Polokwane court in the Limpopo Province was burnt down, which resulted in limited courts for cases to be heard.

LIMPOPO BAS IRREGULARITIES

National Treasury further established in the audit of Limpopo Provincial Treasury that, out of 10 Limpopo PMG accounts, 6 accounts were used to process both credit transfers and other electronic bank transfers (EBT) directly on FNB on-line system, without authorisation or disbursements on Basic Accounting System (BAS) the following were the affected departments:

- 1. Office of the Premier
- 2. Department of education
- Department of Public Works
- 4. Department of Roads and Transport
- 5. Department of Safety and Sports

- 6. Department of Agriculture
- The investigation found that the Departments processed journals to rectify the irregular on-line credit transfers and payments in the BAS to an amount of R23 million.
- However, the payments to the value of R43 million could not be traced to any
 journals processed, follow-up is still in progress to resolve the transactions.
- In the Department of Roads & Transport two duplicate payments were identified to the total value of R2,5 million. The follow-up on resolving the discrepancy is in progress.
- All the identified discrepancies will be reviewed for criminal investigation once the National Treasury report is finalized.
- National Treasury resolved that all electronic transfer payments in all the departments should be centralised within the provincial treasury.
- The National Treasury also issued an Instruction Note for prohibition of payments via internet effective from 1st July 2014 in all State Departments.

LIMPOPO SECTION 100: DISCIPLINARY CASES (AS AT14 AUGUST 2014)

- When the intervention started, 22 forensic investigation reports were issued for DPSA to facilitate disciplinary hearings thereof.
- It was reported that there were 47 cases of irregularities identified from the forensic reports issued by the National Treasury against state officials and 302 cases of conflict of interest established by the SIU.
- When the DPSA: office of Standards and Compliance commenced with management
 of disciplinary cases, only 99 cases were recorded for disciplinary processes from
 the departments of Education, Health, Public Works, Treasury and COGHSTA. Due
 to the fact other cases for conflict of interest were resolved and withdrawn.
- Later on, additional cases from Department of Roads and Transport (8), Roads Agency Limpopo(RAL) (1), Gateway Airports Authority Limited (GAAL)(10) and HOD of Public Works were added to the 99 cases and resulted to a total number of DC cases being 108 as analysed below:

CHALLENGES ON DISCIPLINARY CASES

The following key challenges contributed to the slow finalisation of cases:

- Continuous postponement of cases
- Failure of state witnesses to attend hearings
- Resignation of officials before conclusion of DC processes

STRATEGIES TO DEAL WITH CHALLENGES

The accounting officer in different departments were held responsible to take forward the

DC proceedings, as the custodians of discipline in the affected departments in terms of

section 7(b) of the Public Service Act, 1994 as amended.

Release of state employees who are Chairpersons and initiators of disciplinary cases by

their respective heads of departments in order to speed up the finalisation of cases.

Consideration was made to suspend senior officials and any other officials alleged to be

sabotaging the intervention in the departments.
