

REPORT ON THE EVICTION OF ILLEGAL OCCUPANTS OF THE REMAINDER OF THE FARM "BLUEGUMBOSCH 199"

1. Purpose

The following report serves to give progress on processes followed, plans made and execution of the eviction order on the illegal occupants of portion of Bluegumbosch 199.

2. Background

Maluti A Phofung Municipality together with The Minister of Rural Development and Land Reform had a case against Morena Tsholo Mopeli, Maboela Traditional Council, unlawful occupiers as well as potential unlawful occupiers of the remainder of the Farm "Bluegumbosch 199" in the Harrismith District. This was in order for Maluti A Phofung Municipality and Rural Development and Land Reform Department to evict the said parties from the remainder of the Farm Bluegumbosch 199 which they had occupied illegally.

On the following dates, in succession, the Free State High Court in Bloemfontein ruled in favour of Maluti A Phofung and the Department of Rural Development and Land Affairs by awarding an order that the defendants be evicted from the said land. 27th February 2012, 22nd March 2012, 26th April 2012, 22nd June 2012 and 12th July 2012. Every time a Court order was awarded Morena Tsholo Mopeli and others applied for appeal. They further applied for an appeal with the Supreme Court of Appeal which dismissed it again on 06th November 2013. They further applied for an appeal with the Constitutional Court wherein it was dismissed on 23rd May 2014.

Failure of Morena Tsholo Mopeli and others to successfully appeal the Court's decision meant that Maluti A Phofung Municipality had to carry on with the eviction from the land. The following meetings contains all arrangements made and parties involved in ultimately executing the eviction.

3. 28 May 2014

After receiving the order on the 27th May 2014, the matter was presented to the Executive Mayor with the following present: MN Mokoena, MS Nyembe, TP Mokomatsili, M Mphohlela, M Mopeli, W Matjele and the Executive Mayor.

3.1 Matters discussed

- The Executive Mayor was presented with the background to the Case as capture above.

3.2 Resolutions:

- That the Executive Mayor meets with the concerned illegal occupants and warns them to move out without necessarily disclosing the details of the planning. This was for him to engage with them as a final attempt to avoid forceful removal.
- That the Human Settlements, Spatial Development and Planning and Public Safety Departments must arrange a meeting with all other affected Municipal as well as Government Departments and ensure the execution of the court order. These included SAPS, MAP Lawyers and all others that were involved in the initial planning.

4. 29 May 2014

A follow up meeting was held in the office of the Director HSSDP with the following present: (HSSDP) MN Mokoena; TP Mekomatsili & MS Nyembe. MW Matjele Public Safety. Gawie from Balden Voggel & Venote and the Sherrif of the court.

4.1 Resolutions:

- Mr. Matjele to arrange a meeting with Brigadier Mahloko and her team on Tuesday 03 June 2014,
- Iceberg security to be invited and quotations to be asked,
- The Executive Mayor's meeting to be in any of the days before 03 June 2014,
- Mr. Matjele to provide Brigadier Mahloko with copies of all legal documents regarding the eviction prior the meeting of the 3rd June,
- MAP to organize storage for confiscated goods.

5. 03 June 2014

At follow up meeting held at Phuthaditjhaba Police Station, the under mentioned were present and resolved as below:

(HSSDP) MN Mokoena, MS Nyembe. (Public Safety) MW Matjele, SS Malimabe, KD Molo. Gawie Rossouw (Balden, Voggel). (SAPS)Brig. ME Mahloko, MJ Nkutha, SD Mofokeng, Capt. MP Malimabe, Col. TP Ntuli, BB Ndlovu & MP Mokoena - SAPS local legal services, DJ Thateng (Sheriff), Willem Konic, AS Naude (Iceberg Securities).

5.1 Deliberations:

- Iceburg Securities were ready with their execution plan and presented a quotation of R250 000.00 exclusive of vat.
 - A team to remove household contents,
 - A team to dismantle the shacks,

- A team to load goods on trucks,
 - A team to load these off at a set venue,
 - TLB's to bring permanent structures down,
- MAP arranged an unused factory for storage with FDC for R72 273.30 for two months,
 - Arrange storage of confiscated goods,
 - Traffic Department for the control of traffic,
 - Fire Department should at the scene should their services be needed.
 - SAPS would provide the following units to ensure safety:
 - Public Order Police Unit for crowd control,
 - Intelligence Unit for ensuring knowledge of what to expect,
 - Patrolling the area during and after the evacuation.

5.2 Resolutions:

- MAP to provide SAPS with all necessary Court documents,
- SAPS to communicate the plan with their Head Office,
- MAP to ensure that the Executive Mayor meets the community,
- Iceberg to use Phuthaditjhaba SAPS premises for storage of their vehicles on the eve of the operation,
- The evacuation was planned to be executed on Wednesday, 11th at 04h00.
- The meeting adjourned until 05 June 2014 to allow all concerned departments to be present.

6. 05 June 2014

The meeting was held at Phuthaditjhaba Police Station. The following were present:

- MAP – (HSSDP) MN Mokoena, MS Nyembe. (safety & security) KD Moloi, JJ Seleke. (Fire) Masenkane.
- Thabo Mofutsanyane – SS Mthombeni, TJ Motaung & SG Maya.
- A representative from Environmental Affairs.
- A representative from ambulance department.
- Iceberg Security – AS Naude & W Konic.
- SAPS – Brig. ME Mahloko, Col. TP Ntuli, Capt. Mokoena (intelligence), SD Mofokeng, IM Motaung (CIS), MP Malimabe (POP), ME Ralesalla, (PH ORS), BB Mndlovu, MP Mokoena (legal services), TS Ramosoeu K – 9 Unit, EM Viljoen (CP), ML Sibeko (POP) a Brigadier and Colonel from Bloemfontein SAPS head office, mounted horse unit, SAPS communications unit,

6.1 Execution plan for that day

- All assemble at Phuthaditjhaba Police Station on Wednesday 11 June at 04h00 for a briefing session,
- All units to take their assigned positions at the venue at 05h00,
- The Sherrif to read the order at 05h30,

- Iceberg to move in and demolish (remove property from shack and demolish shack). They will start with shacks and finish up with permanent structures.
- Evacuation entry point will be the Clarens route and the exit will be next to the university.
- The SAPS's different units to take their assigned positions for peace keeping, control and safety.
- MAP traffic to control traffic including on the road to the off load zone at Industrial Area 2.
- SAPS to patrol and ensure that no riots start from outside the evacuation area.
- MAP to organize overnight shelter for the destitute members. (the matter was left hanging pending the response of MAP authorities after consultation)
- TMD to organize soup kitchen for the destitute.
- In closing the next and final meeting was set for Tuesday 10th June 2014 at 14h00.

NB: Iceberg Security were paid R285 000.00 and FDC's order for R72 273.30 was issued.

7. 05 June 2014

A follow up emergency meeting was held and the following were present: MN Mokoena & MS Nyembe (MAP) and Brig. Mahloko, Col. Ntuli and the Commander of Intelligence Unit.

Resolutions:

- MAP to organize shelter for families that might be left stranded after consultation with MAP authorities,
- Should the above not be done, MAP to inform SAPS on time for them to plan accordingly on the safety of such families,
- That as per the order, the people to be evacuated be reminded that they should vacate the premises:
 - the Sheriff to read and serve the notice before the day of evacuation,
 - notice boards be erected,
 - each household be served with an eviction order.
 - SAPS would provide protection for the Sheriff when performing these duties.
- MAP to meet their lawyers and communicate these and further inform SAPS about the decision taken.

NB: Later in the day Gawie was met about the proposals. He supported the arrangements and even called the Sheriff about implementing these on the same day (Friday). Unfortunately the Sheriff couldn't (he had a family funeral to attend to) nor could the Deputy Sheriff. He could only serve the order on Sunday. After informing Brig. Mahloko we were advised against serving them on Sunday because the community of illegal occupant was to have a meeting on the same day and this would provoke them. The notice and the boards were thus to be served on Monday 08th and the eviction would continue on Wednesday 11th as planned.

On the other hand Mrs. Mzangwa, of Social Development was contacted about Makwane Youth Centre's use as shelter. She referred us further to her supervisor, Me. Morongoe Mohaleroe who requested that we provide her with a letter. The matter was further referred to the meeting with the Executive Mayor on Monday 09th June at 07h30 in his office.

8. 09 June 2014 - Monday

A meeting was held with the Municipal Manager to give report on the progress since the Executive Mayor was out on official commitments. The following was present:

MN Mokoena, MS Nyembe, TP Mekomatsili, MW Matjele and TC Taetsane.

The report as captured above was presented to the Municipal Manager who also phoned and updated the Executive Mayor about the developments.

8.1 Resolutions

- Meals must be organized for the stranded,
- Toilets to be availed,
- Allocation to sites to be done effectively,
- The Municipal Manager will notify the Province about the evacuation,

9. 10 June 2014 - Tuesday

A meeting with the Executive Mayor and the following people were present: MN Mokoena, TP Mekomatsili, G Rossouw (Balden & Voggel), V Tshabalala (EM), MS Nyembe, Thateng (Sheriff), TC Taetsane (MM), SS Malimabe, Mr. Vilakazi, KD Moloji, Mr. M Moloji, Mr. Mofokeng (CFO) and the deputy Sheriff.

9.1 Deliberations and resolutions

Again the plan and progress was presented to the meeting. G Rossouw outlined the legal processes followed to reach to the eviction and assured that the Municipality was safe in executing the order since all legal processes were followed. MN Mokoena presented the strategy that Iceberg security and the SAPS were going to follow in the execution of the eviction (see 6.1). He further outlined the Municipality's plan on taking care of the people after the eviction. The Executive Mayor contacted the MEC Social Development about permission to use Makwane youth centre as a temporary accommodation for the destitute. MAP was to make a follow up on the understanding that the Executive Mayor and the MEC Social Development had on the use of Makwane Youth Centre.

10. 10 June 2014

A final meeting prior the execution of the eviction was held at Phuthaditjhaba Police Station, at 14h00 where a checklist was made. All concerned parties were present.

11. 11 June 2014 - Wednesday

All assembled at Phuthaditjhaba Police Station at 04h00 for a briefing session. MAP Human Settlements, Spatial Development and Planning staff was collected at 04h00 and deployed at the warehouse.

11.1 Activities of the day

- The evacuation unfolded as planned with the team waiting for sunrise before they could start. It started at about 07h15.
- Loads of confiscated furniture and corrugated sheets were received at the warehouse, recorded and stored.
- Most of the people evacuated took their belongings to their own places of safety using their own transport.
- At around 16h00 an assessment of stranded families was made and a few appeared to be.
- An anticipated number was 100 and preparations were made for such.
- From 19h00 all stranded families and individuals were collected and served with a meal at the scene. The table below shows their numbers: NB: Annexure ... shows names.

11.2 Challenges

- An elderly woman was taken by ambulance to hospital.
- The venue for accommodating stranded people ended up being Phuthaditjhaba fire station after we were turned down at Makwane Youth Centre.
- Bonamelo was also tried but we did not get helped.
- About two families would not leave their luggage and go to a place of safety fearing theft. (one was brought in the following day and assisted, while the other could not be found)

11.3 Briefing stranded people

A briefing session was held with stranded people at the Fire Station where the following was mentioned: (Morena Tsholo Mopeli arrived but he was asked to leave the premises)

- They were made aware that their being there was temporary,
- They were informed about the importance of safety at the area – walking around the premises was prohibited, inviting friends and family would call for a lot of people that might be in the for emergency services e.t.c.
- They would be provided with heaters, mattresses and blankets though these might not be enough for all,
- They will be served breakfast, lunch and supper the following day.
- Only them, will be allocated sites the following day.
- Sites might not be enough for all and thus there might be two shacks in a site.
- The arrangement is temporary until the Municipality secured them more sites.
- The rest of the people that were not part of the meeting will know what will happen to the once the Municipality has given out a word.

12. 12 June 2014 - Thursday

12.1 Activities of the day

- More people and Morena Tsholo Mopeli started arriving at Fire Station and they had asked below mentioned question which officials did not respond to:
 - What was going to happen to them?
 - Would they also get sites like those under the care of the Municipality?
 - Were they going to be compensated for their damaged property?
 - What were they to do about their children who were supposed to attend school?
 - Would the Municipality ensure that all those appearing on the list by Morena Tsholo Mopeli also get sites?
- A meeting was held at Municipal Offices with the following present: The Executive Mayor, MN Mokoena, MS Nyembe, TP Mokomatseli.

12.2 Resolutions.

- A list of equipment needed for building shacks be drawn and submitted to the CFO.
- The CFO to ensure that those are bought from the suppliers immediately,

12.3 At the warehouse

- Official from Human Settlements (MAP) started constructing shacks at the identified site.
- Iceberg Securities was requested to provide two trucks and 30 people who would assist with relocating goods to identified sites and the construction of new shacks.
- The process started late due to unavailability of equipment at the supplier.
- By 23h00 only 8 shacks had been built and the rest were left for the following day.
- At Phuthaditjhaba Fire Station however, more people were flocking in need of assistance.

13. 13 June 2014 – Friday

13.1 Activities of the day

- Construction of shacks was continued with as from 07h00.
- EPWP members from Phuthaditjhaba and Bluegumbosch were called in to assist with construction.
- Enough material was delivered on site with the rest kept in the warehouse.
- 16 families, with their luggage were taken to the relocation site as their shacks were built.
- Only 13 families could have their shack finished by 23h00 again though all had been removed from the Fire Station. The rest of the families were asked to be taken in by their neighbours until the following day.
- At the Fire Station people were restless and threatened with violence. Municipal officials received threats as they left the place because they could not respond to their questions and demands.
- The number then had increased to over 75 people when they initially they far less than that.
- Two more families that were left guarding their luggage at the eviction site, surfaced but could not be assisted accordingly by being allocated sites because it would be more risky.

13.2 Fire station

- More people occupied the venue at the Fire Station and demanded sites.
- Cllrs. Lebesa and Malebesana attended to the people.
- The MEC Social Development offered Makwane Youth Centre for keeping the people as the place was not proper for keeping that number of people.
- At around 08h00 Cllr. Lebesa addressed them and agreed on the following:
 - That sleeping at that place was no guarantee that they would get sites.
 - Those sites will be awarded to people appearing on the list that is with Morena Tsholo Mopeli.
 - That people who had shelter should go to their places until the municipality gave a word.
 - That only stranded people should stay behind and will be relocated to Makwane Youth Centre.
 - That the MEC Social Development will visit them on 15 June 2014 to address their well being and not the sites issue.
 - That the issue of sites will be handled by the relevant department.
- Relocation of these people could not be done because keys to Makwane Youth Centre could not be traced and it was 22h00 already.

14. 14 June 2014

14.1 On site

Construction of shacks started at 06h00 on the site. HSSD & P together with Phuthaditjhaba and Bluegumbosch EPWP employees were building the shacks.

14.2 Fire Station

MEC Social Development, Me. Sisi Ntombela arrived at about 11h00 and addressed the people about being moved to Makwane Youth Centre. All people, about 75 were moved to the new place where the Municipal Manager ensured that water and electricity problems were solved. Social Development would provide for these people.

15. 15 June 2014

15.1 On site

The last 4 shack started to be built at 08h00. The process had to stop at 10h45 because a group of about 50 Bluegumbosch residents had the following demands and concerns:

- They were evicted in 2010 and promised sites that they were never given.
- They were renting houses and thus wanted their own.
- The process had to be stopped immediately or they would ensure that it did.

In our deliberations with them we requested that we be allowed to complete the last 4 shacks since their owners' luggage was in the open but they refused. They only allowed us to leave them with material and vacate the place with immediate effect. This we did and the following people were informed about the incident: The Director Public Safety, the Municipal Manager and the Executive Mayor.

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PHUTHADITJHABA CLUSTER EVICTION MEETING
2014-06-05 AT 10:00

Brig Mahloko thanked and welcomed everybody present.

Brig Mahloko told the house that she only received one apology for today's plenary meeting and she further read the previous meeting minutes to the house. The operational eviction for demolishing illegal occupants at Bluegumbosch 199 will start at 04:00 in the morning.

All role players will converge at Phuthaditjhaba Police Station to parade and 05:00 must be in their positions but starting time will be determined by light as they cannot operate while dark.

Last time there was only one solid structure and now we have notice four structures.

Col Ntuli said the plan is to start firstly with the shacks and solid structures will be destroyed lastly to save time and they will start from R712 side and round the place.

The trash will be dumped at the donga and Google maps will be available for house to check.

Suggestion was raised that how about the demolish take place but allow people to take their things and Brig Mahloko said that is not what was said during last meeting and it will affect the plan because everyone will demand the same.

Brig Mahloko said everything that will be taken from the place must be numbered before being stored so that nothing will be lost or misplaced. There must be people responsible for writing the inventory.

Provincial Commissioner Lt General Mpembe said they must keep records of to avoid allegations of lost properties and people will start claiming things they never had. He further said there must be video to have prove if they have to enforce law or take action against whatever that might counter.

Col Ntuli reminded house that the Court Order said demolish.

Brig Mahloko wanted to know how big the place where people will be taken to because the number of illegal occupants has increased to 400 according to her.

Major Mofokeng wanted to know the road that is going to be used to transport property?

Mr Moloï said three trucks will not be enough taking into consideration the issue of time.

Brig Mahloko the Cluster Commander of Phuthaditjhaba said the entrance and exit will be R712 and she further said each Department must check the place first so that during the next meeting they can discuss and agree on the safety of vehicles.

Those people should be taken to a place where by they will be able to rest if they do not have a place to sleep.

There are certain people who will benefit and those are people who bought the land before others were informed not to build houses there.

The place will be confirmed today where people will be placed for temporary as they were advised before not to build houses.

Brig Mahloko said Municipality should arrange place not SAPS.

Municipality agreed that it is their responsibility to ensure safety and






