


Total Spending at 31 December 2015




Arts and Culture grant - Dec 2015








Expanded Public Works Programme grants






Education Infrastructure grant








Health Facility Revitalisation grant

Infrastructure challenges

- Poor planning and budget management at the provincial level
- Low expenditure contributed by slow supply chain processes
- Appointment of contractors with the incorrect CIDB grading
- Inadequate capacity in both client departments and the implementing agent to provide oversight and due diligence on the work of professionals and contractors
- Poor site management on the side of the contractor (on some of the project sites), which in turn leads to a poor management of contractors for the provincial departments
- Inconsistent reporting on project phases incorrect information being fed into the system



Human resource capacitation

- The quarterly reports are submitted and analysed, although there are still challenges with the late submissions from some provinces.
- The quality and credibility of the information provided in the reports still remains a challenge.
- Progress has been made with regards to the Central Recruitment Process for the Physical Resources Management Unit for some of the struggling provinces (LP; MP and NW).
- An HR independent review is scheduled for Quarter 1 of 2016/17 to determine if the Provincial Departments of Health and Education have complied with the conditions stated in DoRA for their respective appointments.
- The provinces that complied with the basic competence requirements as per the HR DoRA Circular issued to provinces; will continue receiving the HR allocation. However, those that did not comply will have to find other means to fund their DoRA posts.
