CATALYTIC PROJECTS

Catalytic projects are spatially targeted interventions that aim to change the way we provide infrastructure by restructuring settlements patterns. These projects are mega in size. The benefits of catalytic projects are; economic opportunities Increased iobs when from created projects and the start post construction SMME job creation.

INFORMAL SETTLEMENTS UPGRADES

ISU programme is designed to provide technical and capacity support to provinces and municipalities for the implementation of informal settlement upgrading across the country through the use of the Upgrading of Informal Settlement Programme (UISP) together with other housing programmes.

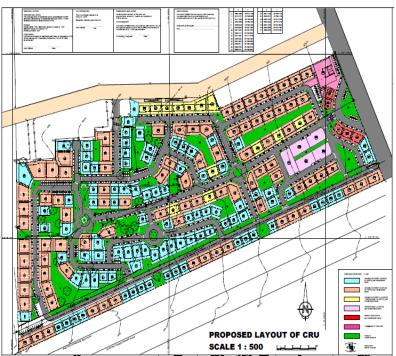


Figure 1-Site Development Plan and Proposed Layout Plan

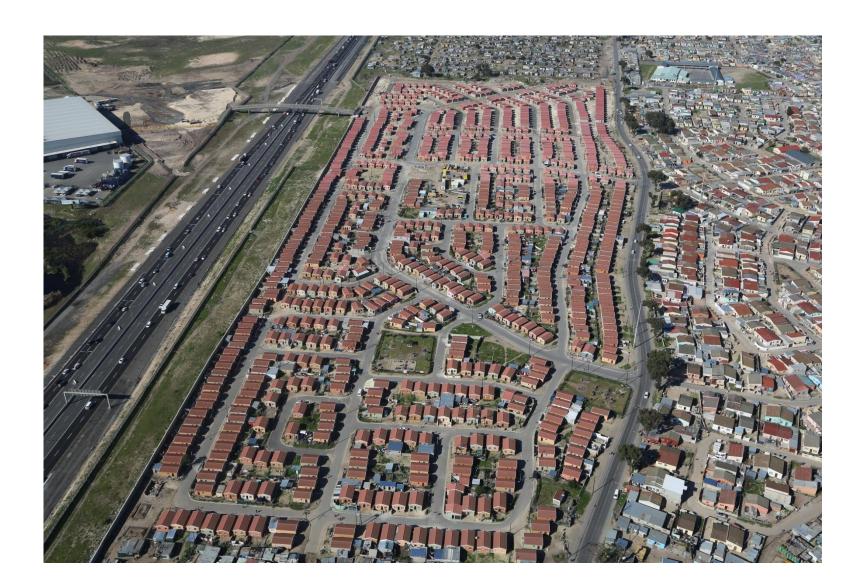

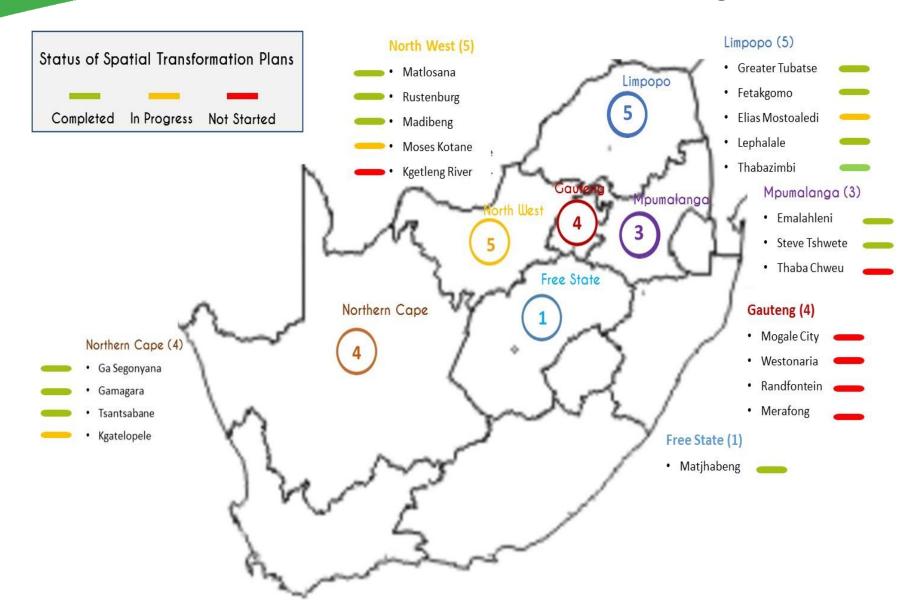


Catalytic Project: The N2 Gateway



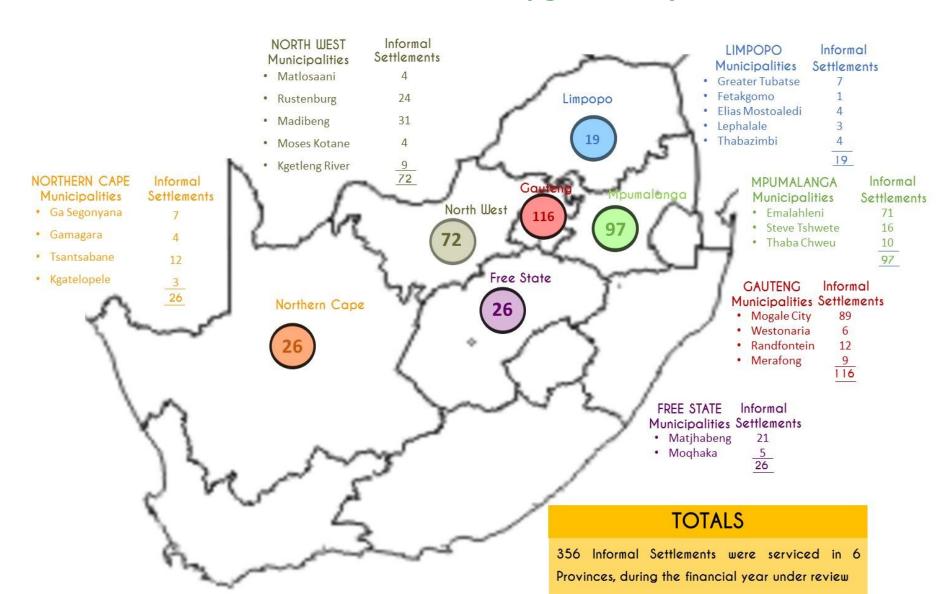


Provincial Distribution of the 22 Mining Towns
