#### **TOWERCO Initiative**

Empowering black owned SMME's to become long-term partners by mentoring and nurturing them into fully-fledged Tower Companies

- Replacing 3<sup>rd</sup> party infrastructure sites with SMME owned sites under a long-term leased-back arrangement
  - Terms increased from 5 years to 9 years, 11months



– SME fund contributor

- Vodacom Group agreed to contribute R40m (based on its % market cap to the total value of Top 50) to an SME Fund aimed at providing access to capital
- · The total value of the Fund is expected at R1.5bn
- Vodacom has to-date contributed R4m as part of the initial subscription process – balance of which will be subscribed for as and when the Fund issues a subscription offer
- The Fund is at a very advance stage of set up








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# Indicative components of OEM spend



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#### Relationship structure

- Vodacom is committed to ensuring the development of SMME's in the ICT Space
- Our commitment to this process as it relates to OEMs include
  - OEM to take on existing SMME's
    - OEM to conduct a performance evaluation within the first 3 months of contract
    - Identify any short comings
    - Engage with Vodacom on remedial action
  - OEM to implement early payment terms equal to or better than Vodacom's payment policy
  - Supplier Development programme established to provide support to SMME's where there is shortfalls reperformance
    - Monthly Vodacom/OEM performance meetings to ensure issues are addressed timely
  - Termination Process
    - OEM to provide Vodacom with proof that all remedial efforts failed
    - Impact on SLA to be determined to access other options



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
