
COMMENT

- 1. To date, training has been provided for ninety four (94) officials at a cost of R 2,975 million for capacity building in the Environmental Mineral Resources Inspectors (EMRI) aimed at proper implementation of NEMA.
- 2. The department currently manages to inspect an average of 813 mines against total of 1 211 mines representing 63.12% coverage (see slide 60 above for regional distribution).
- 3. To date, of the 813 mines inspected, a total of **229 or 28.17%** were found to be Non-Compliant. The department has instituted appropriate action against Section 93 defaulters.
