## NEGOTIATING MANDATE ON THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION AMENDMENT BILL [B21B – 2015]

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### 1. INTRODUCTION

The Acting Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs, Petitions & Public Participation, Hon AJ Beukes, tables the Committee's negotiating mandate on the *Public Service Commission Amendment Bill* [B21B – 2015] as adopted by the Portfolio Committee on 12 June 2018.

### 2. PROCESS FOLLOWED

2.1 The Speaker of the Northern Cape Provincial Legislature, on receipt, referred the *Public Service Commission Amendment Bill* [B21B – 2015] to the Standing Committee on Constitutional Affairs, Petitions & Public Participation on 9 February 2018.

2.2 On 29 May 2018, the Committee received a briefing on the Bill from the Northern Cape's Permanent Delegate to the NCOP, Hon Faber, the Department of Public Service and Administration (DPSA) and the office of the Provincial Public Service Commission.

2.3 The Committee resolved to hold public hearings on the referred Bill in all regions and called for written and oral submissions to solicit the views of communities and stakeholders with regard to the *Bill*.

Public Hearings were held on 31 May 2018, 1 June 2018 and 6 June 2018 respectively as per Committee resolution and both written and oral submissions were called for. The public engaged with the Members of the Provincial Legislature in respect of the Bill.

The Committee deliberated and considered the *Bill* on 12 June 2018.

### 3. COMMITTEE INPUT ON THE BILL

The committee after the briefing and relevant public participation held, view the Bill to be in order and also recognizes that there will be no financial implications in the event the Bill is promulgated.

### 4. STAKEHOLDERS'/PUBLIC INPUT ON THE BILL

No stakeholder or public input was received on the Bill.

### 5. WRITTEN SUBMISSIONS ON THE BILL

No written submissions were received on the Bill.

6. STAKEHOLDERS POSITION ON THE BILL

The majority of the stakeholders voted in favour of the Bill.

7. COMMITTEE'S POSITION ON THE NEGOTIATING MANDATE ON THE BILL

After due deliberation, the Committee supports the Bill.

8. COMMITTEE'S ADOPTION OF THE BILL

The Committee adopted this negotiating mandate, duly signed by the Chairperson of the Committee.

The Committee recommends to the House to mandate the Permanent Delegates to participate in deliberations at the negotiating stage and to support the Bill.
