made to the NCCOP plenary**

**21 August 2018**

## Undertakings made on 3 May 2016

- Strengthen support to provinces to ensure unblocking constraints to economic development and unlocking funding for economic development programmes
- Tracing progress on the Medium-Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) plans, assess their impact and assist provinces to unlock further opportunities
- Assess the impact of interventions on skills and youth employment accords using public report-backs on the progress made. We will work with the Mpumalanga TVet Council to explore a workable partnership that can give us examples of an ideal TVet.
- On the nine-point plan, we will work with the lead departments to accelerate the implementation of specific areas of the nine-point plans from which to draw lessons.
- In the Eastern Cape (and other coastal provinces) we will focus on the ocean economy; in Limpopo, agriparks; in Mpumalanga, on industrial parks around steel beneficiation; in Gauteng, on township economies, focusing on spaza shops and access to finance; in the North West, on small dorpies development; in the Free State, on the poultry and beef value chain; and in Kwazulu-Natal, on the aerropolis.
- Work with the leading national department to accelerate the implementation of the **Agri-park in Musina**.
- In Mpumalanga, we will focus our attention on the incubation programmes of **steel products in the Steve Tshwete Municipality**.
- Link these developments to streamlining to our **financial assistance** between the private sector and government, and between national government, provincial and local assistance.

## Alignment of Provincial APPs with MTSF

- All provinces have now concretised their plans and are now canvassing funding and investment for their strategic projects to realise their growth and employment objectives
- Supported by the Department of Trade and Industry and Department of Small Business Development, EDD convenes the Economic Development MinMec meetings which comprises all nine Provincial Departments of Economic Development.
- The meeting is attended by Minister, Deputy Ministers from the three National Departments and Provincial MECs supported by their Heads of Departments
- The SEZs and the Black Industrialist Programmes were identified as potential areas of collaborative work for the three spheres of government to catalyse the provincial economic development plan

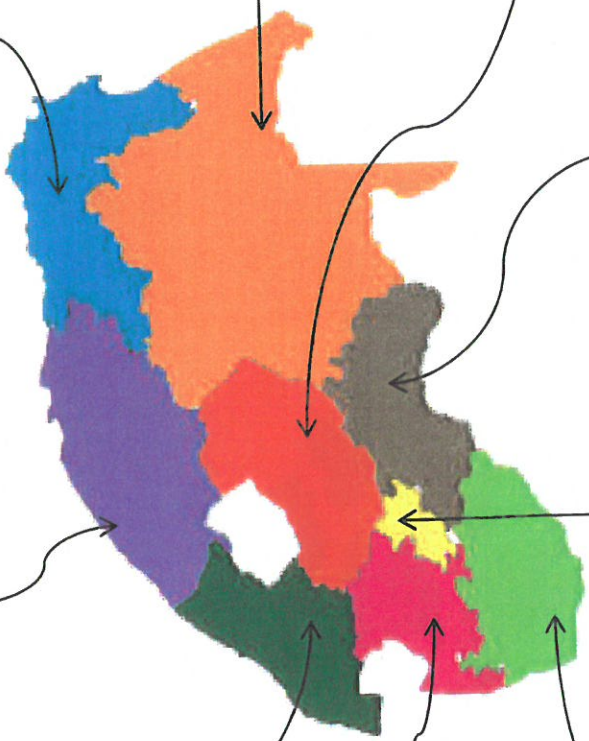

# Intervention to empower youth

## National Youth Conference: Increasing access to Youth Entrepreneurship

- IDC hosted the National Youth Conference themed “Driving SA’s Competitiveness through youth entrepreneurship” from 18<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> October 2016

### Key themes were:

- Developing an entrepreneurial mind-set
- Managing a successful enterprise and sharing experiences from successful entrepreneurs
- Applying for funding and managing business during difficult economic times
- Growing and supporting youth-owned businesses
- Developing closer relations between youth and state institutions tasked to spearhead youth job creation

Minister of EDD gave a speech and highlighted the following:

1. The economy benefits from the involvement of youth which:
  - generate new ideas
  - lead the most cutting edge sectors
  - are an under utilised resource - can grow the economy & re-shape tired old systems
2. Government actions since the YEA include – second chance matrix, training of artisans, exposure to work, & funding youth entrepreneurs
3. The Youth Parliament in June 2016 highlighted 3 gaps:
  - Information gap – knowledge of what government offers
  - Bureaucracy gap – concern about forms and long delays
  - Technical gap – turning great ideas into proposals and bankable projects

“We can’t give resources to every South African but if we can get a few energetic entrepreneurs and support them, back them, help them and they bring large numbers of other South Africans in, we lay the basis for an economy that’s inclusive”

# Intervention to empower youth (Cont.)

**Youth Development and Career Expo was led by the Deputy President and supported by departments**

- **EDD, led by the Deputy Minister** participated in the Limpopo Youth Career Development Expo in the Greater Tzaneen Local Municipality held on the 19<sup>th</sup> November 2016
- Deputy Minister engaged young people on opportunities available from government and encouraged them to proactively market themselves especially those starting small businesses
- EDD exhibited the social accords and the SMME Development toolkit
- Expo was attended by 6000 young people from neighbouring communities in Tzaneen Limpopo Province
- Event brought together government, institutions of higher learning, schools, DFIs and private sector in presenting to youth a broad range of education and training opportunities
- Expo was themed “Breaking the frontiers of Youth Marginalisation” was also a platform to encourage private sector companies to offer internships and experiential learning programmes to young people

# Intervention to empower youth (Cont.)

## Deputy Minister engagement on the YES initiative

- Deputy Minister has been involved in initiatives to promote youth empowerment: and as part of the government team in the YES initiative
- The initiative aims to provide 1 million unemployed youth from previously disadvantaged backgrounds the opportunity to experience the world of work through paid internships within 3 years
- Aligned to the **Youth Employment Accord** and a partnership between government and CEOs
- Funding from the private sector supported by package of government incentives
- YES employers will pay at least R20 per hour, **in line with the minimum wage** (R3 500 p/m)
- Inputs EDD has made on the *YES Initiative Concept Document: Empowering unemployed youth through quality work experience* include
  - A proposal that partnerships be formed between participating firms and local post-schooling institutions such as TVET and community colleges to assist sourcing candidates
  - Developing an exit strategy for youth so that the programme will have a long-lasting impact given that there is no guarantee of employment by the company offering the internship
  - Existing government structures should coordinate and align work with the private sector including youth forums - national technical youth coordinating committee (NTYCC) and provincial technical youth coordinating committee (PTYCC) for monitoring and evaluation

# Intervention to empower youth (Cont.)

## Deputy Minister engagement with youth in Free State

### Report on youth entrepreneurship

- EDD hosted a session with youth entrepreneurs in Mangaung on the 14<sup>th</sup> November 2017, led by the Deputy Minister
- The aims were to:
  - Let youth entrepreneurs raise their business needs and concerns and engage with the relevant departments and funding agencies
  - Disseminate information on support services available to youth entrepreneurs
  - Provide network opportunities for youth entrepreneurs
  - Provide youth businesses with a space to exhibit their business products and services

The Deputy Minister noted the importance of improving access to market for youth entrepreneurs, the need for sharing information, and the need for effective partnerships

Develop an electronic interface to serve as a youth databank where young people can easily access resources and information specific to a sector

# Adopt-a-TVET College Initiative

## EDD support for TVET Colleges

During The Deputy Minister has led a new initiative in Mpumalanga called Adopt – a-TVET given challenges in relating to skills development and shortages of skills.

He has worked with the TVET colleges, SETAs and captains of industry in the province to find common ground, develop linkages, and improve responsiveness and quality of training

As a result of the engagements the parties signed an MOU aiming to:

- Produce high quality skills needed by the industry
- Facilitate the absorption of TVET college graduates into industry through formalised apprenticeships and learner-ships
- Provide lecture exposure programmes aimed at lectures

To this end, partnerships are being developed with:

- RCL Foods – (Ehlanzeni College), MOU in Action: RCL – Mpumalanga: As a result of the negotiations & MOU, RCL Sugar & Milling has taken 65 students through work exposure programme. Students were trained in civil trades, electrical, agricultural production, automotive sector and office administration.
- Eskom – (Nkangala College); and
- Cooperation Agreement has been signed with Sasol and Gert Sibande College

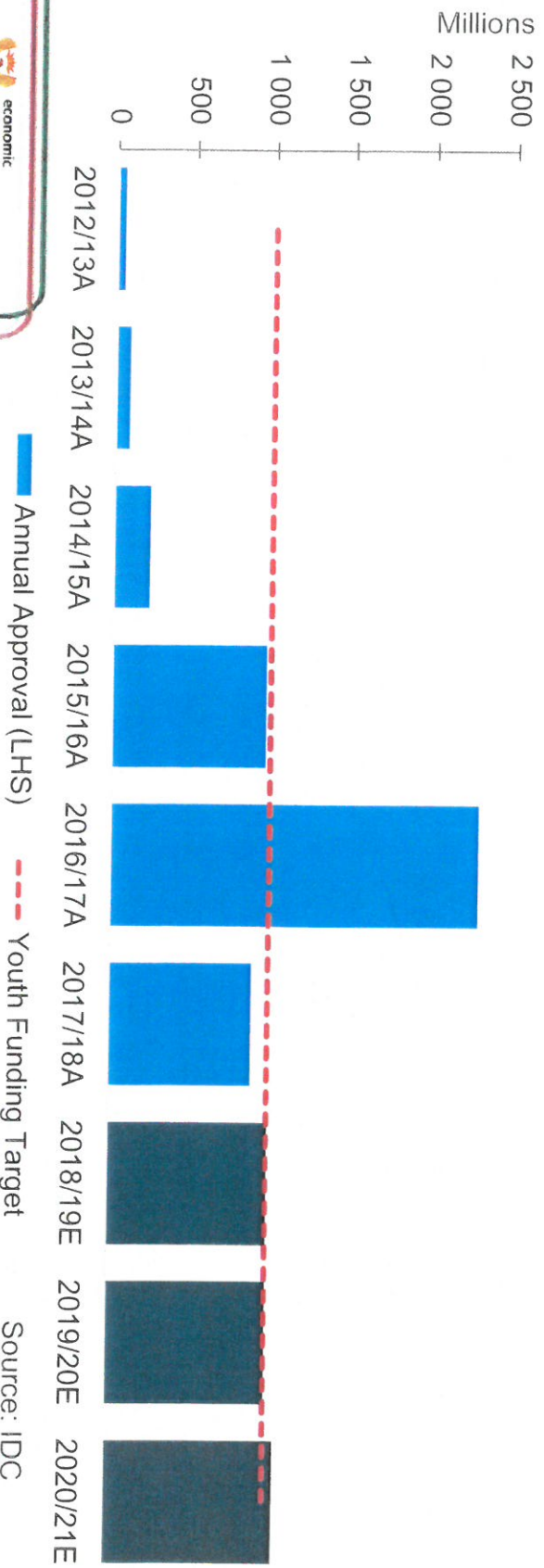

# Industrial Development Corporation Youth Funding

- In May 2015, Minister Patel set a five-year target for the IDC of **R5 billion in funding to youth-empowered businesses**
- In the first three years the IDC has approved R4,2 billion in funding to youth empowered businesses, and is on track to exceed target
  - Past 12 months, the IDC approved **R986 million** in funding to **43 youth empowered businesses**
- Past five years, funding to youth empowered businesses has created/saved **7 158 jobs**
- In the next three years the IDC is targeting a further **R3 billion** in funding to youth empowered businesses

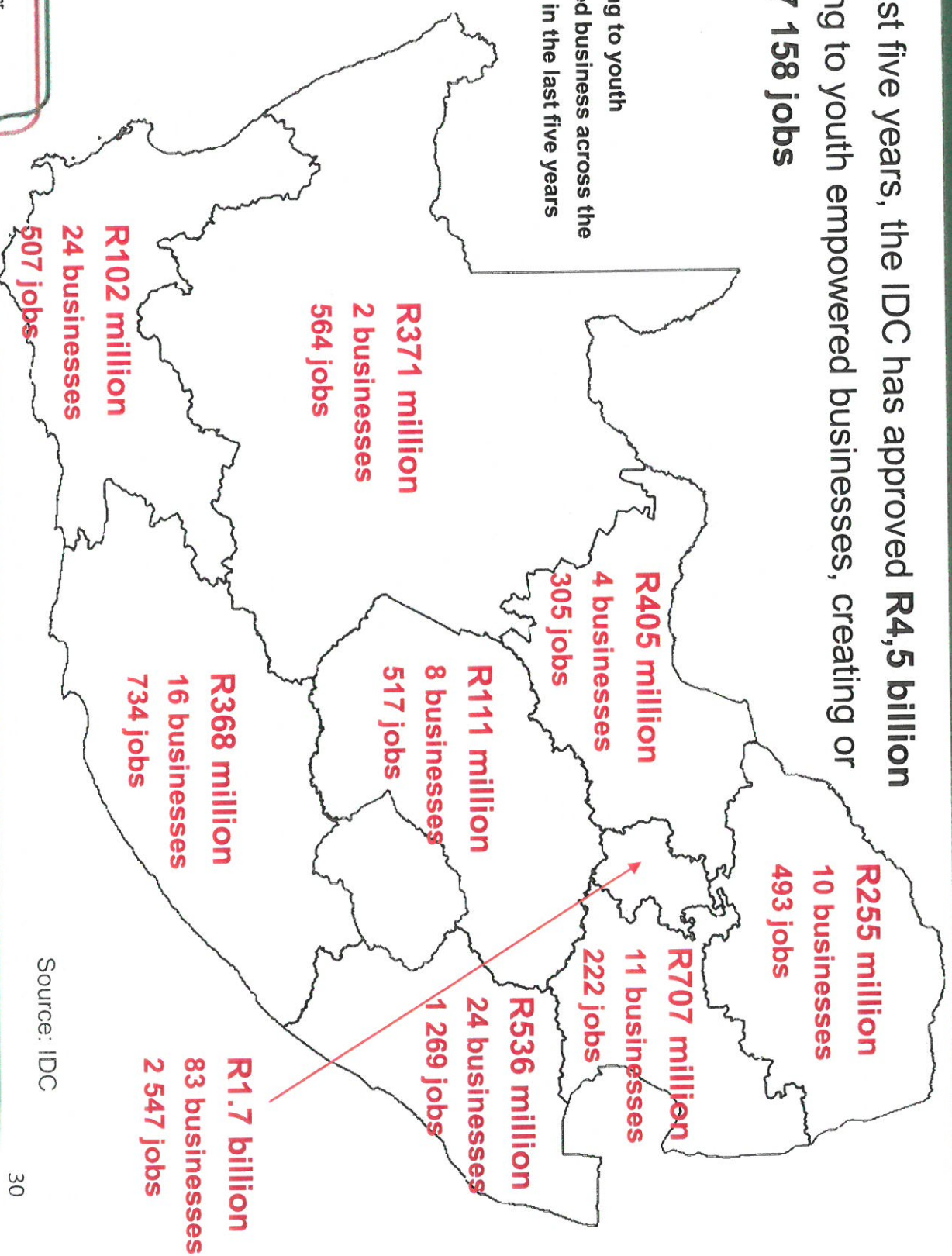

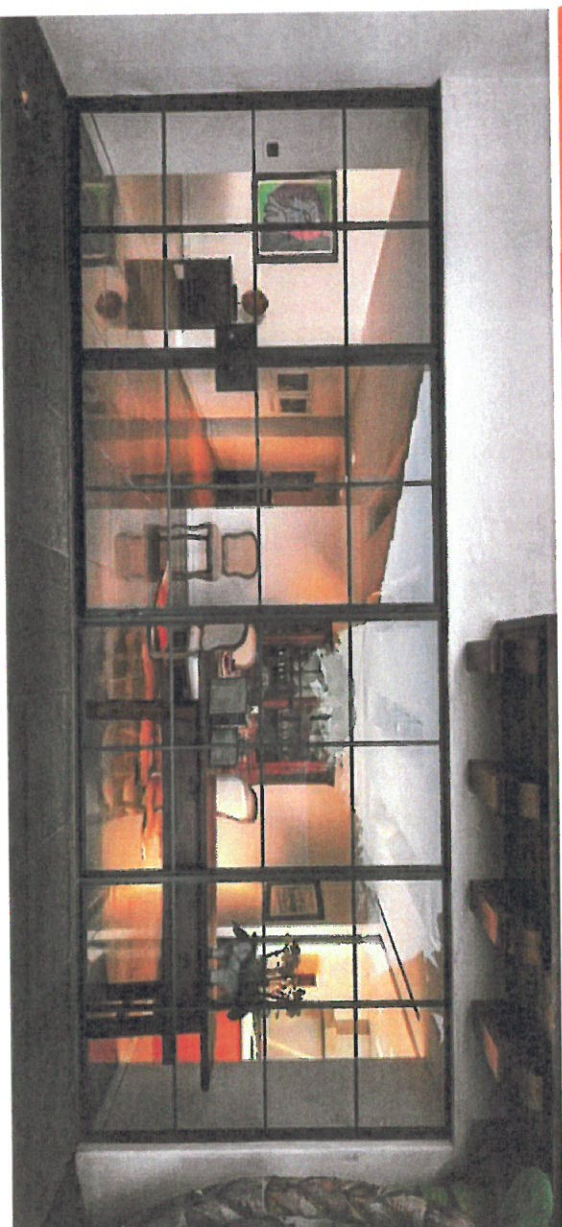

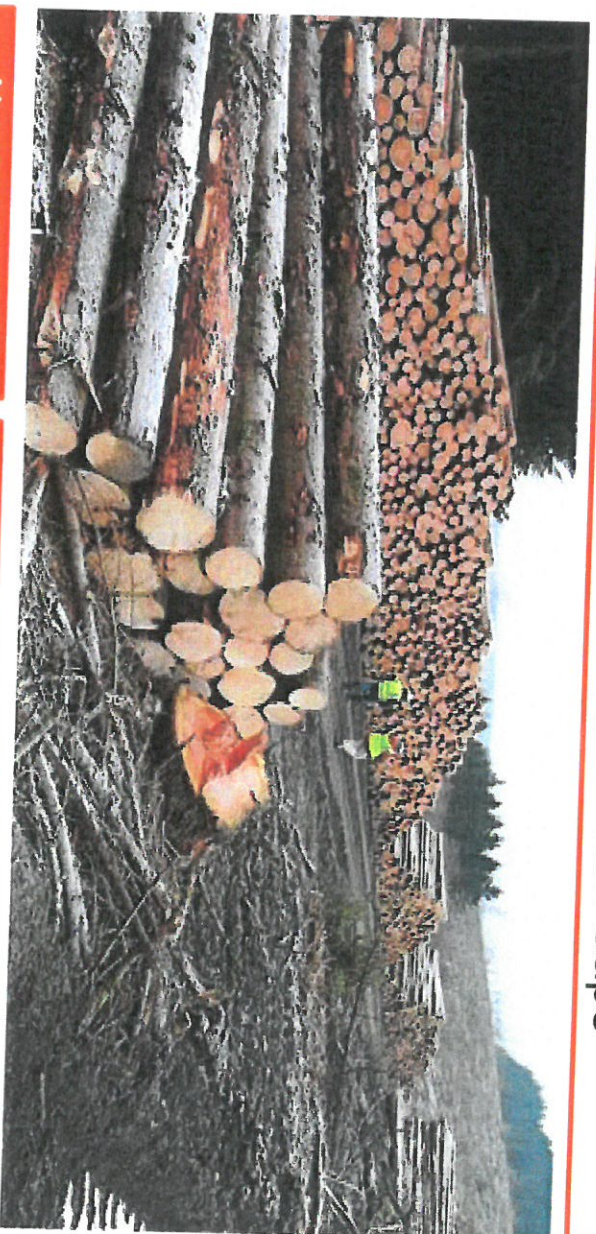

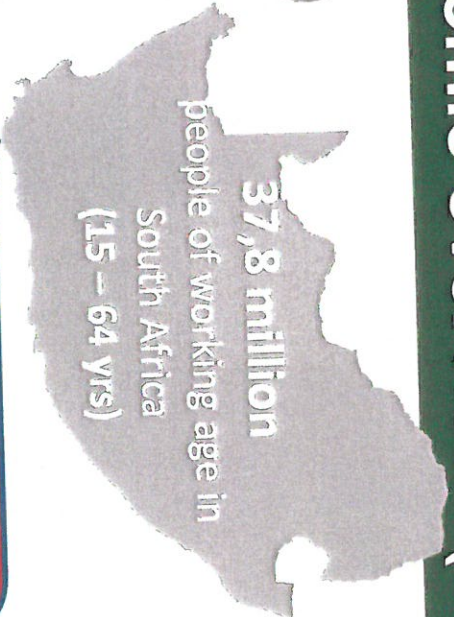

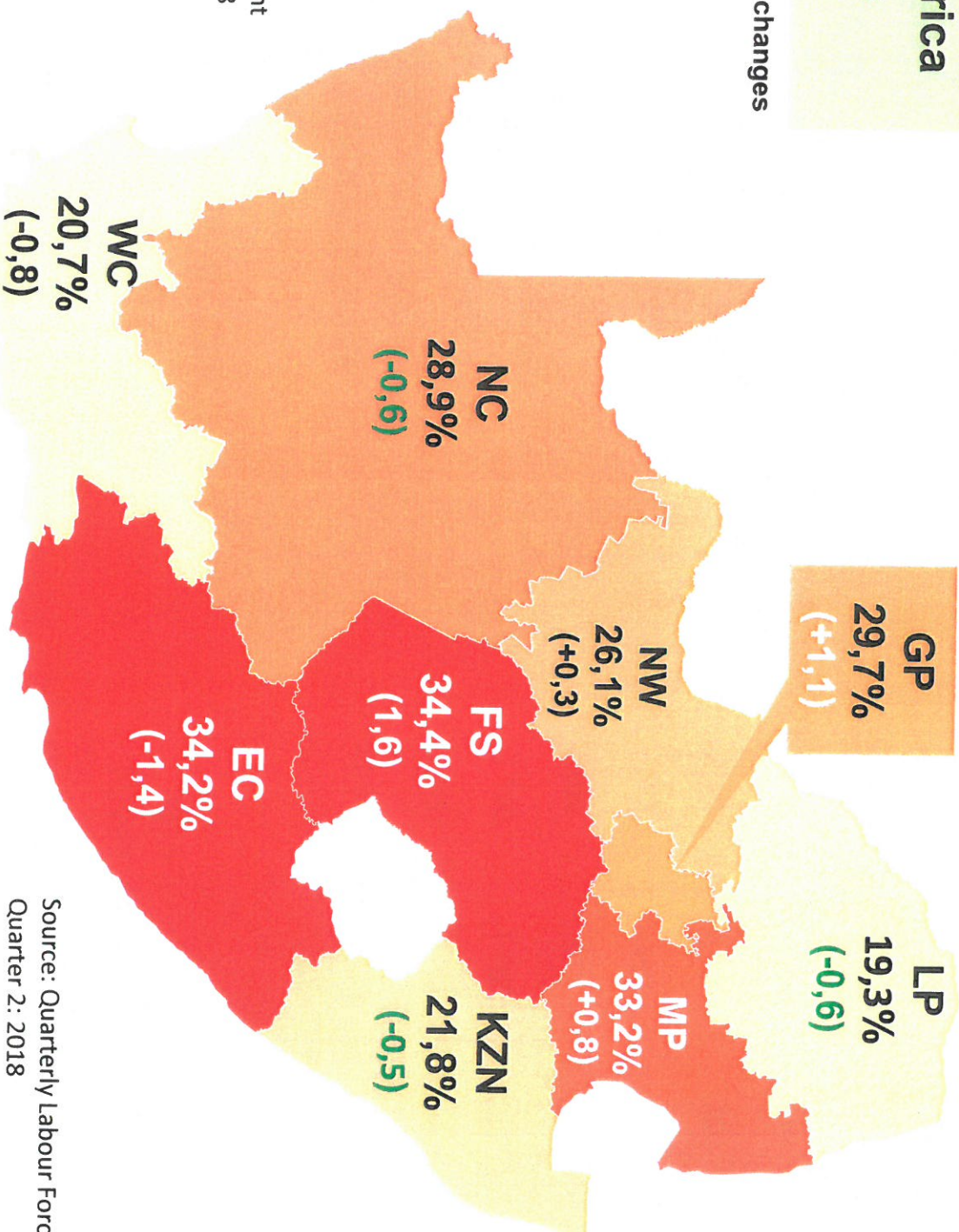

Gauteng had the largest increase in unemployment between Q1 and Q2 2018 while FS and EC have highest unemployment rates in the country

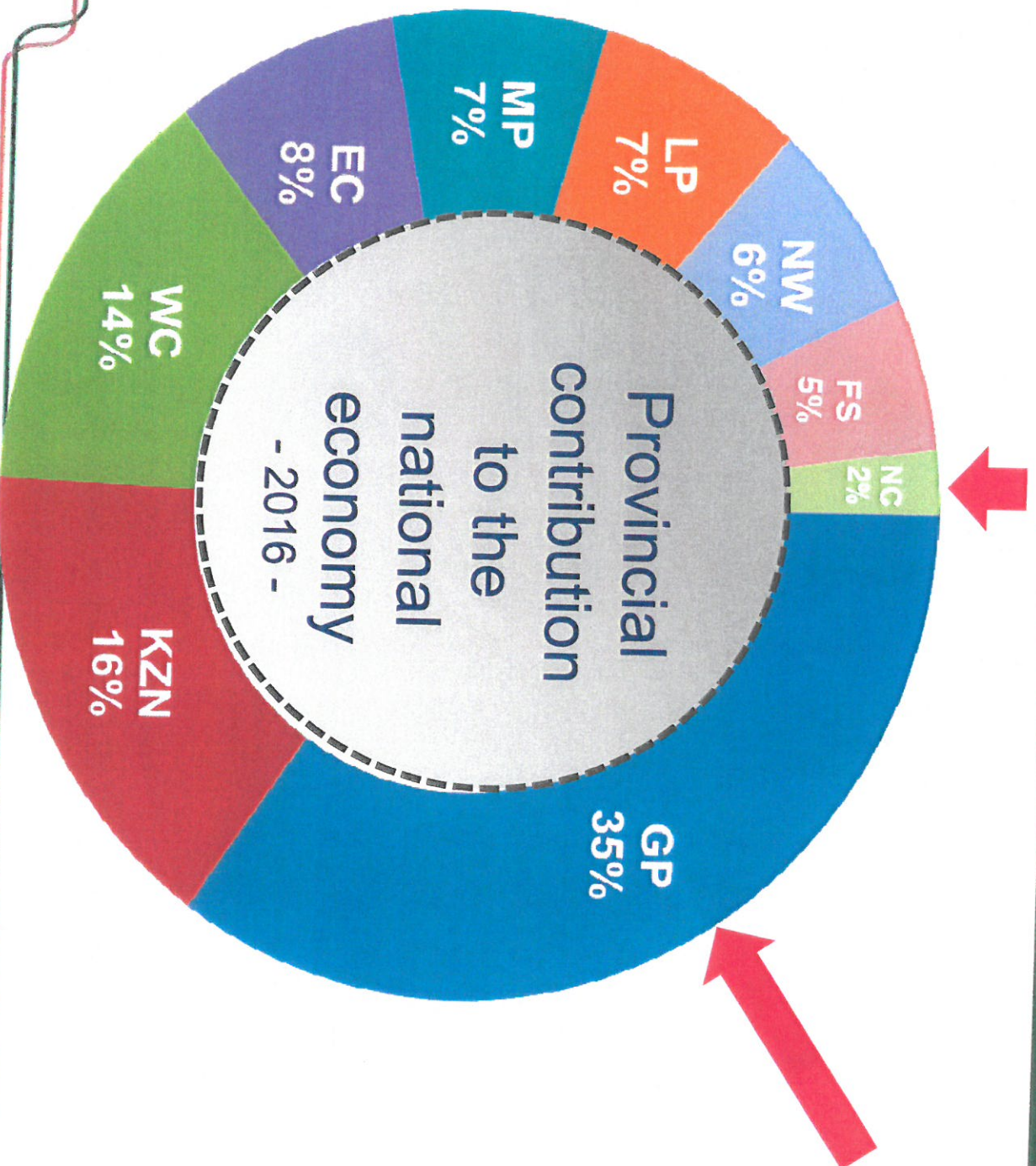

## Employment by province since the adoption of the NGP

- Nationally, employment has increased by 19.3% since the adoption of the NGP in the 3rd quarter of 2010.
- Limpopo, Mpumalanga, Western Cape, and North West had the largest gains in employment numbers over the NGP period.
- Free State and Northern Cape created the least number of jobs adding only 26 000 and 31 000 new jobs respectively since the adoption of the NGP

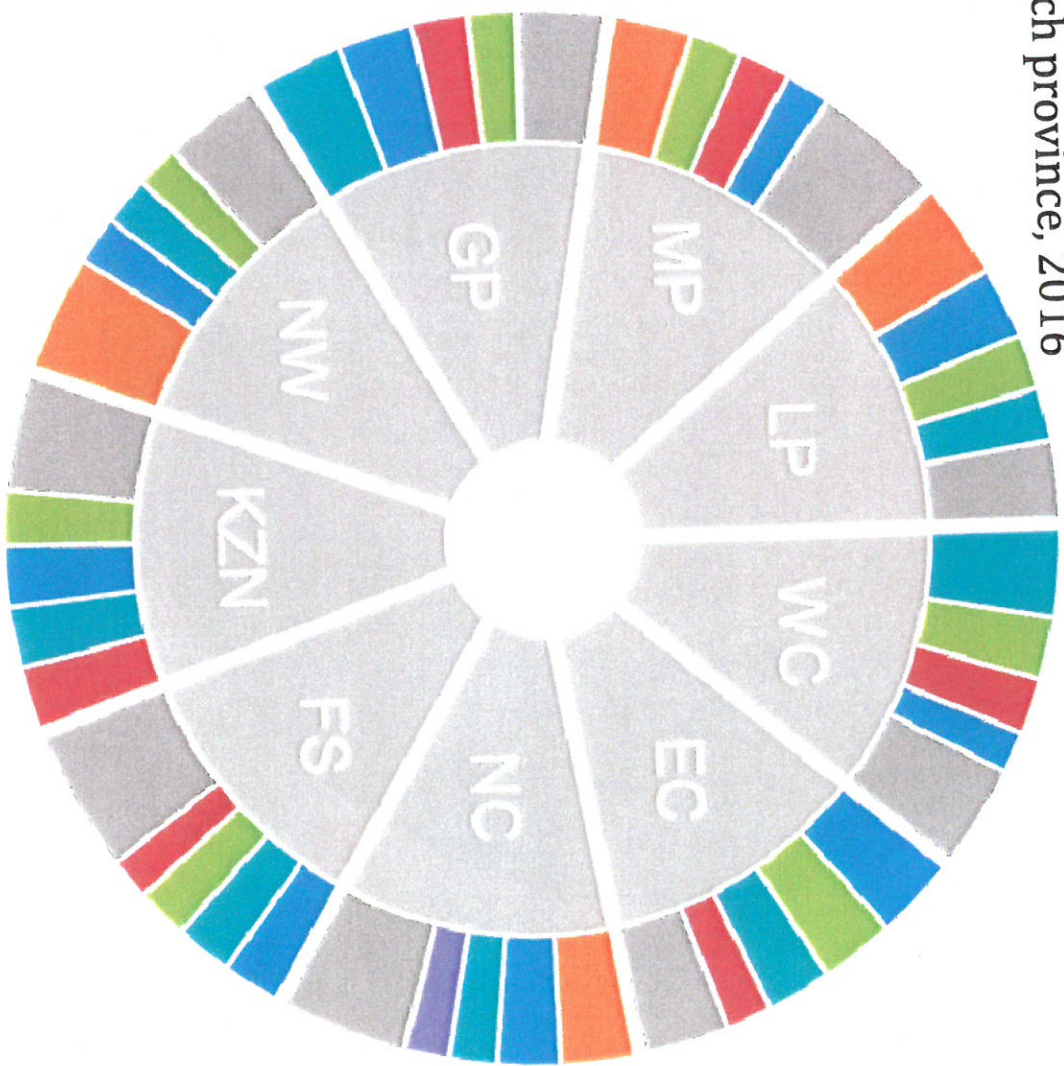
