Collection up to 31 March 2018 amounted to R38.9 million or 96.7% which was below the estimated revenue of R40.3 million by R1.2 million for the 2017/18 financial year. The variance relates to mainly relates to prospective fees collections and related interest income.

The budget for the department was R1.779 billion for the 2017/2018 financial year , of which R1.777 billion or 99.8% was spent:

- R588.4 million or 99.6% of the compensation of employees budget (R590.7 million) was spent
- R278.9 million or 99.9% of the allocated goods and services budget (R279.3 million) was spent
- R896.7 million or 100% of transfer to entities and other institutions was fully spent in line with its purpose.
- R12.7 million or 100% allocated towards capital assets was fully spent

The R2.3 million on Compensation of Employees is mainly due to delay on the filling of critical posts that were identified and advertising during the financial year, this is based only on the posts that could be funded during the period.

CONTINUE.....AUDIT OUTCOME 2017/2018

The financial statements were unqualified with material findings on irregular and fruitless wasteful expenditure on office accommodation leases.

- Internal audit received a tip off about certain expenditure incurred in 2014/2015 which were fraudulent, upon investigation they confirmed refurbishment costs paid for services not rendered and further investigation revealed lease agreement signed without authority.
- These relates to tenants installation in Mpumalanga and Western Cape. Disciplinary process relating to unauthorized lease agreements resulted in one dismissal and other investigations are on going.
- The matter is considered as fraudulent and for that reason a criminal case was opened against the alleged officials and service provider.























PROGRAMME 1.1: Corporate Services (CS)

The following were the branch highlights for the last half of the financial year:

- ☐ The Chief Directorate Special Projects accounts for a remarkable increase in the number of bursary recipients and resulting to a cumulative trajectory of 109 dating from 2014/15 to 2017/18 financial year, where a marked increase was experienced last year from a targeted number of 20 to an actual of 40,
- ☐ Although the department ended up with a vacancy rate of 10.29% at year end from 6.4 of the previous year, we started the process of filling critical posts in March 2018
- ☐ The signing of a pledge by SMS members to disclose financial interests on or before the deadline of 30 April culminated in the department achieving 100% disclosure of financial interests by departmental SMS members,
- ☐ The successful coordination of the extensive Mining Charter community consultations.























PROGRAMME 4: Mineral Policy and Promotion (MPP)

Highlights for the year

The following were the branch highlights for the last half of the financial year:

- Review of Mining Charter, 2017 began in March 2018 with a mining social partners' meeting held where 2 Task Teams
 - Growth and Competitiveness, and
 - ☐ Transformation Task Teams were formed the work is on-going
- ☐ A Mineral Investment Promotion Strategy has been developed.
- Progress on the shale gas research project
 - 5 monitoring boreholes drilled in Beaufort West;
 - ☐ The drilling uncovered fresh water resources which have been handed over to the Beaufort West Municipality;
 - An amount of 691 200 L of water has been made available to the municipality per day and an amount of 20 736 000 L per month from one borehole.;
 - Pump tests are being conducted on the other boreholes to check the viability of the water for community utilisation.



Shale GAS

- 5 observation holes 169 m. These were designed to intersect shallow aquifers and understand shallow groundwater dynamics
- These boreholes were sited through multi-disciplinary techniques (e.g. geological mapping, structural mapping, ground and airborne geophysics, hydrogeology, etc.)
- 2 monitoring holes 750 m Just concluded the drilling of these two
- Intercepted gas at 1402m


