
POLICY IMPERATIVES OF LANDCARE

- Foster community custodianship of natural agricultural resources through groups and individual own initiatives for sustainable agricultural practices i.e. Soil conservation / LandCare committees in appropriate level of governance for bottom up management of natural resources
- Paradigm shift from destructive conventional farming system to Conservation Agriculture through dedicated policy, support incentives in the provision of no till implements and fodder species for improved comprehensive agricultural commodity performance
- Farm planning system in regulatory framework and incentive for integrated farming community to guide all developmental programmes
- Land degradation neutrality targets aligned, budgeted and achieved for the country in 2030 in line with sustainable development goals and Conventions
- Skill development on schools level and out of schools youth for improved livelihoods and employment
- Integrated sustainable system in land use management permit to foster compliance and risk minimization and building resilience through revamping of legislations
- Improve government soil survey services and fertility system to improve broader agricultural sector



WHAT IS LANDCARE PROGRAMME?

- LandCare is a community based initiative underpinned by the goal of optimising productivity and sustainable use of natural resources.
- The purpose of the programme is to enhance a sustainable conservation of natural resources through community based participatory approach, to create job opportunities through expanded public works programme model (EPWP), to improve food security and well being of society as guided by six indivisible principles.









Six Indivisible LandCare Principles

- Integrated Sustainable Natural Resource Management embedded within a holistic policy and strategic framework where the primary causes of natural resource decline are recognized and addressed.
- Fostering group or community based and led natural resource management within a participatory framework that includes all land users, both rural and urban, so that they take ownership of the process and the outcomes.
- The development of <u>sustainable livelihoods</u> for individuals, groups and communities utilizing empowerment strategies.
- Government, community and individual <u>capacity building</u> through targeted training, education and support mechanisms.
- The development of active and true <u>partnerships</u> between governments, LandCare groups and communities, non-government organizations and industry.
- The blending together of appropriate upper level policy processes with <u>bottom</u> <u>up feedback mechanisms</u>.

≻JuniorCare

- (In and Out of school) funding school gardens that adopt sustainable natural resources management principles.
- Youth farming, EPWP jobs for youth and capacity building

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LANDCARE OBJECTIVES



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
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

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SUCCESS IN IMPLEMENTATION OF LANDCARE SIX PRINCIPLES

Intergraded Natural Resources Management

- The business plan processes within LandCare uses a bottom up approach where land users play a critical role in grafting the business plan. Communities will have needs and Government official then assist.
- Business plans will be presented in Provincial Assessment Panels and recommended to National Assessment Panel for approval and funding

Fostering Groups and Community led approach

During the 2018/2019 financial year, a total of 65 LandCare committees were established.

Sustainable Livelihoods

- During the MTSF (2014-2019), a total of 14063 work opportunities were created by the LandCare Programme.
- □ The Programme managed to implement 640 project which comprises of Conservation Agriculture, VeldCare, SoilCare, WaterCare and JuniorCare

5. Active and True partnership









