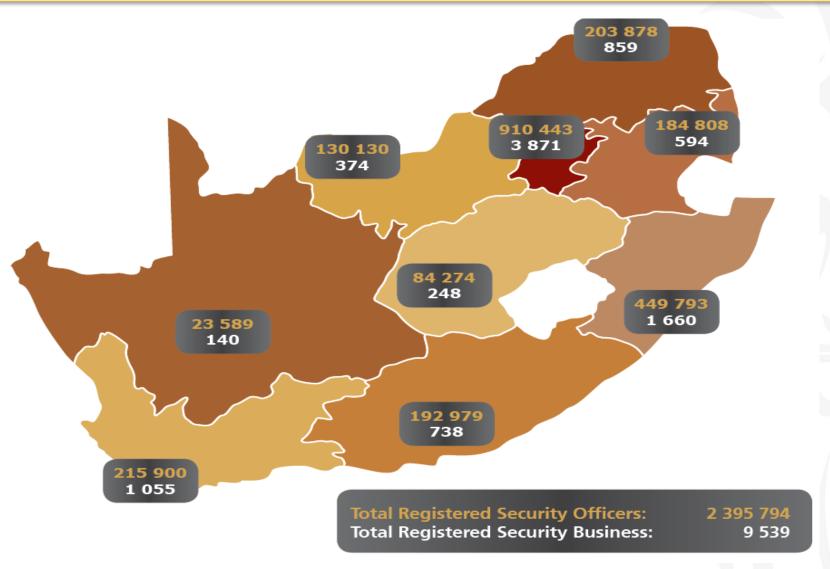

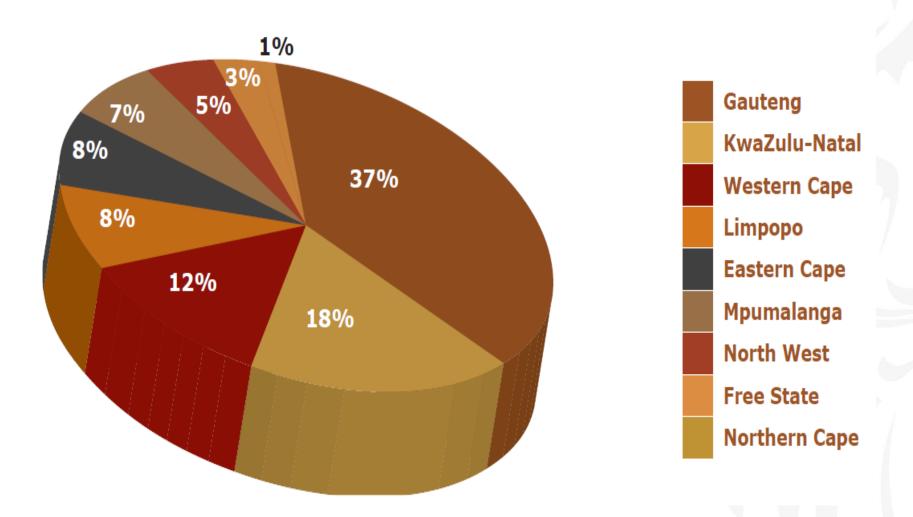

GEOGRAPHIC SPREAD



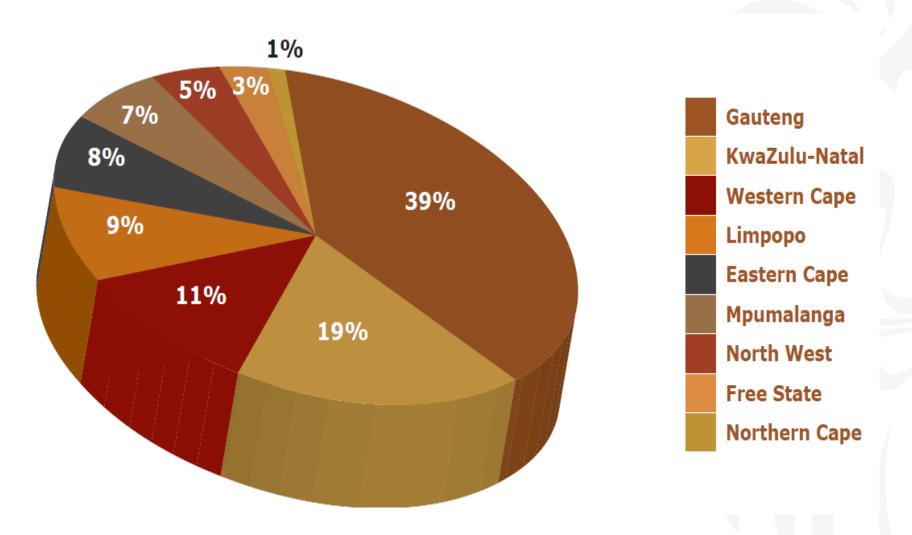

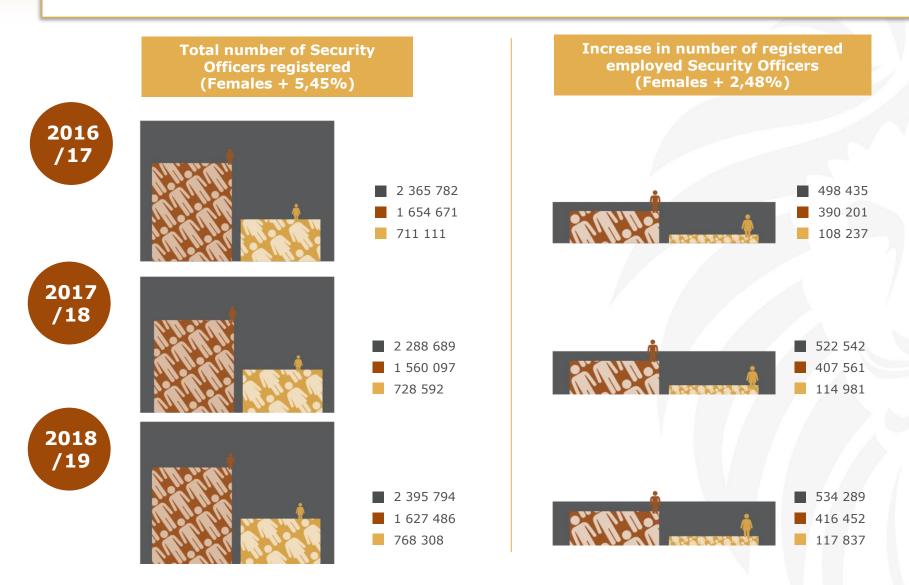

GOVERNANCE

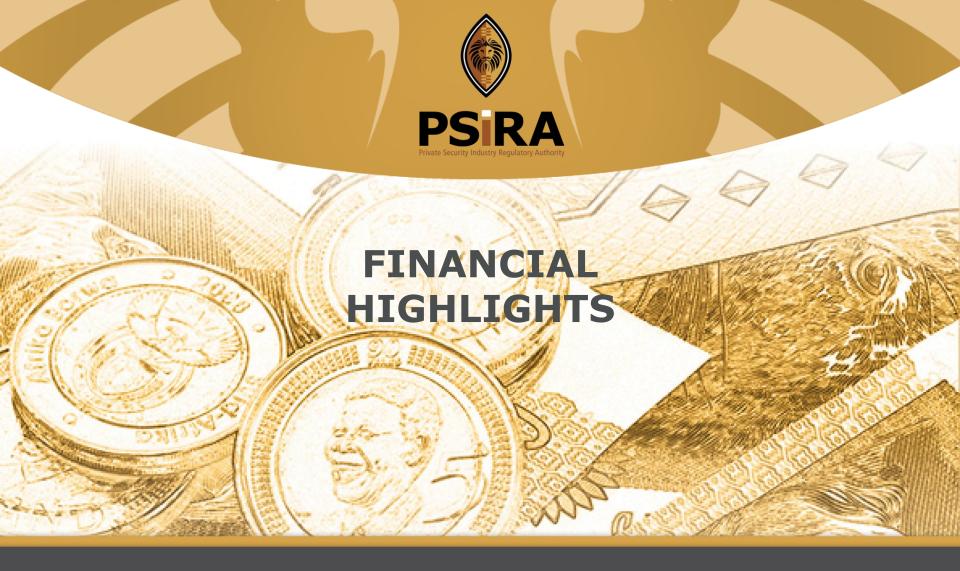
- Existence of Council and its Sub-Committees that provide guidance and support to assurance providers to assists in enhancing internal controls.

EMPHASIS OF MATTER

1. Material Impairments: Revenue Management

✓ Provision of impairments to the amount of R38 770 242 (2018: R55 768 534) was raised on trade debtors.

Action plan to address findings

- ✓ Review the funding Model by implementing the Levies Act
- ✓ Develop the Going Concern Turnaround Strategy to enable the Authority to build reserve.
- ✓ Utilise Debt Collectors to assist with collecting money due to the Authority.

2. Significant uncertainties

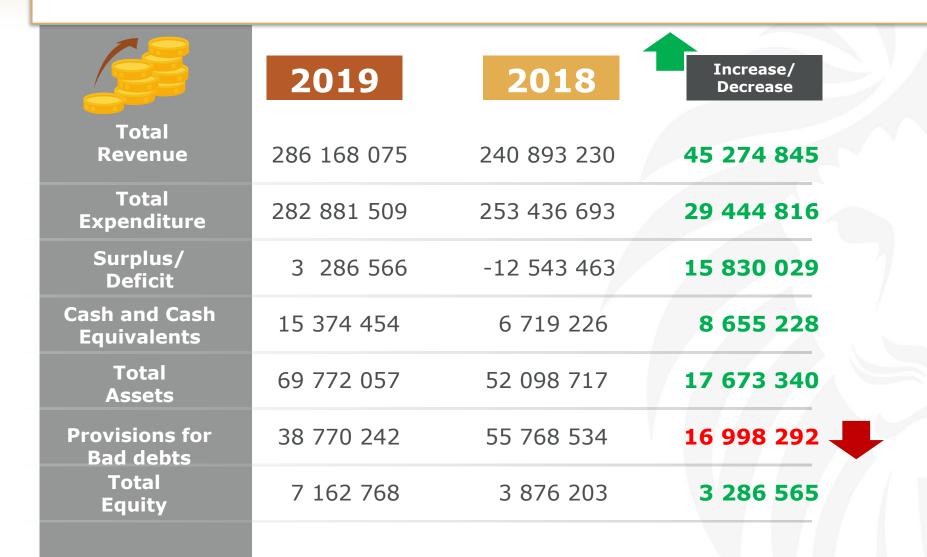
√The entity is the defendant in a number of legal actions. Some of these
