#### **DEPUTY PUBLIC PROTECTOR: CANDIDATE LIST**

#### INTRODUCTION

In response to a request emanating from the Portfolio Committee meeting on 23 October 2019 for a further breakdown of certain information in respect of the nominees/applicants for the position of Deputy Public Protector the following may be noted:

- . 29 Candidates submitted CV's or were nominated for the position.
- · 3 candidates withdrew. These were as follows:
  - Ms Ntombi Sibeko
  - o Mr. Daniel Aubrey Dibetso-Prince
  - o Mr Johannes Collen Weapond

Therefore, of the **26 candidates** which remain, the following may be noted:

- There are 19 candidates that meet the legislative requirements set out in section 2A(4) of the Public Protector Act 23 of 1994.
- 5 candidates (out of the 19 which meet the legislative requirements set out in the Act)
  have been 'flagged' by the Corruption Watch Submission in respect of a desktop
  vetting process. (This is brought to the attention of the Committee for information
  purposes it is not intended to influence the selection process in respect of these
  candidates'.)
- There are 5 candidates that do not appear to meet the legislative requirements.
- It appears that 2 candidates <u>MAY</u> not meet legislative requirements. (This is because
  it is quite challenging to determine from the CV's submitted whether the legislative
  prescripts are met or not.)

The Committee should note that the information provided is guided by the requirements of section 2A(4) of the Public Protector Act and focuses on the information contained in the candidates CV's. More detail is provided on the candidates in the tables that follow:

## (i) CANDIDATES THAT APPEAR TO MEET THE CRITERIA IN SECTION 2A(4) OF THE ACT

As the Committee is aware, section 2A(4) of the Public Protector Act provides that the Deputy Public Protector must be a South African citizen who is fit and proper to hold such office and who is:

A practicing advocate or attorney for at least 10 years (cumulative) OR



- Qualified to be admitted and has lectured in law at a university for at least 10 years OR
- Has specialised knowledge of or experience in the administration of justice, public administration or public finance for at least ten years (cumulative) OR
- · A MP for at least ten years (cumulative) OR
- Have any combination of experience mentioned above for at least 10 years (cumulative).

The following **14 candidates** appear to meet these requirements on the basis of information submitted to the Committee:

				prematurely completing cases at IPID to manipulate the statistics. He has countered these allegations stating that there is no evidence to substantiate them, and that during his tenure he took steps to counter the premature closing of cases.

## (iv) CANDIDATES WHO MAY NOT MEET LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- Ms Olwethu Majola- Kinyunyu (the candidate has ten years of postadmission legal practice, but it is not clear whether this has been as an attorney or as a consultant)
- Ms Nobukhosi Thuli Mbatha (though the candidate has little experience as a practising attorney, she may have sufficient experience in the administration of justice from her time working at the Road Accident Fund before her admission.)
