PURPOSE

To present to the Select Committee on Education and Technology, Sports, Arts and Culture the process of the Amended 2020 School Calendar.





BACKGROUND

- Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19) outbreak in the country impacted the basic education system in general and in particular the Approved school calendar for 2020 which was gazetted in 2018.
- The President of the Republic of South Africa, Mr C Ramaphosa, on the 23 March announced a national lockdown for 21 days from Thursday midnight, 26 March 2020 until Thursday 16 April 2020 and then to 30 April 2020.
- The President then announced **further easing of the national lockdown** from Level 4 to Level 3 from 1 June 2020.
- The gradual easing of the lockdown includes, among others, the phased reopening of schools.





- The amendment of the school calendar to its current state went through 2 phases because of the nature of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The 1st amended 2020 School Calendar had a total of 173 school days.
- The schools used the 1-5 June week to ensure compliance with the health, safety and social distancing requirements and classes commenced on the 8 June 2020.

- The President on Thursday, 23 July 2020, addressed the Nation on progress with the management of the COVID-19 Pandemic and made an announcement on the closure of schools and the planned reopening.
- The President announced that schools would be closed from 27 July and reopen on 24 August 2020.
- The President explained that Grade 12 learners and teachers would have a one week break, returning to school on 3 August 2020.
- The Grade 7 learners would take a two-week break, returning to school on 11 August 2020 and that specific arrangements would be made for different categories of special schools.





- The President further directed that the Minister of Basic Education, Mrs AM Motshekga, MP, to provide details on the management of the remainder of the school year.
- The **remainder of learners** in the following grades, years or schools will return to school on **24 August 2020**:
 - Grade R; Grade 1; Grade 2; Grade 3;
 - Grade 4; and Grade 6;
 - Grade 9; Grade 10; and Grade 11; and
 - Schools of Skill: Year 1; Year 2; and Year 3.



- Heads of Education Committee (HEDCOM) and Council of Education Ministers (CEM) provided guidance on the amendment to the school calendar and directed its Sub-committee on School Calendars to develop a amended school calendar.
- Through its consultative process, the Sub-committee made its submission and the CEM accepted the recommendations and the Minister published the 2nd Amended School Calendar for 2020.
- The approved 2nd amended 2020 school calendar, which was published on 11 August 2020.





- Publishing of the amended calendar was through the Government Notice 43609.
- The **amendment starts** with **the third term on 24 August** 2020 and **ends with the fourth term on 15 December 2020**.
- The third and fourth term are separated by one week holiday from 26 to 30 October 2020.
- The 2nd Amended School Calendar has 156 actual number of school days for learners and 163 for teachers.
- It is concluded by noting that the current academic year (third and fourth terms) have 76 days or 16 weeks remaining.

EXAMINATIONS AND ASSESSMENT - 2020

<u>Grade R – 11</u>

- a) Focus will be on **school-based assessment** as outlined in revised Annual Teaching Plans (ATPs).
- b) All assessments relating to these grades must be concluded by 15 December 2020.
- c) Learners must be issued with school reports on 15 December 2020, which confirms their progression/ promotion to the next grade or retention in the current grade.





EXAMINATIONS AND ASSESSMENT - 2020

Grade 12

a) To ensure that the 2020 NSC November examinations conclude on 15 December 2020, (rather than 18 December 2020) it is proposed that the **examinations commence on 5 November 2020**.

b) Subsequent key Dates:

EXAMINATIONS AND ASSESSMENT - 2020

Grade 12

- a) With the re-opening of schools for teachers scheduled for 18 January 2021, from the 18th Jan 22nd Jan 2021, teachers appointed as markers may still be at marking centres.
- b) Some of the smaller enrolment subjects may conclude marking prior to 22 January 2021.
- c) Having teachers withdrawn from school during the marking, has occurred in previous years, although not desirable.
- d) Alternatively, the **commencement** of the **new academic year** can be postponed by a week to **25 January 2021**.
