



- 99.2% of funds expended.
 - Criminal Justice System implementation spending was lower than planned as conditions imposed by National Treasury were only lifted halfway through the financial year (R479,7 million not spent)
 - Spending on building and capital environment were also lower than planned and could not be used to defray current expenditure (R274,3 million not spent)
- Virement for all programmes are well within the PFMA limitation of 8%.
- Compensation of Employees actual spending for the period comprises

100,% of allocated budget.

 Implementation of some HR priorities were prolonged in order to fund phase two delinking of housing allowance for spouses as signed in the Public Service Coordinating Bargaining Council. (For which no additional funding was allocated)

Overview of spending performance – Economic level (2)



- Spending on Goods and Services comprised 99,9% of allocated budget (Items > R5000 are classified as capital)
 - Criminal Justice System implementation was lower than planned as conditions imposed by National Treasury were only lifted halfway through the financial year
- **Transfers and subsidies** comprised 122,2% of allocated budget
 - Increased payments towards civil claim environment.
- Payments for Capital Assets comprised 72,5 % of allocated budget
 - Criminal Justice System implementation, Buildings and other capital projects were lower than expected
 - Capacity building items were however procured e.g. vehicles, etc.

Overview of spending performance – Programme level (1)

Programme 1: Administration

- Underspending of 1,43% realised as a result of decreased spending on compensation of employees in this Programme which required funding reprioritisation towards compensation in other programmes.
- Lower than planned spending on uniform due to unavailability of contracts to source the identified requirements as well as on hosting and network upgrades within the information technology environment.
- Capital Works building projects could not utilise available funding.
- National Treasury's approval was obtained to shift funding from perceived underperforming capital items to other goods and services environments, essentially focussing on COVID-19 critical procurement that had to be embarked upon in respect of which no allocation existed at the time.

Overview of spending performance – Programme level (2)

Programme 2: Visible Policing

- Underspending was marginal i.e 0,24%. Net underspending of R118,8 million realised on the largest programme that had been allocated more than 51% or R49,9 billion of the total budget.
- Relative small reduced spending levels on different categories such as machinery, households, contractors and lower levels of spending on invoices received in the facilities environment for reimbursements to Public Works. (Devolved functions)
- Travel and subsistence realised increased expenditure mainly as a result of insufficient funding allocated for the 2019 General Election and for crime stabilisation interventions that resulted in additional operational deployment costs.

Programme 3: Detective Services

- A marginal net overspending of 0,61% realised on the Programme, i.e R116,9 million
- Overspending was mainly as a result of increased spending levels on fleet services and contractors within goods and services.

Programme 4: Crime Intelligence

- Net overspending of R63,1 million realised on the Programme, i.e 1,54%.
- Overspending essentially realised as a result of increased spending on compensation of employees. Budget reductions on compensation of employees introduced in a previous MTEF and housing rental allowance de-linked and extended to spouses in terms of a PSCBC agreement, contributed towards the compensation pressures in this Programme.
- Compensation of employees contributes to a weight of more than 91% of this Programme.

Programme 5: Protection and Security Services

- Net overspending of 7,31% realised on total programme spending mainly as a result of increased spending on compensation of employees.
- Compensation of employees contributes to a weight of more than 89% of this Programme.
- Budget reductions on compensation of employees introduced in a previous MTEF, overtime payable, re-grading of protectors and housing rental allowance de-linked and extended to spouses in terms of a PSCBC agreement, contributed towards the compensation pressures.



- Revenue collected for the National Revenue Fund during the year was R601,703 million (Note 2):
 - Sale of goods and services produced by the Department (mainly firearm licenses, accident reports, rent for official accommodation, commission on insurance fees collected, etc.) was R325,990 million.
 - Sale of scrap and other used goods was R5,218 million.
 - Fines, penalties and forfeits were R43,394 million.
 - Interest received via corporate banks was R1,755 million.
 - Sale of capital assets was R85,536 million.
 - Transactions in assets and liabilities were R139,810 million (mainly recovery of debt).








Breakdown Per Financial Programme
