UNAVAILABILITY OF ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOLS IN SPRINGBOK, NORTHERN CAPE PROVINCE

Your e-mails to Mr Brown refer.

As your e-mails dealt with matters that fall within the competence of provincial authorities, the Department had to consult with the Northern Cape Education Department (NCDoE) regarding your concerns.

The NCDoE acknowledged that a survey regarding possible introduction of English medium classes in identified schools in Namaqua District was conducted last year. The report shows that it was not feasible for the NCDoE to introduce these classes instantly because of the limited number of learners notwithstanding that the classrooms to accommodate qualifying learners were available.

The NCDoE indicated that the introduction of English medium classes will be considered in qualifying schools as soon as the required number of learners permits.

The NCDoE also acknowledged that they were aware of your request for English version textbooks. They advised that the procurement process of the requested textbooks was in progress and that you will be contacted as soon as the textbooks are available.
