The following documents are attached:

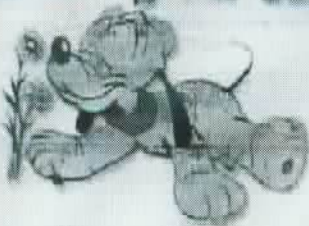

REQUEST FOR PUBLIC ENGLISH MEDIUM SCHOOLS IN SPRINGBOK AREA

I am Brenda Nobathemba Matebe with Id number 790929 0444 087 residing at the above mentioned address. I am a single working parent of 2 children aged 7 and 10 years; I relocated to Springbok in March 2016 with my 2 children. My children attended Springbok Christian Academy because there are no English public schools in Springbok.

I did not have money for registration and school fees for my children in April 2016; I obtained a loan for the registration and for the school fees for the entire year. The only way I could keep my children at school was through loans. I paid for one child per year almost R30 000 annually whereas I paid R6000 per year in Port Elizabeth for my daughter at a public school. I could not keep up with getting loans since I was still paying for the other loans I took the previous 2 years. In February 2018 I could not even afford to buy a loaf of bread, my fear was that my children would die of hunger and they would not belong to any school in the process. As a primary care giver to my children I would be infringing my children's right to be protected and cared for, according to the Children's Act. I decided to ask family to help me in this desperate time of need, I sent my children back to Eastern Cape where they went to an Afrikaans medium school. I also contravened the Maintenance Act where it states that I have a duty to financially support my children. My financial downfall was caused by the fact that all public schools in this area are Afrikaans medium, I am now drowning in debt because I wanted to keep my minor children at school.

My children left Springbok in March 2018 in the middle of a school first term. I did not have a choice because I tried to ask the school for a discount, exemption or any other arrangement but I was turned down. The other problem was that if the school fees wasn't paid on the 3rd of each month your child will not be given work or your child must stay at home until the school fees is fully paid. During this process if you send your children to school and they will sit in class doing nothing, every child and everyone that works at the school will know that the child's school fees was not paid. In the meantime you as a parent will have to pay back the money but the child will not be given back that time they lost in the class. I am a working parent and resigning is not an option I could not leave my minor children alone at home while I am at work. I also did not want to cause stress and humiliation to my children when the other kids would make fun of them because their school fees were not paid.

Currently my children are attending an Afrikaans medium school because where they are at the moment the people at home can assist them with Afrikaans and the teachers are helping them with Afrikaans. They are doing well academically because of the support system. The only challenge I face from this arrangement is that my children forgot their home language Xhosa and English, the family that is looking after them are Afrikaans speaking people. The school that they are attending now is a public school but

they have very few students, individual attention is given to them by the teachers.

I am asking the department to help black children and their parents. A black child is suffering in Springbok education wise. The department is not doing a black child justice and a black child is deprived of he's/her Constitutional right. A black child needs change in terms of education. A black parent like me that must drown in debt just to try to give my minor children education in the language that they understand. Our black children have big dreams for their education but they will never be able to fulfill those dreams if our black children are forced to learn in Afrikaans. We have democracy in this country but in Springbok area it feels like we are still in the colonial times where black children must suffer. In Springbok I am not the only black parent that is affected by this issue.

Attached is a name list of parents including coloured parents that would like their children to be taught in English. There are more children that are affected than my name list. I did not have the platform or means to get the correct statistics myself.

I hope that you will give a black child affordable English education and take financial burden off the black parents.

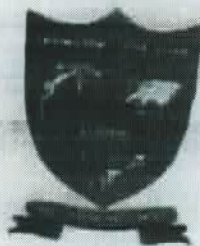
