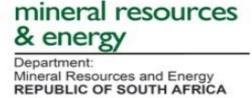

INTRODUCTION

- It is my pleasure to present the 2020/21 Annual Performance Report for the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy and to note that the revitalisation of mineral resources and energy is high on the agenda and regarded as an important vehicle to stimulate the economic growth.
- The Department has a mandate to regulate, transform and promote minerals and energy sectors, providing sustainable and affordable energy mix for growth and development and ensuring that all South Africans derives sustainable benefit from the country's mineral wealth.
- This Annual Report is an essential component of our Strategic Management Process as it seeks
 to provide feedback on the extent and manner in which the Department of Mineral Resources
 and Energy has implemented its programmes & projects during the 2020/21 financial year
 against the targets stated in the Annual Performance Plan.
- The Department received an unqualified audit opinion on both the Annual Financial Statements and Programme Performance Information from AGSA with matters of emphases for the 2020/21 FY.





KEY POLICY DEVELOPMENTS AND LEGISLATIVE CHANGES

The Draft Upstream Petroleum Resources Development Bill, 2019	The Department aims to request Cabinet's approval to introduce the Bill in Parliament in 2021 and once Cabinet approval has been obtained, the Minister will introduce the Bill to Parliament.
The Gas Amendment Bill	The Bill was approved by Cabinet and will be introduced to Parliament in 2021 where it will undergo parliamentary consultation processes to ensure that it is widely endorsed for implementation once passed into law.
The Clean Fuels II Regulations	The regulations will be gazetted for public comments.
Mandatory Biofuels Blending Regulations	The regulations will be gazetted for public comments.
The Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG) Rollout Strategy	The Department will gazette the LPG Rollout Strategy for public comment in 2021. This strategy follows the review of the LPG Strategy due to challenges that were identified, such as the LPG pricing framework, safety regarding the use of LPG, cylinder management, inadequate LPG import, storage and distribution infrastructure, and lack of transformation (restrictive features of the market).
Development of the Artisanal and Small-Scale Mining Policy	As of the 1st of April 2020, the Department has approved R38 million towards rehabilitation costs, exploration, and capitalization of small-scale projects.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2020/21 FY

- 99% approved invoices were paid within 30 days of receipt;
- 4721 jobs were created through issued mining rights;
- 9 black industrialists were created through procurement;
- 644 petroleum site compliance inspections were conducted, and 965 fuel samples were tested;
- 401 mining economics (MWP/PWP) inspections were conducted;
- 968 environmental inspections were conducted;
- 95.24% of petroleum license applications were approved with a minimum of 50% HDSA ownership;
- 5 carbon offset projects were processed and approved.
- Report on energy-related climate change response measures produced;
- 14 Publications and reports were produced;
- Chrome Beneficiation Strategy approved by Cabinet in September 2020;
- Approved beneficiation Masterplan;
- Draft Artisanal and small-scale mining policy developed;
- Draft Regulations on the long-term operation of nuclear installations were gazetted;
- · National Energy Regulator Amendment Bill is currently with State Law advisors en-route to Cabinet; and
- Gas Amendment Bill approved by Economic Cluster.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2020/21 FY

- There was a 19% reduction in occupational injuries and 32% reduction in occupational diseases (Including TB);
- A total of 8030 inspections (including individual audits) were conducted;
- Preferred bidders have been appointed for supply of 1 995 MW with signing of Power Purchase Agreements subject to preferred bidders reaching financial close within the agreed timeline;
- 1.58 TWh savings against the annual target of 0.5TWh were realized;
- 14 new Additional Municipalities were included in the EEDSM project;
- 2015 National Energy Efficiency Strategy finalised and in process of being submitted to Cabinet for consideration;
- 1 Wind Atlas South Africa (WASA) report Developed;
- 166 888 additional households electrified with grid electrification;
- Roadmap for implementation of the 2 500 MW nuclear programme developed; and
- 70% of authorisation applications were processed within the 8-week period.

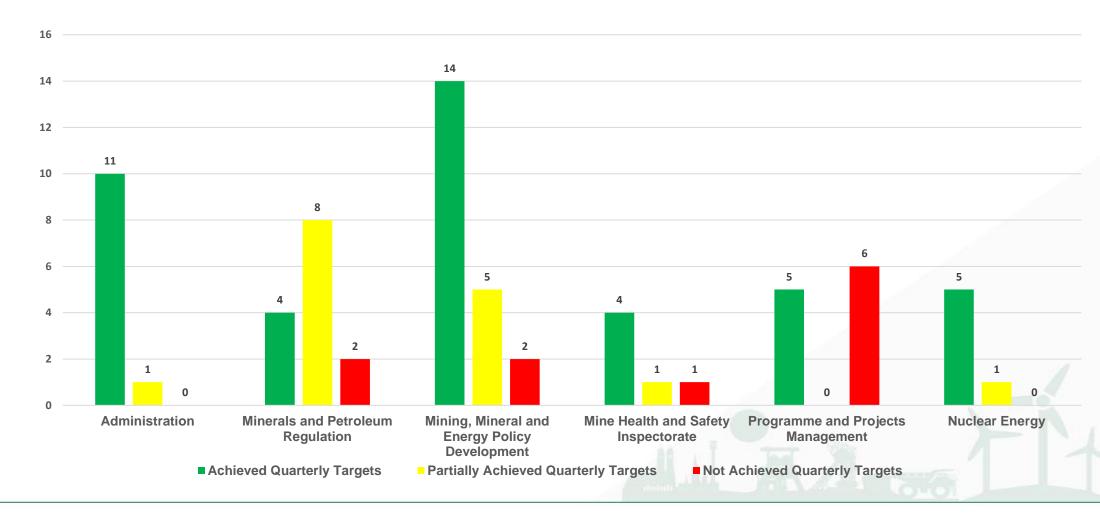

GRAPHICAL PRESENTATION OF THE 2020-21 RESULTS





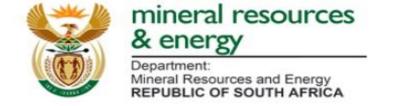






STRATEGIES TO OVERCOME UNDERPERFORMANCE

- Targets not achieved and partially achieved are attributed to various factors and in the main due to the impact of Covid 19, the Department has and intervention strategy to enhance performance in the control environment for attainment of outcomes which could not be achieved.
- The implementation of intervention measures are monitored and evaluated on a quarterly basis at various management structures to determine the effective and efficient implementation of mitigation strategies and to make recommendations for improvement were there are gaps and limitations.





SERVICE DELIVERY ENVIRONMENT

- An effective and efficient response to the pandemic, in the form of lockdown restrictions aimed at flattening the curve, has resulted in an economic halt that had to be revived after the lockdown.
- The government, through the National Command Council, resolved to re-open the economy in a risk-adjusted approach.
- It became imperative that the complex initiatives of the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE),
 which were aimed at stimulating the economy, fit into this framework, as they deal with the Department's
 operational readiness, the South African mining industry's health and safety readiness, as well as interventions
 and responses within the broader mining and energy sectors.
- The COVID-19 pandemic has had a serious impact on societies and has had an immeasurable impact on economies and industries around the world. The mining and energy industries, being industries that operate on a global scale and rely heavily on people employed, were not spared from this pandemic.
- The department's contribution towards Covid 19 response package was submitted to National Treasury with the downward net change of the base line allocation. This resulted in a need to reprioritise funding in various economic classifications including compensation of employees for the MTEF.

ORGANIZATIONAL ENVIRONMENT

- The Department of Mineral Resources and Energy was established on 29 May 2019 by the merger of the Department of Energy and the Department of Mineral Resources to better equip and capacitate the Department to respond to the strategic objectives derived from the NDP, the MTSF and the ERRP.
- The merger of the Department of Mineral Resources and the Department of Energy into a new Department of Mineral Resources and Energy effective from 1 April 2020 saw most efforts during the 2020/21 financial year flowing into the matching and placement of staff which was concluded at the end of the financial year.
- The match and placing process, which emanated from the National Macro Organisation of Government (NMOG), was completed in November 2020. Officials were subsequently given placement letters in October 2020.
- The approved organisational start-up structure comprises of 1647 posts, with a vacancy rate of 7.89% on active
 posts.
- The Department conducted change management sessions with various programmes and will continue to do so during the 2021/22 financial year.
- The Department is currently reviewing the organisational structure to align it with the strategic plan with a
 view to ensure that the organisational structure is fit for purpose to implement the dynamic mandate of the
 department.
- Filling of vacant positions has been prioritised for completion during the year under review.

GOVERNANCE MATTERS HIGHLIGHTS

The department is committed to maintaining the highest standards of governance to safeguard public finances and resources

Risk Management at DMRE

- During the year under review and in line with the requirements of Section 38(i) (a) of the PFMA read together with the Public Sector Risk Management Framework, the Department of Mineral Resources and Energy (DMRE) executed the risk management function by way of implementing the following activities:
- Risk Assessment workshops were conducted across the enterprise with a to identify, evaluate and prioritize
 risks as the effect of uncertainty on objectives followed by synchronized and economical utilization of
 resources to reduce,monitor, and control the likelihood or impact of the occurrence of events that could
 negatively impact the department to achieve maximum benefits of opportunities that come the way of the
 organization.

Fraud and Corruption

- The Department has a Fraud Prevention Plan in place setting out actions that are required to minimize the occurrence of irregularities, malpractices, fraudulent and or corrupt practices.
- All reported cases of alleged, irregular, and/or fraudulent practices received from the Presidential Hotline, members of the public, and media during the year under review were investigated and resolved.

GOVERNANCE MATTERS HIGHLIGHTS

Minimising Conflict of Interest

- Senior managers, Middle managers and officials from Finance as well as Supply Chain Management also referred as designated employees, were required to disclose their financial interest as required by the financial disclosure framework.
- The principle of consequence management was applied management and other employees who failed to comply with the disclosure and conflict of interest directive; and
- Attendees of various management structures are required to disclose and append signatures on the record of attendance register. conflict-of-interest disclosure register is signed by all attendees in various management structures.
- A departmental gift register is in place as a mechanism for recording and maintenance of gifts received by management and other employees of the department.

Code of Conduct

 Departmental employees are informed about the Code of Conduct for public servants and what is ethically and morally expected from them during the execution of their duties and responsibilities.

Health Safety and Environmental Issues

 Department had to align with National Health Protocols and Directives pertaining to the management of Covid-19.

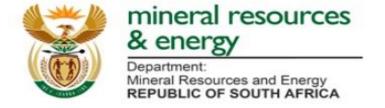

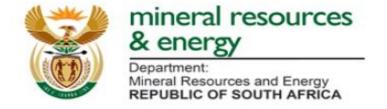

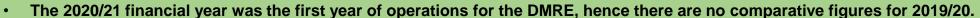

- <u>Compensation of employees</u>: the recorded unspent funds for this classification were mainly due to a delay in filling vacant positions pending the conclusion of the National Macro Organisation of Government (NMOG) which was later compounded by a longer than anticipated recruitment process.
- <u>Goods and services</u>: the overspending was due to costs which had to be transferred from the transfers and subsidies classification to goods and services classification in compliance with NT Classification Circular. This is in relation to projects that are being implemented by its Entities on behalf of the Department the budget was appropriated under transfer payments.
- <u>Transfer payments</u>: in addition to the allocation for projects implemented by entities, the unspent funds on the INEP-Non Grid programme contributed significantly to the underspending in this classification due to delays in finalising contracts and the subsequent challenges experienced by appointed services providers in sourcing of supplies.
- Payments for capital assets: spending in this classification was negatively impacted by the pandemic as remote working by staff reduced the demand for office equipment.



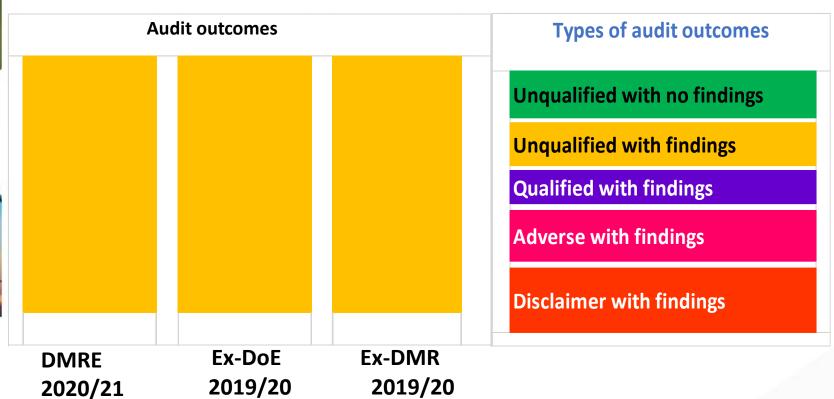

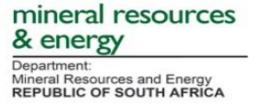




SUMMARY OF AUDIT FINDINGS

 - Contingent assets,
 - Immovable assets,
 - Inadequate impairment consideration of departmental accrued revenue, and
 - Incorrect classification of Transfers and subsidies
- Irregular expenditure of R7,458,000 was incurred and recorded during the financial year 2020/21 and an amount of R4,005,000 relate to the irregular expenditure incurred during the 2019/20 financial year. Both these amounts were as a result of the non-compliance to the SCM legislation.
- ☐ Fruitless & Wasteful expenditure of R 20,695, 000.00 was recorded in the financial year 2020/21 for additional storage of the SWH units.
