





Financial Performance Overview March 2021



Overview

- The financial viability of SANEDI is assessed as being good. The entity maintained a strong balance sheet during the financial period.
- The balance sheet has a net asset values of R156million resulting from positive cash reserves.
- Revenue has declined over the financial period as SANEDI is mainly dependent on the MTEF allocation and donor funds, which has been dwindling over the last few years.
- Net deficit of R75million due to discontinued ops.



Statement of Financial Position Overview March 2021






Key highlights

- Assets exceeded liabilities as at 31 March 2021 by R 156 million, this made up of cash balances earmarked for existing projects.
- We also have accumulated surpluses from prior periods.
- Asset are made up of cash balances predominantly.
- Total Liabilities include grant funding for projects and also bonus provisions and other payroll related liabilities.

Key Highlights

- Reduction of PPE due to transfer of I.T Equipment R1M from the CCUS.
- We also have the Section12L Software that was amortized and is fully depreciated.
- Cash reserves were in a favourable position, inline with prior year at R261M, this is cash committed for earmarked projects and includes a R103mil for ring-fenced projects.

Key Highlights

- Grants increased from the prior year, SANEDI received some additional funding from international donor agencies, including the EU GBS Programme and also received R146million from the DSI in the year for our Energy Efficiency programmes.
- Bonus Payments raised for the 2018/2019 and the 2019/2020 year were made ,resulting in the decrease in provisions.





Financial Performance March 2021







Due to the transfer of CCUS.

Key Highlights

- Total revenue amounted to R89 million with R73 million being the MTEF allocation from the National Treasury. The remainder being donor grant revenue.
- Expenses Amounted to R74 million, inline with the prior year.
- Project costs increased by 18% due to some projects being implemented and achieved in line with the targets.
- Surplus amounted to R15 million from continued ops.
- Deficit amounted to R76 million from discontinued ops.
- An application to retain surpluses was made to National Treasury.

Fruitless expenditure mainly due to travel costs. Irregular Expenditure from prior year was due to 3 quotes not obtained, lowest bidder not selected prior to award, costs incurred outside of award period and was carried forward from the prior period, there was no additional irregular expenditure incurred in the current year.

Transfer of functions

 The Minister of Department of Mineral resources and Energy endorsed the transfer of the functions within the CCUS to the Council for Geoscience in September 2021. All financial obligations and commitments have also been transferred.
