Programme 3:


Housing Development

These funds were spent achieving the following outcomes:

- Access to adequate housing and empowerment opportunities for citizens in the Western Cape and
- Security of tenure through home ownership.



ACTIVITIES

Some of the key activities that were achieved during the 2020/2021 financial year is highlighted below.

Improved efficiencies

6 ICT systems were enhanced.

98% of all invoices were paid within 30 days.

6 municipal engagements were held and additional ministerial outreach programmes were held with communities.

1 knowledge management project was delivered.

LIVEABLE NEIGHBOURHOODS

Within the priority housing development areas, **1** integrated implementation plan was completed;

10 new projects were approved that is aligned with national and provincial priorities;

25 municipalities were provided with technical support;

1 research paper was completed; 1 policy and 1 policy guideline was approved;

Access to adequate housing and empowerment opportunities for citizens in the Western Cape

6 247 units were delivered, against a planned total of 8 506 housing opportunities;

5 204 sites were delivered against a planned total of 5 697 housing opportunities;

1 313 EEDBS were delivered against a planned total of 650;

67.53% of the Human Settlement Development Grant (HSDG) was awarded to contractors in designated groups against a target of 50% of which;

14.68% was spent on contractors with women representation against a target of 10% and

5.34% was spent on contractors with youth representation against a target of 4%;

937 jobs were facilitated within the built environment against a target of 800;

56 young people have been trained within the built environment, against a target of 150; and

1035 houses were built using sustainable building technologies, against a target of 1000.



Security of tenure through home ownership

6 352 title deeds were transferred to qualifying beneficiaries against a target of 8 110, which is broken down as:

112 beneficiaries of pre-1994 housing units, against a target of 110; **3 598** beneficiaries of pre-2014 housing units against a target of 1 000; and

2 642 beneficiaries of post-2014 housing units against a target of 7 000.
