
## NPA ANNUAL PERFORMANCE PLAN 2022/2023

#### Building a fit-for-purpose and future-proof NPA

Briefing to the Portfolio Committee on Justice and Correctional Service



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#### INTRODUCTION

- NPA midway with implementing 5-year strategic plan. On track to deliver on key strategic priorities, although nimble prioritisation was required
- APP tweaked to respond to emerging realities. Need to build fit-for-purpose and future-proof NPA
- ► Getting seminal corruption cases to court is our primary focus guided by the evidence
- The recent Zondo report again highlighted how much damage state capture has done to SA. The NPA must ensure that justice is done and seen to be done. The future of our country depends on this
- We know we have to do better. But there has also been notable progress in the past year progress to be proud of, including in other aspects of accountability like recovering stolen money

#### SHARPENING OUR FOCUS TO RESPOND TO HIGH-LEVEL CORRUPTION

- NPA has a broad mandate and needs to prosecute many serious crimes that impact on thousands of victims each year. We remain resolute in our efforts to deliver justice to all, especially victims of SGBV.
- But high-level corruption is tearing our country apart and we need to focus on responding to it for the coming months. The time for talking is over. We are driving action through the following priority initiatives:
  - Zondo Commission reports were reviewed and a clear implementation plan crafted in line with the sixmonths priority strategy. The NPA is working closely with DPCI to prioritise seminal matters
  - ► NPA Task-Force working closely with DPCI to enhance collaboration on high-level corruption cases
  - Capacitation, expanded powers and permanence of the ID
  - Ongoing engagements to onboard Zondo Commission Digital Forensic Lab and specialised skills
  - Collaboration with international firms to trace and recover stolen monies and development of a system on Non- Prosecution Decisions
  - Conducting a skills assessment on high level corruption

### **SHARPENING OUR FOCUS cont**

- As committed to Portfolio Committee, the transition to the new ID leadership was swift and seamless. Adv. Andrea Johnson is a career prosecutor with an impeccable track-record, with the unwavering support from the NDPP and ExCo. The ID is indeed poised for action. In this regard:
  - ► ID has declared 82 investigations and enrolled 20 cases with 65 accused
  - ► ID has prioritised 9 corruption matters for enrolment within the next 6 months

- The NPA will continue to find bold and innovative ways of leveraging private sector support while closely protecting NPA independence and compliance with relevant regulations
- NPA ExCo adopted new monitoring and review processes to ensure implementation and accountability, i.e. organisational performance review, six months priority review and strategic initiatives review
- ► Focus on innovation, transformation and ethical standards throughout the organisation

The additional Compensation of Employees will be used to increase the capacity within the NPA as follows:

- ► NPS 700 aspirant prosecutors
- ► AFU 17 Senior State advocates
- ► OWP 12 Protectors
- ► ID 91 (Investigators and prosecutors)

The additional Goods and Services budget will be used as follows:

- ▶ NPS Operational cost for prosecutors R 30m (R10m 2022/23; R 10m 2023/24 and R 10m 2024/25)
- Resourcing within ID R115,6m (R40,1m 2022/23; R 37,4m 2023/24 and R 38,1m 2024/25)
- OWP Increase in witness related expenditure R45,7m (R15m 2022/23; R 15m 2023/24 and R 15.7m 2024/25)
- SOC Increase in Technology and Fleet services R 107,3m (R35m 2022/23; R 35,4m 2023/24 and R36,9m – 2024/25)

### **ADDITIONAL FUNDING NEEDS OF THE NPA**

#### Funding requirement for an ideal NPA:

- NPA registered a need for additional funding to respond to the Zondo Commission reports, as well as longer term 'structural needs' funding to strengthen NPA capacity as part of the criminal justice system's response to rising crime levels.
- Added funding of R750m p.a. and R1bn p.a. is required for both these purposes from FY 2023/24 onward.
- The additional funding will mainly be used for:
  - Appointment of NPA Act Section 38 capacity
  - Modernisation of the NPA
  - Capacitating the Investigating Directorate, National Prosecutions Service (including specialised units) as well as OWP
  - Other accompanying goods & services and machinery & equipment

## CONCLUSION – THE NPA'S NEW FOUNDATION IS IN PLACE AND THE TIME FOR ACTION HAS ARRIVED

- ► The entire NPA knows that failure is not an option. And after three years of rebuilding, we can say with confidence that the time for ACTION has arrived. We are ready to rebuild the rule of law in our country
- Our hard work over the past 12 months is paying off. You can see it internally, and our actions are starting to speak for themselves. The ubiquitous taps of corruption are being turned off. No-one controls the NPA, and the corrupt know that the long arm of justice is catching up. But we still have a long way to go
- With our new leadership team in place, a revitalised and poised for action ID, and a committed staff, the NPA is entering a new era where justice wins again. This success will draw increased attacks against the NPA and its staff. But we are ready
- We are thankful for our recent budget growth, and we look forward to strengthening our legal framework so that we can truly deliver on our mandate to be lawyers of the people of South Africa
- Our 5-year strategy and APP provide the guidance we need to stay on course
