
- The South Africa Sugar Converters Association, SASCA, was established in April 2021
- We are comprised of members who manufacture confectionary products or "convert" sugar into added value products
- We have over 20 member South African owned companies
- The industry has an estimate of 20 000 directly employees and over 200 000 indirect employees






Our Mission

• To create a sustainable confectionary industry that positively contributes to the growth of the South African economy





Challenges we face

- Inadequate support for our industry
- Unacceptably high sugar tariffs with exorbitantly high local sugar price
- Ingrain the sole supplier of glucose just raised its price by 30%
- Electricity interruptions, damaged infrastructure, instability and road blockages
- SASA the lobby/industry representatives have failed to negotiate or come to the table
- Our sector has until recently been ignored, we need government support
- Companies are shut or moving their manufacturing abroad
- A lack of clarity regarding SASA's role, including failing to meet undertakings and account for their failures to deliver-currently we are in a dispute with them.

Attempts to get relief or support

We had called on SASA to negotiate a rebate on the sugar used by South African owned smaller/medium players

We have requested a rebate for exports, currently the rebate on exports has been reduced significantly

We have reported Ingrain to the Competition Commission and informed the minister

We have reported to the minister of DTIC that the sugar industry has failed to fulfil the undertakings by raising prices above CPI

Way forward

- We call on parliament to assist in holding stakeholders to account
- To consider the jobs and economic value chain in our sector
- Consider benfication and building South African brands internationally as well as import replacement
- Engage smaller players like SASCA, on an ongoing basis so that the challenges be addressed.
- Recognize that sugar converters and manufactures have huge potential to grow South Africa's agenda
