- Addendum to the 2022/23 Annual Performance Plan (APP):
 - Background.
 - Amended 2022/23 Annual Performance Plan (APP) Performance Indicators.

- Five performance indicators were amended in the Addendum to the 2022/23 APP, which was tabled in Parliament on namely:
 - Percentage reduction in the number of reported contact crimes;
 - Percentage reduction in the number of reported contact crimes at the Top 30 High Contact Crime Weight Stations;
 - Percentage reduction in the number of reported contact crimes against women (18 years and above);
 - Percentage reduction in the number of reported contact crimes against children (below 18 years); and
 - Number of cities and towns in which the initiation of the SAPS' Safer Cities Project has been confirmed.

- The June 2019 State of the National Address (SoNA) requires that violent crime be halved in a decade.
 - This implies that by 2028/29, the levels of contact crimes that were reported in 2018/19, including contact crimes against women and children must have been reduced by 50%.
- The targets that were published in the tabled SAPS 2022/23 APP, must be revised, based on the final crime figures for 2021/22, as there were significant increases in most categories in the last quarter.

- The Revised Medium-term Strategic Framework (MTSF) 2019 to 2024, indicates that the South African Police Service (SAPS) will initiate the implementation of the Safer City Framework in 10 pilot cities, by 30 June 2021.
- The Ministry of Police has required that the SAPS, in collaboration with its partners in Government, including local Municipalities, ratify both the relevance and the viability of the Safer Cities Framework, as it has a legislated obligation to ensure that the SAPS delivers on its mandate, as specified by Section 205(3) of the Constitution.
