South Africa's Climate Change Bill

- SAFCEI is fully in support of the Climate Change Bill and commends Parliament for taking action.
- The Climate Change Bill is essential for South Africa to realise its Nationally Determined Contributions, as agreed and set in the international negotiations with the UNFCCC.
- This is urgent legislation that is late in terms of science and needs to now be implemented

Climate Change Bill

- Globally leadership and action on climate change has been slow and ineffective thus far.
- Climate denialism has no place in the current inputs for the Climate Change Bill. We must follow science and experts in this regard.
- Its important to listen to climate science, not pseudo science presented as facts.



Climate Change Bill Submission

- Excessive green house gases are problematic and needs to be recognised as an offense and taxed effectively to prevent larger entities being able to pay and not change their behaviours.
- SAFCEI recommends higher penalties, that need to be effective.
- We don't want big entities to be able to pay to pollute.

- We request that everyone should have access to information on adaptation and climate response plans from different sectors and ministries: energy, agriculture, transport, water; as well as from municipalities and provinces.
- The public need to know what is planned so that informed input into these plans can be made. Without the necessary information, the public cannot adequately participate.
- A climate change bill [act] where information is readily available to anyone.

Climate Change Bill- addressing Business As Usual

- We need to have carbon budgets with deadlines
- We want to share our support for implementation plans that have dates
- For the climate change bill to take affect, it must be actively policed with enforcement, and effective implementation.
- South African's energy crisis can be effectively addressed through a just energy transition.
- A Just Energy Transition does not include any fossil fuels or nuclear energy.

- The Bill should contain strong emission reduction targets that are based on the best available and latest science to ensure that we stay within 1.5 °C of global warming, by:
 - assigning carbon budgets to emitters (how much companies and entities are allowed to emit in terms of GHGs)
 - assigning Sectoral Emissions Targets (how much each sector – such as energy, agriculture, transport – is allowed to emit).
- There should be a long-term target of net zero by 2050 included in the Bill. There also needs to be a clear definition of net-zero and an understanding of the conditions for its application.
- Require progress reports on the performance of emitters regarding GHG emissions reduction responsibilities.
