Summer readiness dialogue



Minister Wenger will host the annual **summer readiness dialogue on 19 October 2023** to discuss key issues facing the industry in anticipation of a busy tourism season.



60 representatives from the industry are expected to attend the event.

Visitor safety

Visitor safety: National initiatives



250 tourism monitors will be deployed across the Western Cape in 2023/24. The Department of Tourism, TBCSA and DEDAT have identified hotspots which will be prioritized.



Tourism monitors will be trained and equipped with the **Secura app** as well as **Cmore tracking devices**. Tourism monitors will also receive support from the TBCSA and SATSA through a 'Tourism Angels Network'.



The Department of Tourism has secured the commitment from SAPS that **police reservists** will be available during the summer season to assist with tourism safety.



Visitor safety: Provincial initiatives



20 Chrysalis graduates have been deployed by the Department of Community Safety as tourism safety officers in Cape Town at key hotspots.



DEDAT convenes a **Tourism Safety Forum** which has representation of the public and private sectors.

DEDAT also prepares a **Season Readiness Plan** which sets out protocols to be followed in the case of major incidents. In the case of serious incidents a **Communications Task Team** is activated.



DEDAT staff participates in a **SATSA tourism safety WhatsApp group** and activates the tourist in distress programme when needed.



Visitor safety: Provincial initiatives (Tourist in distress programme)



The **tourism safety support unit** will be operational during the summer season.



Support available includes:

- Medical/emotional trauma incl. visits at hospitals
- Advice on short-term temporary accommodation
- Help with basic necessities, where possible
- Help with contacting family or friends
- Facilitation of counseling
- Advice with short-term transport arrangements
- Liaison with embassies/ consulates in case of lost passports and visas
- Support with opening cases with SAPS



Visitor safety: City of Cape Town



The Tourism Law Enforcement

unit is a City of Cape Town initiative and consists of 8 dedicated officers who are deployed at key hotspots.



The **CBD**, **Table Mountain**, **Signal Hill**, **V&A Waterfront** and the **Bo-Kaap** areas will continue to be patrolled daily.





Visitor safety: Cape Town CBD



Security personnel patrolling the CBD and V&A Waterfront will be equipped with **front facing body cameras**.



The CCID have increased the number of their security personnel and they have **new patrol vehicles** to make sure that they improve their response to incidents.





Destination

Accessibility



The Western Cape's key source markets **do not need visas** (limited to 90 days or less).



The Department of Home Affairs has missed its own deadline for the introduction of a **remote work visa**.



DEDAT has appointed a service provider to benchmark South Africa against competitor destinations and to model the **economic benefits that can be realised for South Africa through visa reform**. This research is currently underway.



Air and cruise accessibility & season readiness



The Cape Town Air Access and Cruise Cape Town teams have planned a **series of events and activations** to support airlines and cruise ships returning to the province this season.



41 learners funded by DEDAT will be placed at **Cape Town International Airport** (CTIA) to assist with general tasks in and around the airport.



Tourism Safety Monitors will also be deployed at CTIA and the cruise terminal at the V&A Waterfront.



Tourist vehicle operating licences



DEDAT continues to monitor the **issuing of tourist vehicle operating licences** by the National Public Transport Regulator. A moratorium or amnesty has been introduced to prevent traffic police from harassing tourist vehicle owners for not having a valid operating licence.



Workforce Readiness

Skills partnership



DEDAT convenes a **tourism skills forum**. The forum is made up of industry bodies, TVET colleges and other skills partners. Quarterly meetings are held. The Forum is a clearing house bridging the skills gap and linking skills supply with demand.



20 learners started on 1 September at **Boschendal** to assist with hospitality related tasks.



200 learners commenced on 1 September at **Isis Café** as waiters, runners and other hospitality related activities.



Chrysalis graduates are available to the industry to assist with entry level skills needs.



Customer care training for frontline staff



During the course of September and October, DEDAT will be training **150 hospitality frontline** workers in customer service.



The training is **CATHSSETA accredited**.



6 groups will be trained in the following localities: Cape Town (north and south), Langebaan/ Saldanha, Piketberg, Hermanus and Bredasdorp.





Tourist guide training & registration



DEDAT in partnership with the City of Cape Town has **trained 38 tourist guides in Cape Town**. Some of these guides previously guided illegally as they did not have the appropriate qualifications.



The training is **CATHSSETA accredited**.

Participants are from Langa, Athlone, Mitchell's Plain, Hanover Park, Mfuleni, Khayelitsha, Houtbay, Nyanga and Robben Island.



A **two-day tourist guide bootcamp** will also take place in October.



It is expected that **DEDAT will register nearly 1,200 tourist guides** during this financial year. Applications tend to increase drastically in lead up to the summer season. The application process is fully digitised.



Tourism skills initiatives of the Department of Tourism



Food Safety Quality Assurers Skills Training Programme (2023): 42 unemployed youth from Hermanus and Gansbaai have successfully graduated.



Wine Service Training Programme

(2023): 49 unemployed youth from Hermanus and Drakenstein have successfully graduated.
