COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- a) The department did not have any cuts in the budget for the NPOs in the 2021-22 financial year in the province. There are no NPOs affected by budgets cuts
- b) Only one organization, namely *Honey Dew Youth Development Centre* was <u>terminated / discontinued</u> due to poor management of funds.
- c) An amount of *R242, 014* was suspended, following the identification of a replacement NPO. The allocated budget was spent in line with the planned outputs for 2021/2022.
