Good afternoon Plenary Chairperson,

The Honourable Chairperson of the Defence Committee,

The Honourable Members of the Defence Committee,

The Minister of Defence,

The Deputy Minister of Defence,

What concerns me about the Lady R, who arrived here like the lady of the night and disappeared as quicky as she had arrived, what has not been raised are the incidents of the docking of ships involved in the BRIC's Navel Exercises, what was loaded on those ships we do not Know.

Having served in the Military for many years we have to adopt the "Code of Conduct for all uniformed Members of the South African National Defence Force" as well as the "Rules of war", notwithstanding these principles of engagement, the one thing that stand out is paragraphs two and three of the "Rules of War",

"I will fight only enemy combatants and attack only military objectives".

"I will employ methods of attack to achieve the military objectives with the least amount of harm to civilian life and property".

As far as the Military Veterans Department is concerned, this Department is in a worse state than the Department of Defence:

Not the filling of critical Posts,

Little or no service delivery,

Riddled with corruption,

No value for money,

The money that is budgeted by Military Veteran's Department for the number of Veterans Registered as served cannot be justified.

Military Veterans should be respected for their Service by the Department and Country that we served, I have served this Nation for over forty years in our Military.
