- crisis that the provincial department is facing. That KZNDoH had instituted cost- curtailment measures due to financial pressures and the extent at which this decision has contributed to the
- There is a shortage of health professionals, partcularly specialists leaving the employment of KZNDoH due to unconducive working conditions
- ≡ The staff requirements in relation to Addington and Inkosi Albert Luthuli Hospitals was unclear.

- 3 Access to treatment for cancer patients in rural areas is a concern and the need for plans to ensure that patiennts in rural areas receive oncology treatment
- < That there seem to be senior management instability in the provincial department as key senior management positions remained vacant
- ≤ by provincial departments There seem to be a weakness in the national department's early warning system in monitoring and intervening in some of the challenges faced
- **≦** That there is a potential gap in communication between national and provincial departments and cited the mental health crisis in Gauteng as an example
- VIII. The backlog of patients awaiting treatment is concerning.
- $\overline{\times}$ That certain hospitals newly installed radiotherapy machines remained unutilized due to lack of staff trained to operate these machines
- \times That the SAHRC's monitoring had been contrained because full access was denied in some of the hospitals
- \succeq The lack of SMAs for the maintenance of the oncology equipment had contributed to the collapse of oncology services in KZN.
