Successes, Challenges and Lessons Learnt

4. ILDP Successes, challenges and lessons learnt thus far



- 1.The delegates found the content relevant and practical.
- 2. The immersion was successful and delegates continue
- 3. Daily integration sessions built into the programme worked extremely well.



- One delegate, Anneline Schmidt did not attend the immersion. No notification of her intention not to participate was provided.
 - 2. Challenges regarding the declined visas
- 3. Some delegates thought that GIBS would be paying for the delegates 'visas.
- Siyabonga Ncube forgot his passport on the plane whilst disembarking which in Dubai resulted in a 48 delay in his joining the group in Singapore.
- 5. Frans Mokwala was left behind at the train station in Singapore after the Amazing Race.
- 6.There was dissatisfaction with the level of engagement and interaction with the Seekers agent.
- 7.Too long in transit from Singapore Dubai Amsterdam.



- 1. Consider more direct flights to destinations
- 2. A city bus tour should be included to assist delegates in getting to know their surroundings.



4. ILDP Delegate reflections

"The Singapore leg of the trip was really great and I enjoyed the interaction at SIM university. It was nice to see their attitude towards lifelong education, I learnt a new word here, "Meritocracy" – lifelong learning. It was also great seeing how as South Africans our institutes are on par with other international institutes. I found the content I learnt during my study blocks at GIBS on a similar level to what we were exposed to at SIM. - 1. The delegates continue to find the content relevant and practical
- 2. The immersion was successful and delegates continue to reflect on how the experience impacted them
- 3. The partnerships with and Peter Cohen in New York and Rollins college in Orlando proved to be successful. They provided high quality faculty and organised appropriate engagements and visits
 - 4. The travel partner also served the programme well



- 1. The 7 days on the ground in the United States proved to be insufficient. Whilst delegates appreciated being exposed to as many companies and experiences as possible, their feedback was that it was rushed.
- 2. Lucky Kolobe was left behind at JFK and had to catch another flight to Orlando
- 3. A smaller allowance was made available to the delegates on their first night in Orlando and the Hotel service was below standard



- 1. A recommendation was made to Famanda and Claire that the time allocated to the IEDP be reviewed. 10 days on the ground should be considered.
- 2. Allow for more time in between transit and consider direct flights.
- 3. Allow for stipends throughout the trip
 - 4. Allow for more action learning coaching time
 - 5. Allow for more down for reflection and for cultural experiences
