Investigation into attacks on two persons of SANDF

98. Mr R JANKIEL SOHN (DP) asked the Minister of Safety and Security:

(1) Whether the SA Police Service has completed its investigation into the attacks on two persons of the SANDF (names furnished): if not, when is it anticipated that this investigation will be completed; if so, what were the findings;

(2) whether the SAPS has completed its investigation into allegations that 2 000 AK-47 rifles that were to have been destroyed by the SANDF were stolen and sold; if not, when is it anticipated that the investigation will be completed; if so, what were the findings? N122E

THE MINISTER OF SAFETY AND SECURITY:

(1) The department investigated a case of attempted murder with regard to the assault on WO1 Mongalo of the SANDF, vide Moot CAS 198/08/2000. WO1 Mongalo was discharged from hospital after treatment, but has since passed away.

The case docket was signed for by Sur Supt Venter of the Scorpions during 2000. Further enquiries in this regard should therefore be directed to the Minister for Justice and Constitutional Development.

The department investigated a case of hijacking and attempted murder regard-

ing the incident in which Brig-Gen Amos Lingisi of the SANDF was injured, vide Durban Central CAS 2368/08/2000. No arrests have been made nor has the vehicle been recovered. The case docket has been closed and filed as "Undetected".

(2) The SAPS never investigated the alleged theft and sale of 2 000 AK-47 rifles as a criminal case was never registered. According to Brigadier-General Trevor Meyer of the Special Investigations Unit: SA National Defence Force, the incident was never reported to the SA Police Service because the SANDF did not positively establish that rifles had in fact disappeared. He is personally investigating these allegations.

Any further enquiries in this regard should be directed to the Minister of Defence, as the investigation falls under his jurisdiction.

Protection of property rights of SA citizens in foreign countries

103. Mr A J BOTHA (DP) asked the Minister of Foreign Affairs:

(1) Whether South Africa has any policy to protect the property rights of South African citizens in foreign countries; if not, why not; if so, what is the policy;

(2) whether any South African citizens have appealed to the Government to protect their property rights in Zimbabwe; if so,

(3) whether the Government has taken any action in this regard; if so, what action; if not, in light of other foreign

nationals having had their properties in Zimbabwe returned to them after intervention by their governments with the authorities in Zimbabwe, what action does the Government intend taking if it is approached by South African citizens whose property in Zimbabwe has been expropriated;

(4) whether the Government has called upon the Zimbabwean government to respect the property rights of South African citizens in Zimbabwe; if so,

(5) whether the Government will consider taking any punitive action against members of the Zimbabwean government in respect of their property in South Africa in the event of the Zimbabwean government not heeding this call; if not, why not; if so, what action? N127E

THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS:

(1) Yes, should the South African Government become aware that the property rights of its citizens in a foreign country are compromised, it would be addressed through diplomatic channels.

(2) Yes, my department as well as the South African High Commission in Harare received representations from South African citizens as well as South African-owned companies requesting assistance regarding threats from Zimbabwean pressure groups against their property.

(3) The department and the High Commission in Harare took the following steps in the past to assist and protect South African citizens and companies' property rights from possible threats in Zimbabwe:

• The Director-General of Foreign Affairs called in the Zimbabwean High Commissioner in Pretoria, Mr S K

Moyo, during 2001 to protest against such actions.

• The South African High Commissioner in Harare also consulted with the Zimbabwean government in this regard.

• As a result of these interventions the situation is considered to have normalised.

(4) The South African Government would continue to ensure the safety and security of all its citizens, their property as well as South African-owned companies operating in foreign countries.
