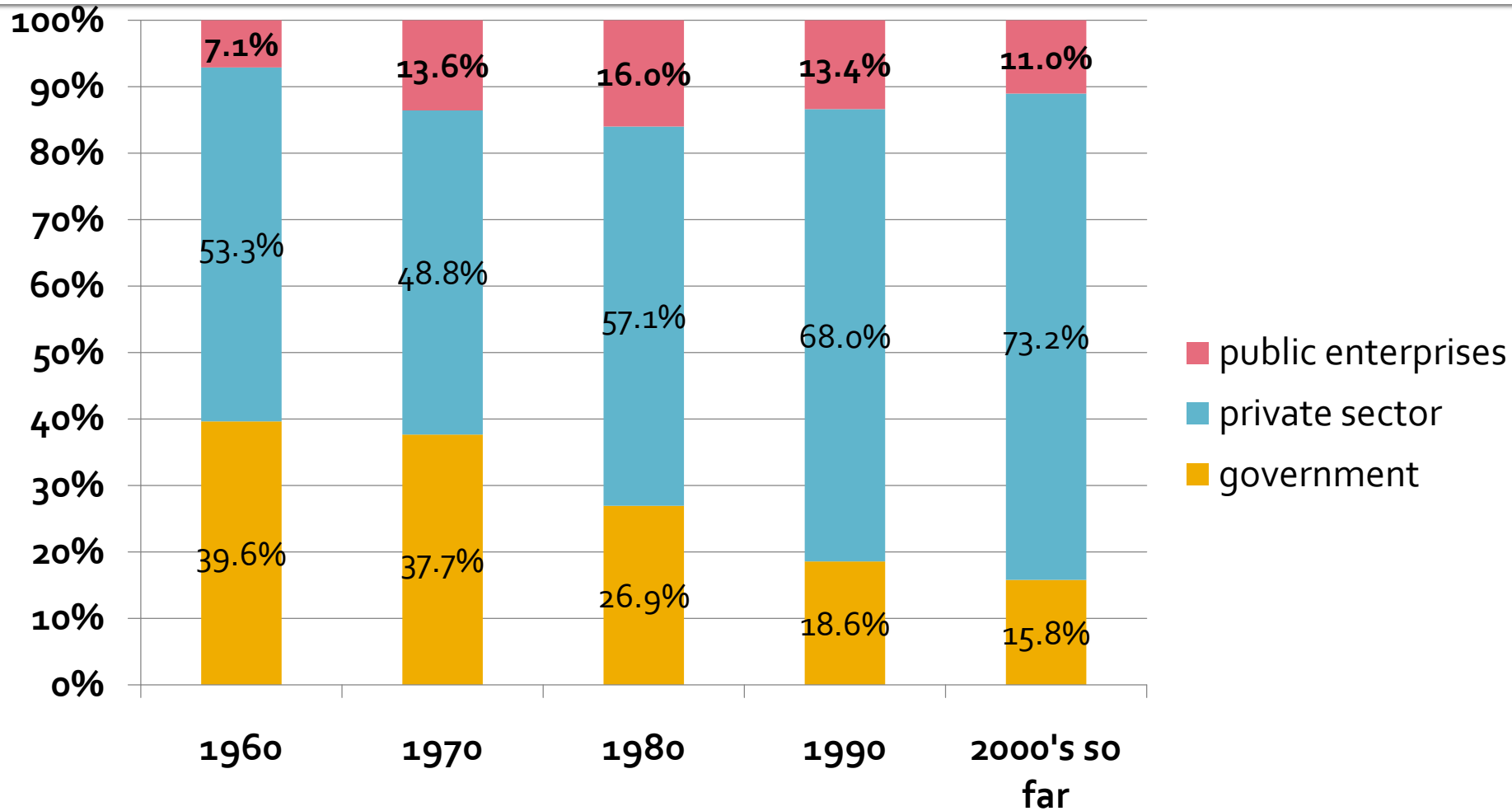

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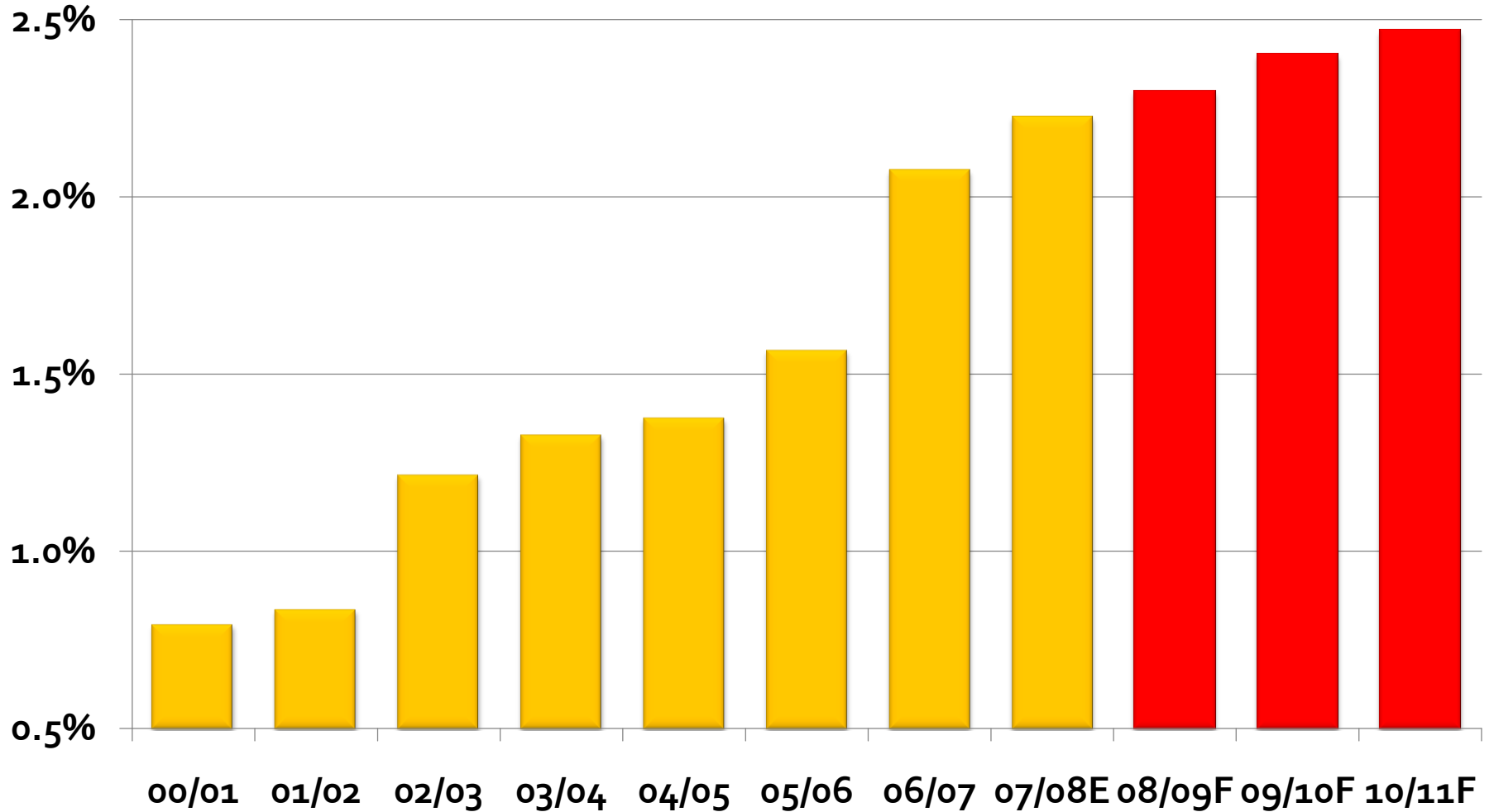
**Government Fixed investment as % of GDP.

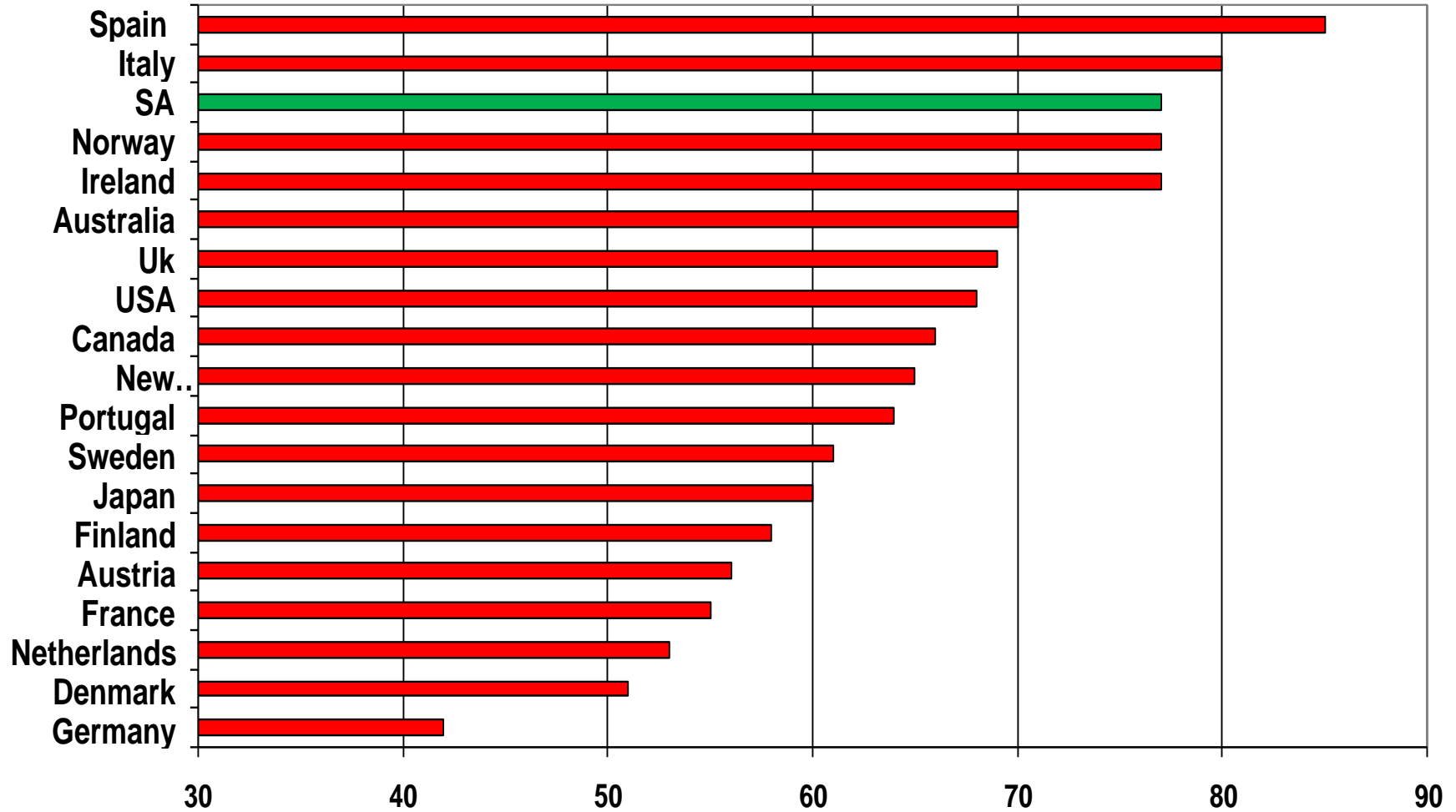


# Houses in SA vs. household size

- South Africa has built 3,43 million houses since 1994.
  - Private and public combined.
  - By end March we should go over 3,5 million.
  - More than 70% of household live in formal houses and about 16% in traditional houses.
- In 2000 60,5% of the population was staying in household with 3 or less people,
- In March 2007 the number changed to 66,3% of the population stayed in household with 3 or less people.
  - Nearly 28% of People (not households) live alone!!!
- More than 70% of South Africans own their own homes.
- Our average household size has dropped from 4,75 people per household in 1995 to 3.5 people per household in 2007.
- If household size stayed the same we would have 1,6 million too many houses.

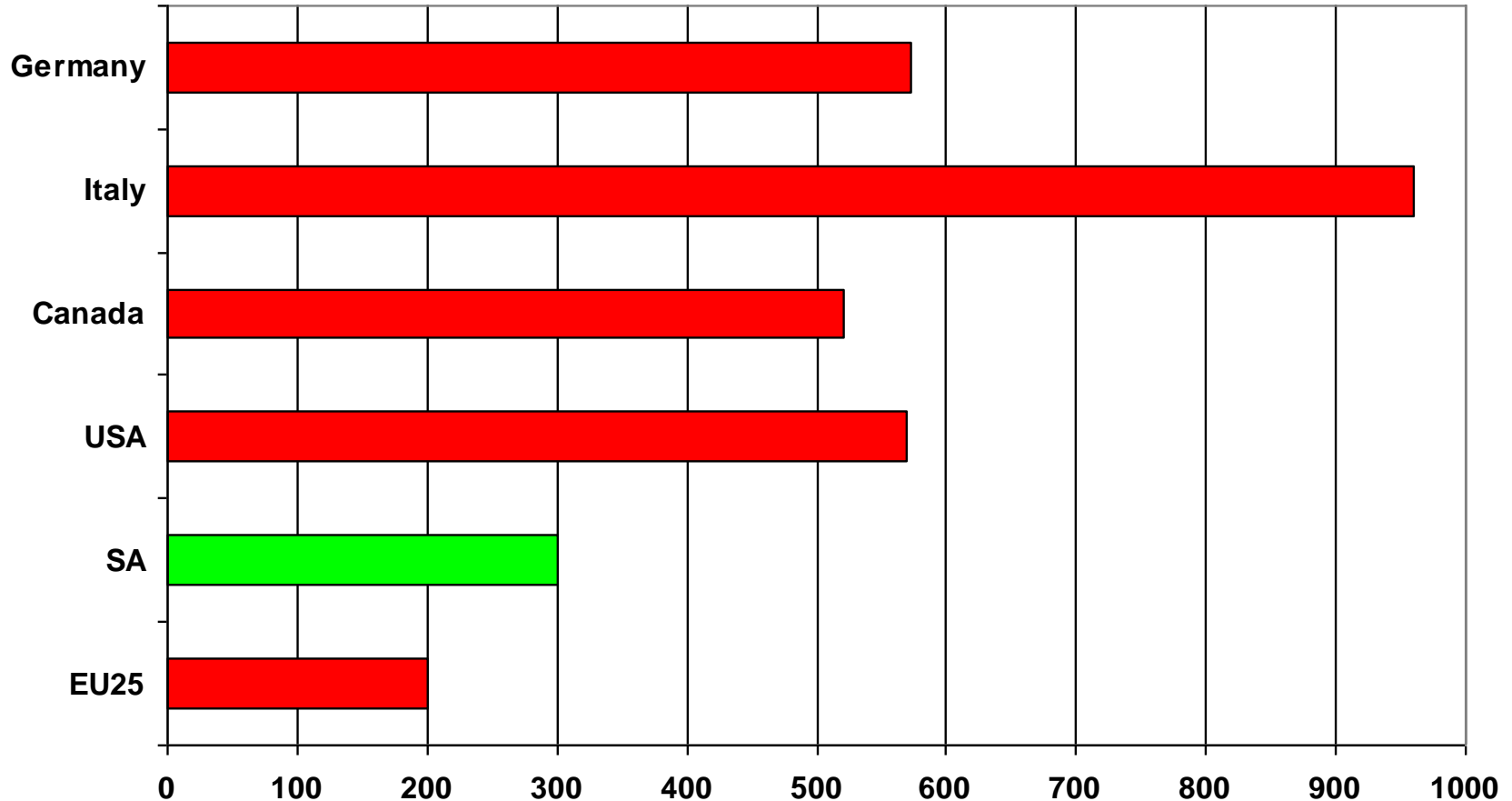
# Home ownership rates.

# Net wealth to disposable income.

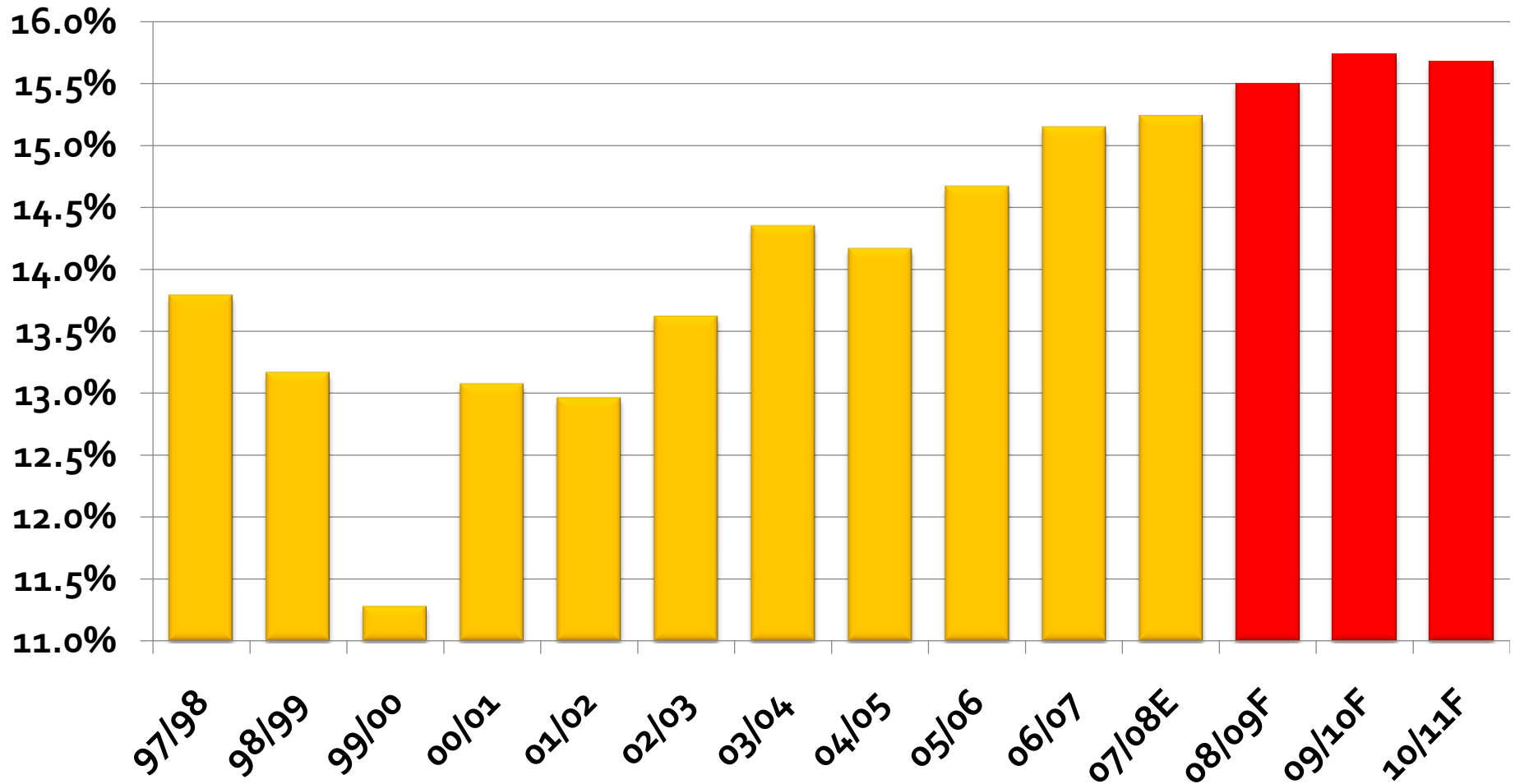

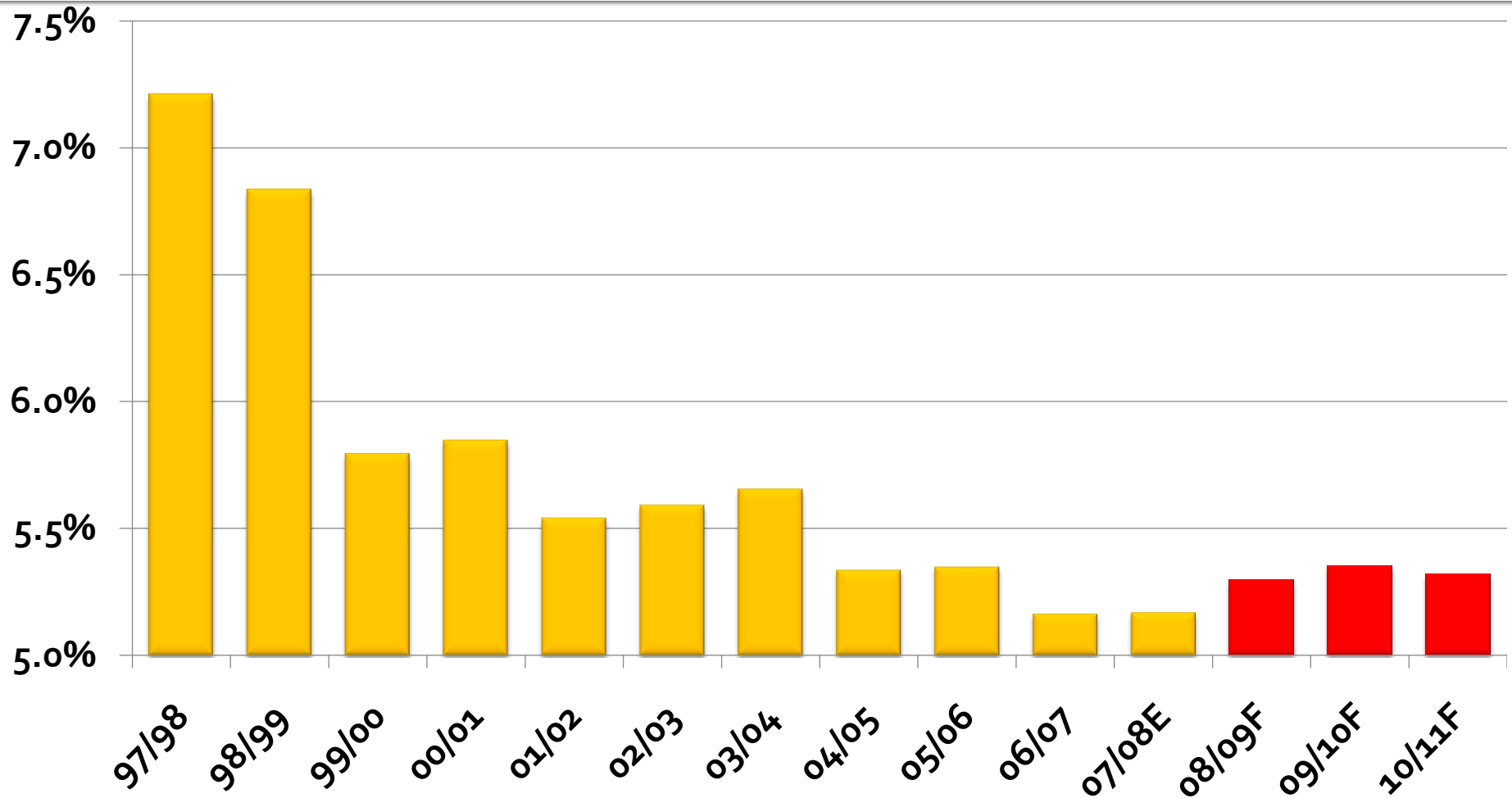

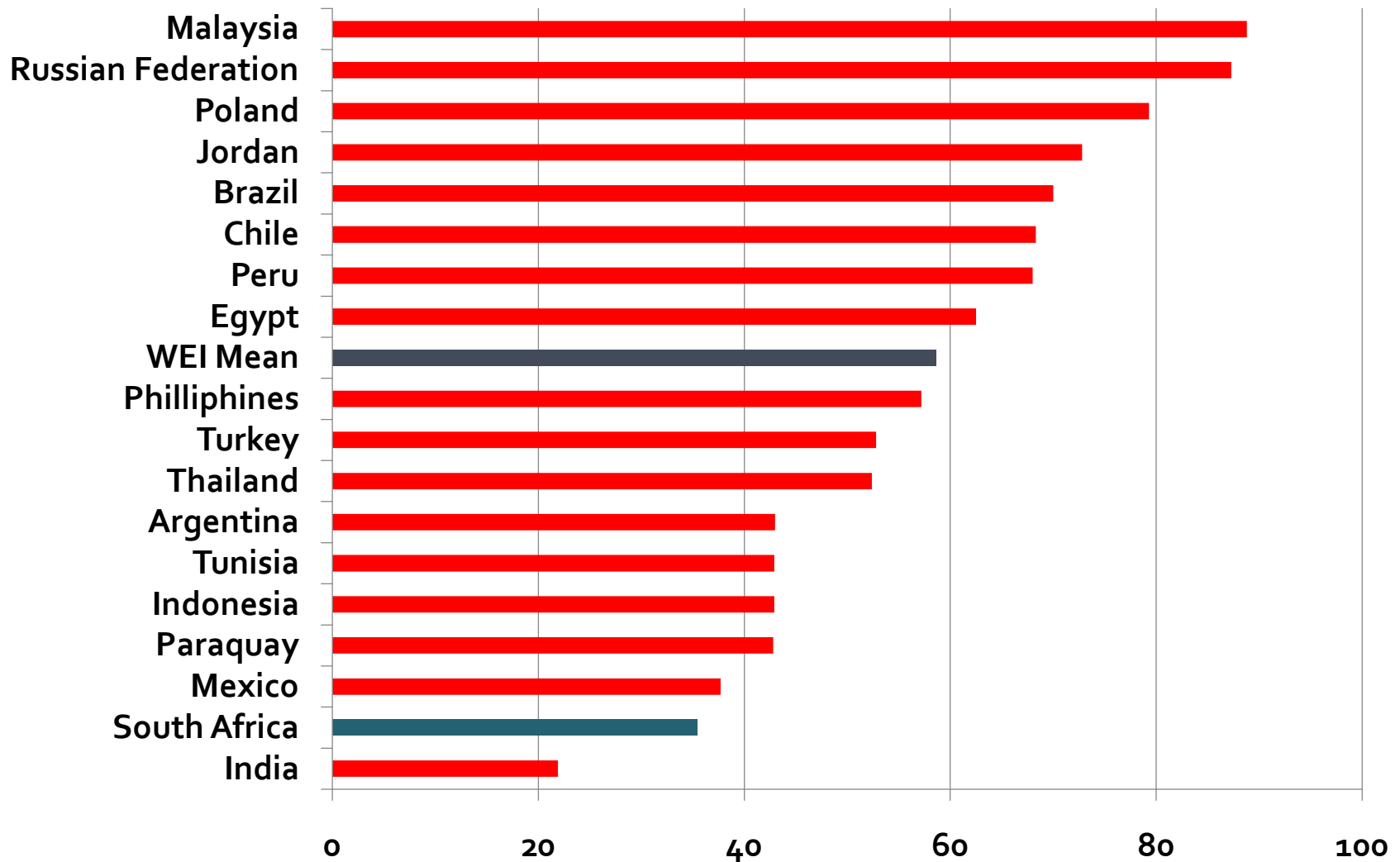
# Social services as % of GDP



# Education as % of GDP

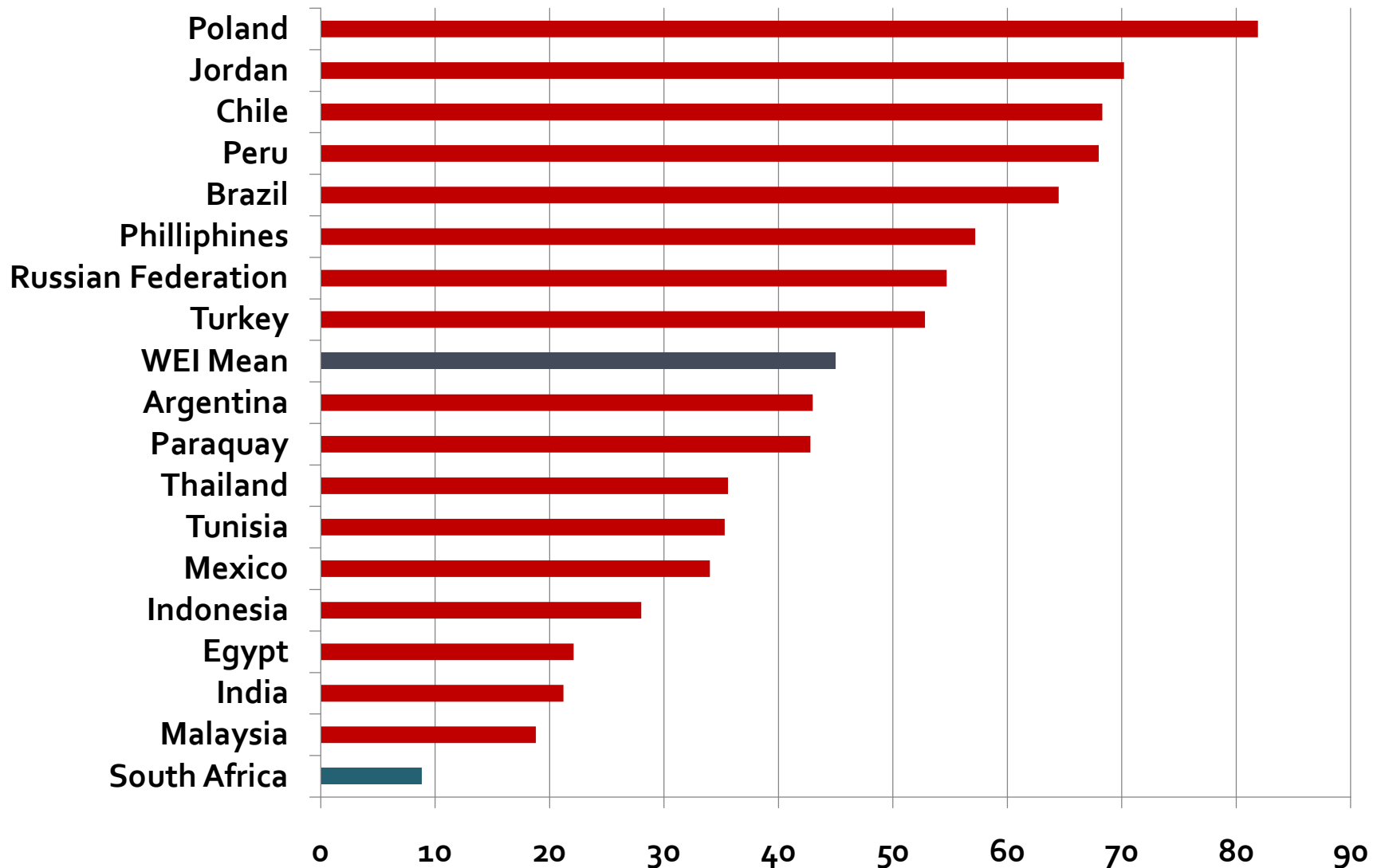


# Ratio of age group completing high school. Selected emerging market countries 2005.

# University exemption ratio's of school leavers of relevant age group.

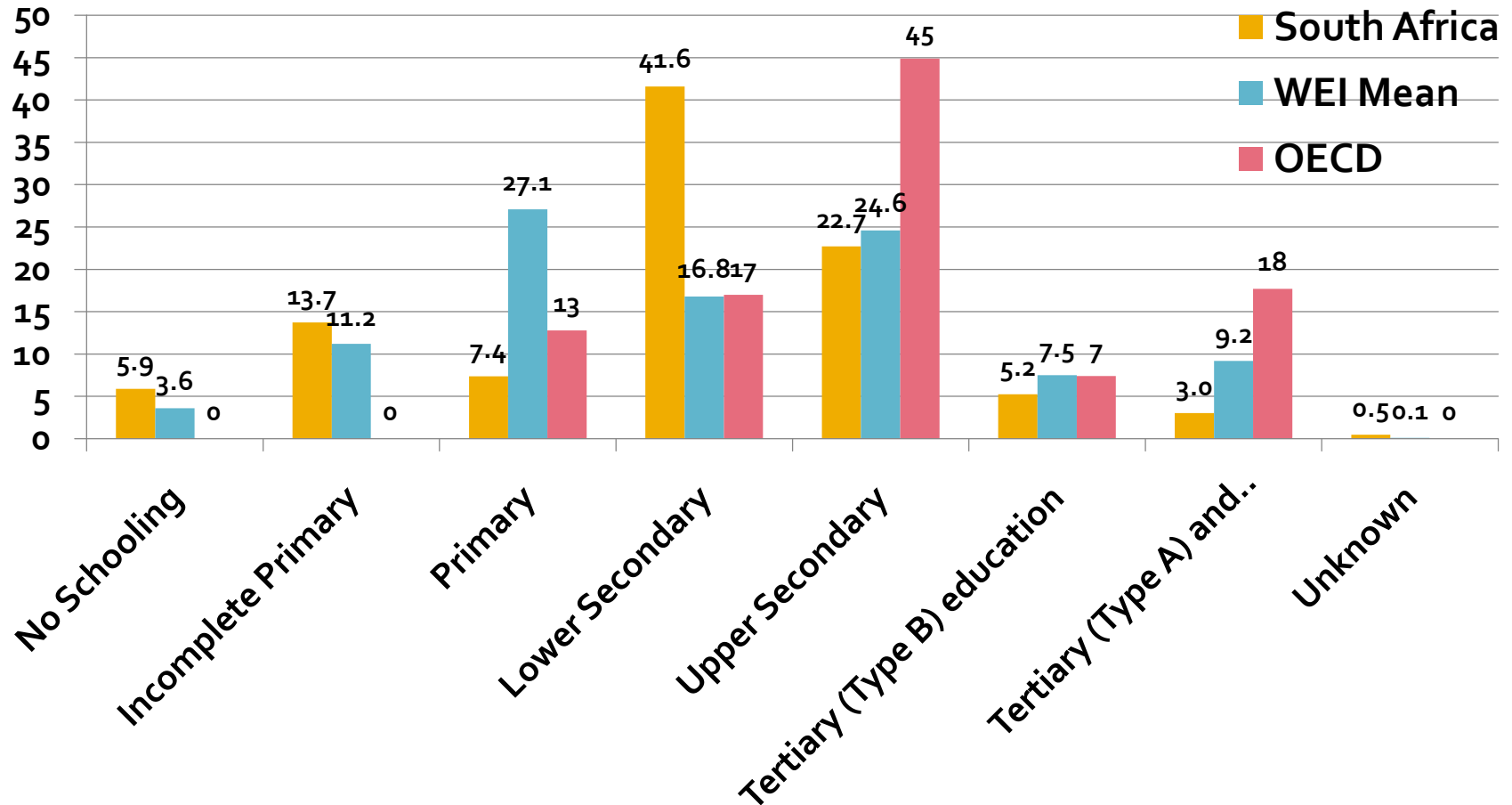

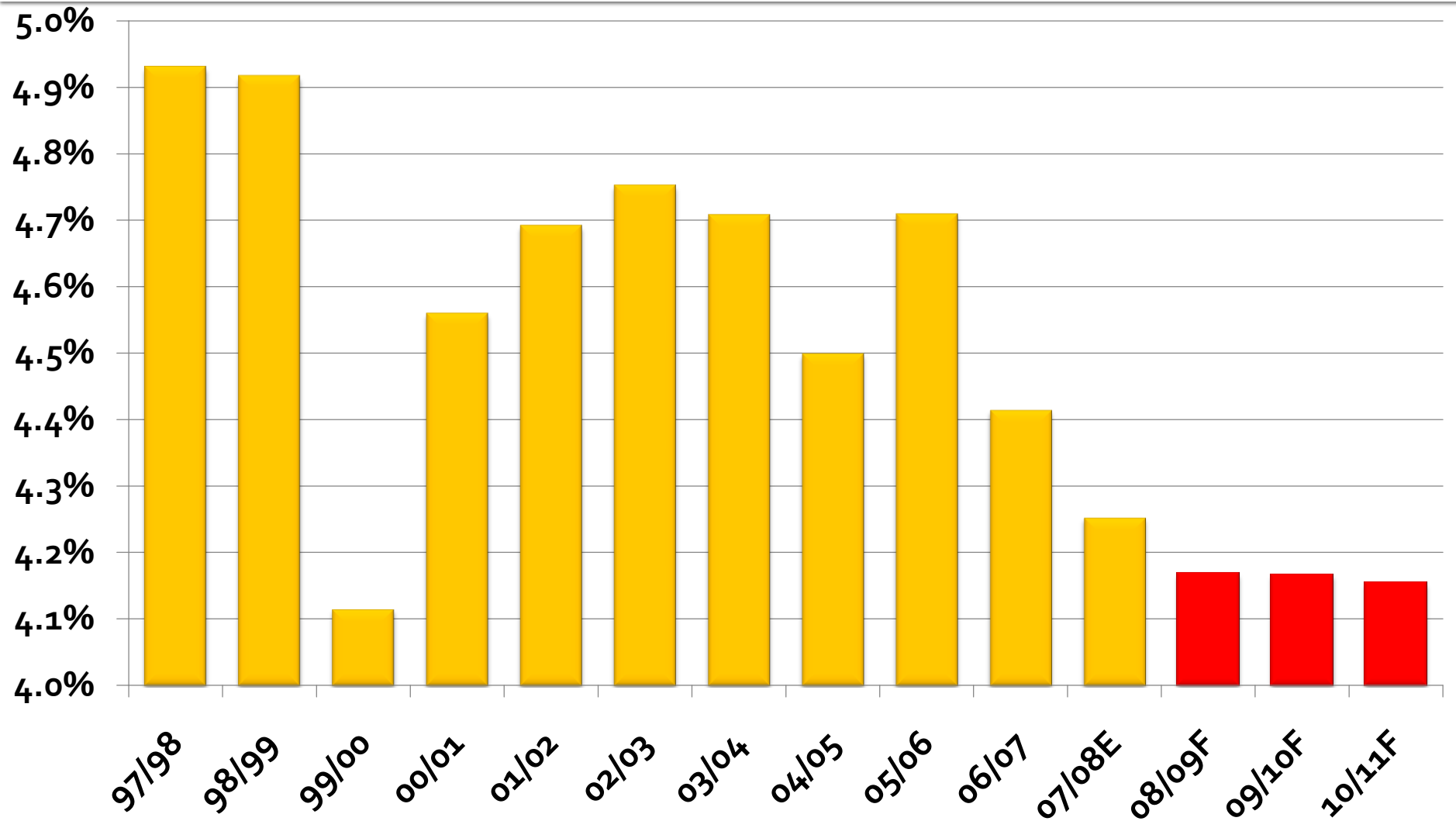
