









External Business Imperatives

- Formation of a National Water Resource Infrastructure Agency












Advisory Services

Komati Water Scheme Augmentation Project


- Water supply to Eskom's Duvha and Matla power Stations

- Implementation up to 2012








BWP: Project Highlights


- Completion within time and budget ready for water delivery to City of Cape Town
- Maintained Fitch Credit Ratings of AA + (zaf) long term and F1 + (zaf) short-term
- More than 1000 jobs created for local communities
- Exceeded procurement targets for BEE participation
- 99% compliance level to with environmental requirements
- 80 La Motte houses to be transferred to the Stellenbosch Municipality for benefit of local communities
- Received two merit awards for Engineering and Environmental excellence













VRESAP: Project Highlights

- Completion of the laying of the 121 km pipeline
- Substantial completion of high-lift pump station and associated infrastructure including the temporary pump station
- 1315 jobs created for local communities
- On schedule to achieve procurement targets set for BEE enterprises including engagement of six woman owned construction companies
- 91% compliance rating on environmental requirements
- On schedule for commencement of water delivery by December 2008
- Completion within approved revised budget of R2.7 billion
