







Tourism Community Invest & Access Roads Internal Park Roads (approx 150km) Consolidation key ecological areas (land rehab programme – 15) Park Fencing (190km) Conservation infrastructure (mg, rds, accommodation, bomas etc.) Public access infrastructure (jetty, hides, picnic sites, tourism roads etc. Year on year30% capex labour & 50% SMME R90 million secured for next 3 years

Transformation: Tourism – equity (transformation of sector locally – mandatory partner focus);










## Settlement of land claims and co-management




- RLCC responsible for land claim settlement

- 9 of 14 claims settled




# Capacity building of land claims Trusts Leadership training course for land claimants 2 Mobile workshops to Madikwe and Kruger Park






## Mandatory equity partners in tourism
