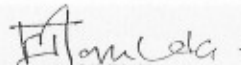
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FOREWORD

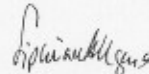
This publication describes the policy statement and the process and procedures to be followed with respect to the Acquisition of Armaments in the DOD.

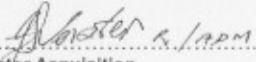


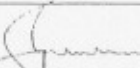
