As contained in our attached report, the facts of which are self explanatory, briefly state as follows.

1. We were re-instated back in the SAPS on 5 April 2004 after intervention by the Free State Legislature's Committee on Safety and Security.
2. We were retrospectively re-instated as all our remuneration and benefits for the period of our dismissal, approximately one year, were duly paid.
3. We were however excluded from the April 2005 pay progression increase and possible promotion because we were not assessed for 2003/2004 financial year, being the period during which we were dismissed.
4. It is our view that we are entitled to such benefits because of our retrospective re-instatement.

We therefore request the Speaker to intervene and on the strength of the information contained herein and in my attached affidavit assist us in our plight to rule that we be paid the salary increase as of April 2005 and we be duly considered for promotion.

Respectfully state that

As contained in my attached report, the facts of which are self-explanatory, briefly state as follows :

1. I was a police constable stationed in Hennenman police station.
2. I opened a charge against Sergeant Jacobs whom I found having sexual intercourse with a prisoner in holding cells.
3. Sergeant Jacobs became an investigating officer in a case where I was found guilty of assault with intent to do grievous bodily harm. I was convicted and sentenced for 2 years imprisonment of which I only served six months. I complained about Sergeant Jacobs being the investigator as well as the whole legal process but to no avail.
4. Six days after I was released I approached the Station Commander and requested that I be re-enlisted in the SAPS. He duly obliged but the Provincial Office failed to re-enlist me.
5. There is evidence that two white policemen were respectively sentenced to prison sentences for murder and Assault with intent to do Grievous Bodily Harm but continue to serve in the SAPS . They were re-enlisted after their release.

I therefore request the Speaker to intervene and on the strength of the information contained herein and in my attached statement and rule that re-enlistment be effected.

Wherefore your petitioner(s) request(s) that the Honourable Legislature will be pleased to take this case into consideration and to take such action and / or grant such relief as it may deem fit.
