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STRATEGIC PLAN FOR THE PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORT 2009-2014

1. Introduction

The fourth democratic parliament with its elected representatives highlighted the need for emphasis on Parliament's oversight role over government departments and the state owned enterprises. The five year plan provides the Committee with a strategic framework and medium term plan for the implementation of the strategic objectives of the committee as aligned to those of the Department of Transport and its transport Entities for the next five years. This strategic framework incorporates key priorities emanating from the state of the nation address, the Committee's Strategic Planning workshop and strategic priorities of the department and transport entities identified by the Department of Transport in a workshop between the Department and the Committee.

2. Role and Mandate of the Portfolio Committee on Transport

Parliament has a constitutional obligation to ensure that the executive is accountable on the decisions they make in improving the country and executing public funds. The Committees of the National Assembly were delegated functions according to rule 201(1) of the National Assembly Rules. The significant functions as delegated to the National Assembly Committees in the oversight role over the government department and state owned enterprises and facilitate legislation. According to the Rules of Parliament, the Portfolio Committee on Transport must deal with bills and matters falling with the transport sector as referred by the Constitution, rules of Parliament, National Assembly and legislation. In addition the Committee is further required to

maintain oversight over the national executive authority including the implementation of legislation amongst others. The Committee's mandate is therefore as follows:

- ❖ Scrutinise legislation and other policies that impact on the spheres of transport sector
- ❖ Exercise oversight role to the Department of Transport and the various institutions and agencies that fall under the National Transport budget, and an active engagement with all key stake-holders in the sector;
- ❖ Facilitate development and ongoing evaluation of transport policy.
- ❖ Contribute to our country's overall growth and development objectives, particularly in regard to job creation and employment intensity.

3. Strategic Priorities Arising from the 2009 State of the Nation Address

The key priorities raised in the state of the Nation Address relating to transport were identified as follows:

- Investing in public transport, including the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system
- Promoting the implementation of Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (BBBEE) and the Portfolio Committee on Transport would monitor the implementation of this framework in the transport sector.
- Creating job opportunities through the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) thus reducing poverty
- Investing in 2010 Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) World Cup projects
- The Committee would monitor the effective implementation of the taxi recapitalisation programme.

4. Key Priorities for Transport (2009-2014)

The following issues would be priorities by the portfolio Committee on Transport in its oversight work over the Department of Transport and the Transport entities.

- Update and implementation of the BRT
- Follow up on the Administrative Adjudication Road Traffic Offences (AARTO)
- Revisit the organisational structure of the Department of Transport and the unfunded posts which inhibit the department from fully implementing its programmes. Especially the issue relating to the numerous acting positions.
- Monitor the development of the master plan for Transport
- Ensure there is an integrated transport plan and coordination model with all spheres of government.

- Facilitate rural transport development especially relating to public transport.
- State of readiness of all transport modes involved in 2010
- Address the potential fuel shortage of the aviation sector for 2010
- Preparations made by the host cities
- Scholar transport and primary department involved in coordinating
- Re-visit the non-motorised transport policies and evaluate the implementation
- Monitor the shova-kalula programme
- Briefing on the South African National Women in Transport (SANWIT).
- Review the findings of the national household survey and how they impact on commuter's traveling in South Africa.
- Revisit the organizational structure of the Civil Aviation Authority
- Update on the Implementation of the transport sector BEE charter
- Update on the anti-poverty strategy and development of rural public transport
- Briefing on National Overload Control Strategy
- Briefing on the National Road Asset Management
- Update on the implementation of the National Traffic Law Enforcement Code
- Road Construction and maintenance evaluation in South Africa
- Update report on the multi-ticketing system and implementation of the integrated transport plan.

6. Oversight Visits:

A) Local

- Re-visiting the host cities to assess their state of readiness for 2010
- Visit the Gautrain, looking at the operations and how it would improve public transport for faster transportation of commuters
- Visit La-Mercy Airport and monitor its operations
- Visit rural areas to see whether or not public transport has improved especially the mode of transport used and monitor the implementation of the shova-kalula programme.
- Visit Road Accident Fund offices, traffic centers to inspect on service delivery
- Visit the business express trains and determine whether it is indeed value for money

B) International Study Tours

- **Canada:**

The Committee would look at the value chain cooperatives development in Canada. This would allow with the transformation of the taxi industry in South Africa. This would assist in facilitating policy development of the taxi industry by transforming it from being organizational to cooperatives.

- **China :**

The Committee would look at the innovative techniques on road transport, in countries where Gravel road is used but does not damage cars and does not created dust. Cold Asfat.
