Quality Control Assessment Committee

The Auditor-General has established the Quality Control Assessment Committee as an oversight body to assist the Auditor-General and the Deputy Auditor-General in fulfilling their responsibilities for the implementation of a quality control system. These responsibilities include performing quality control reviews in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (ISA).

Such reviews are conducted by the Practice Review Unit of the Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors (IRBA), together with the Quality Control Unit of the Auditor-General. All review reports are submitted to the Quality Control Assessment Committee, that meets once a year, which is professionally assisted by the IRBA and is responsible for:

- reviewing and approving the policy on monitoring of quality control compliance of the AGSA
- · assess engagement manager quality control review reports
- Consider the impact of findings on policies and processes in the AGSA.
