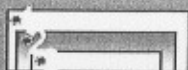
The SAFA Development Framework

Interdependencies in the National Development Framework





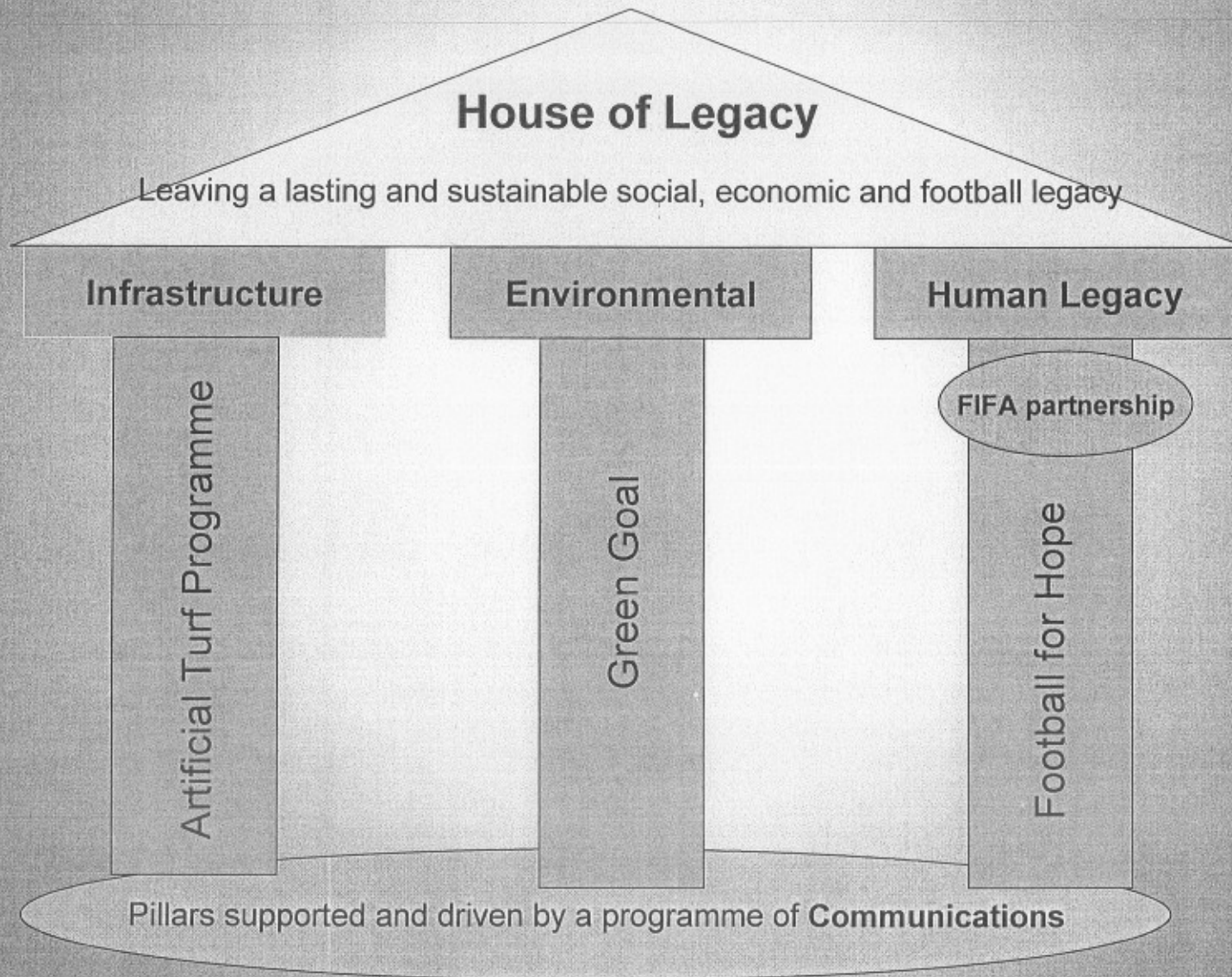

FWC Legacy Projects

- Youth Development Programmes at the turfs
 - Partnerships are being sought with role-players in this field to run youth development programmes at the facilities, using football as the vehicle. This will include computer based educational programmes, life-skills and leadership training, HIV and Aids and anti-crime initiatives, etc
- Green Goal programme at each site
 - It is planned that Solar panels and rain water tanks will be installed at the venues.
- HR Programme at the Football Turfs
 - Important to have a HR Plan for each facility
 - Looking for partnership with Provincial Governments and others.

Football Turf Program

- The Football turf Programme consists of:
 - 52 Football Turfs:
 - The Plan is to build 52 Football Turfs in SA, one in each SAFA region. Besides the turf, the plan is to construct a club house with change room and ablution facilities, perimeter fencing and training lights. This will be one of the most tangible legacies of the FWC.
 - Football Turf Management and Maintenance Training
 - FIFA has committed to provide the necessary training for the Management and maintenance of the turfs
 - Football Development Programme
 - A football development programme will be introduced at each of the football turfs in partnership with local and international institutions
 - Former football players (legends) will be targeted for this programme
