



- Football Development Programme

FOOTBALL TURFS PROGRAMME


- Green goal programme at each site

 Government and others.



PROGRESS TO DATE



- Secured funding for 27/52 facilities by the National Lottery
- Agreed on locations with regional SAFA structures and affected Municipalities.
- First 8 (one per province) completed by the end of May 2010
- The remaining 19 facilities (16 identified) from this funding will be completed by the end of July 2010
- Seeking to partner with provinces, cities and other funders to acquire additional funding to construct perimeter fence, clubhouse with change room and ablution as well as training lights
- Additional funding sought to achieve ideal of 52 football turfs (1 in each SAFA region)

PROPOSED CRITERIA



- Rural bias with 20% to be located in schools
- Existing sports complex -minimum earthworks
- Commitment from Local Authority to fund the shortfall and provide-preferably part of MIG programme
- Alignment with Provincial Spatial Development and Strategic Infrastructure plan
- Usage levels- No. of teams
- Broad consultation with prioritisation of a selection of available sites. (Each region to forward preferred site with necessary motivation)

Benefits



Unaffected by weather and resistant to harsh climatic conditions (rain, snow, drought, frost etc.).



Ideal for covered stadia or stadia where steep stands cast a great deal of shade (artificial turf does not need sunlight).



Easy maintenance and low maintenance costs.



Fewer playing fields required, because it has greater longevity.



A variety of potential uses: training, matches and cultural events can be held on the same turf.



Improved playing conditions, which remain constant all year round.
