The international climate change regime

The UN framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)

- overall framework for intergovernmental efforts
- near universal participation (194 countries have ratified)
- Ultimate Objective: "to achieve stabilization of atmospheric concentrations of greenhouse gases at levels that would prevent dangerous anthropogenic interference with the climate system".

Kyoto Protocol

- Shares the objectives of the Convention
- Commits 37 industrialised countries to legally binding GHG reduction targets
- First commitment period is 2008-2012
