### GLOBAL AVIATION INDUSTRY REVIEW FY2009-10

- Global international scheduled passenger traffic declined by 3.1% in 2009 compared to 2008
- International traffic dropped by 3.9% while domestic traffic fell by 1.8%
- Total (international and domestic) traffic declined in all regions except for the Middle East
- A moderate recovery is expected for 2010 with a 3.3% traffic growth forecast
- The momentum is expected to continue in 2011, on the way to full recovery and traditional growth trends of 5.5% per year
- In 2009, cargo traffic dropped by 15% in terms of total freight tonne kilometers (FTK) compared to 2008, significantly worse than the 6.2% drop in 2001



### GLOBAL AVIATION INDUSTRY REVIEW FY2009-10

- Revenues: Industry revenues are expected to rise by USD22 billion (4.9%) to USD478 billion in 2010, compared to 2009
- Passenger Demand: Following a decline of 3.1% in 2009, passenger traffic is expected to grow by 4.5% in 2010. A total of 2.28 billion people are expected to fly in 2010
- Cargo Demand: Cargo demand is expected to grow by 7% to 37.7 million tonnes in 2010, following a 13% decline in 2009
- Fuel: An average oil price of USD75.0 per barrel (Brent) is expected in 2010, up considerably from the USD61.8 average expected for 2009
- $\leq$  All regions except Africa will see an improvement in the next financial year
- African carriers will deliver a loss of USD100 million in 2010, consistent with the USD100 million loss of 2009

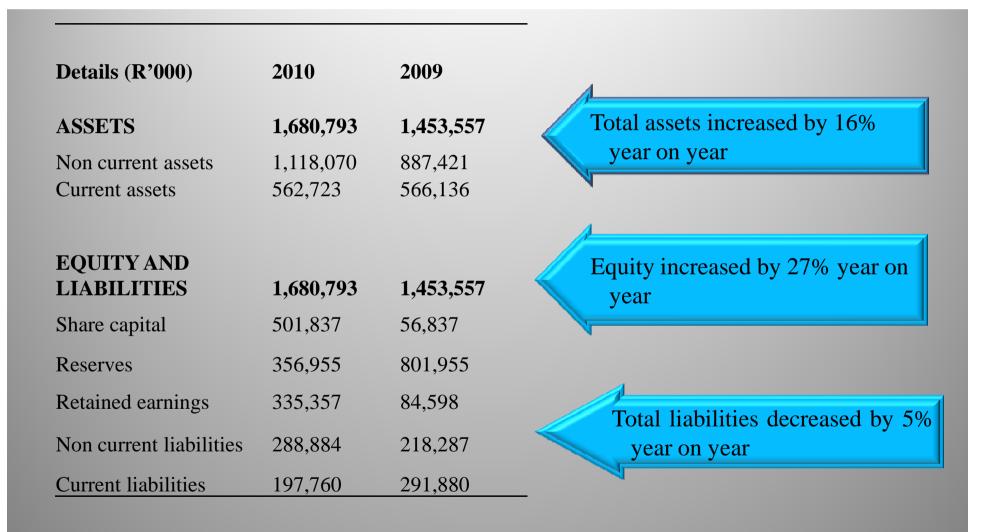

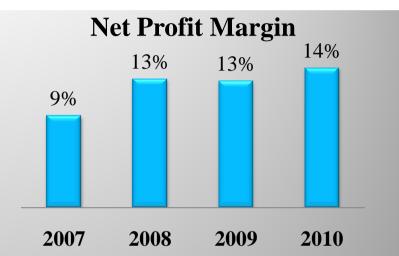

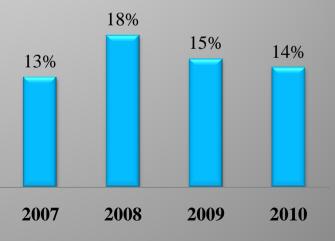


# **KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS**

- Despite the global pressure on the economy and airlines in general, the Nett Profit Margin of SA EXPRESS increased to 14% from 13% in the previous year.
- Return-on-Assets decreased by 1% to 14% in the current financial period
- The Current Ratio increased to 2.84 times
   compared to 1.93 times in the prior period,
   reflecting the increase in the ability to meet short
   term obligations



### **Return on assets**



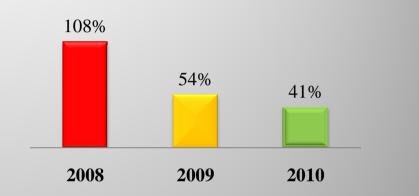

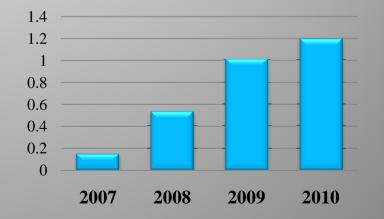
### **Debt/ Equity Ratio**
