THAI 1 RACKETEERING CASE

- Started as a simple investigation of prostitution at a brothel in Durban
- At the time the accused were arrested (2007). There was no Human Trafficking Legislation in place
- It became a high profile racketeering case based on the predicate offences of
 - Prostitution
 - Keeping a brothel
 - Money Laundering
 - Immigration Offences
- Trial commenced in 2009 after numerous delays by accused
- Both accused convicted in March 2010
- Provisional sentencing November 2010
- Facts of case fitted profile of a Human Trafficking structure that was highly organised







- Special emphasis on training to raise awareness and create expertise;
- Regular training workshops presented to SAPS members especially front line officers working at Port of Entry, Organised Crime and Task Team;
- ▶ In-service training to Port of Entry countrywide on request.
- Over 1 000 Police officers received training during the last 2 years
- New module for organised crime was developed, including a chapter on Human Trafficking that are being presented during Organised Crime investigation Course after new course
- Since 2007, 392 Organised Crime Investigators were trained

Strategic Cooperation & Partnerships

- Integrated and Multi-Disciplinary approach with various stakeholders

Handling of Cases

 - IOM and various shelters available for victims
