#### **Purpose**

- The presentation outlines the progress to date on the Comprehensive Rural Development Programme (CRDP)
- Highlights the National Rural Youth Services Corps (NARYSEC) programme
- Provides highlights of achievements and key tasks outstanding
- Highlights issues emanating from the pilots that have been used to enhance the current policy processes

#### **Background**

- CRDP was launched in August 2009 and aims to create "vibrant, equitable and sustainable rural communities"
- Divided into three phases:
- Phase 1: Meeting Basic Human Needs
- Phase Two: Enterprise Development
- Phase Three: Village Industries, Access to Credit
   Facilities
- In 2009-2010 the Department piloted the programme in 8 of the 9 provinces in 29 Wards
- In 2010-2011 the aim was to roll out to a further 25
   Wards but the Department is now working towards 39
   Wards

#### **NARYSEC: Youth Empowerment Programme**

- Is a programme targeting youth in all rural wards in South Africa;
- in each Ward, 4 young people (of which one is a person living with disabilities) are to be employed for a period of two years;
- skills development will include discipline, patriotism, life skills, rights awareness and specific skills areas empowering youth to change rural areas.





#### **BRIEF UPDATE ON NARYSEC PROGRESS**

- Completed two week training programme for 600 youth in various FETs in the Western Cape.
- SANDF Implementation Protocol finalized.
- 500 Youth reported to De Brug near Bloemfontein on 30 January 2011.
- Minister for Higher Education and Training responded to DRDLR's request for funding. Indicated that funding mechanisms are undergoing change but can be discussed with the responsible DDG.
- Free State province welcomed 358 youth on 01 February.
- Further events on 1 March and 1 April
- · Household Profiling plan finalized by STRIF team.



#### NEXT ACTIVITIES: NARYSEC

- Household Profiling will be done in 60 wards in all nine provinces starting with prioritized CRDP sites and other wards.
- Training for household profiling has been completed and further refresher training has commenced.
- Certification parade for De Brug scheduled for 17 March 2011.

  - 3 e-Rap centers (computer centers run by the rural communities) completed (Muyexe and Riemvasmaak)
  - 47 Village Viewing Areas established for World Cup

- Current Projects
  - Riemvasmaak
    - Agricultural Infrastructure projects (Live stock water improvement projects, Sales Pens, etc)
    - Water (37 km pipeline)
    - Social Infrastructure (Sewer network, houses, solar projects, community halls, etc)
      - 300 additional Household gardens being established

#### **Northern Cape continued**

  - 128 houses completed
  - 60 VIP toilets
  - 2 e-Rap centers
  - Clinic completed in Sending
  - Sports field upgrade completed
