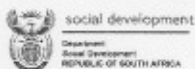

Mandate of the CDA

In terms of the Prevention and Treatment of Drug Dependency Act, Act 20 of 1992 the CDA is expected to:

- Advise the Minister on any matter relating to substance abuse
- May plan, coordinate and promote measures relating to the prevention and combating of the drug abuse and the treatment of persons dependent on drugs

Mandate continue

- Shall review the National Drug Master Plan every five year and submit to Cabinet for approval
- Shall report annually to Parliament on progress in combating substance abuse in the country
- Arrange conferences/summits relating to combating substance abuse in South Africa
- Exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be determined by the Minister from time to



time

- Vision: The vision of the National Drug Master Plan is a drug-free society
- Mission: Mission of the NDMP is to implement holistic and cost effective strategies to reduce the supply and consumption of drugs and to limit the harm associated with substance use, abuse and dependency in South Africa

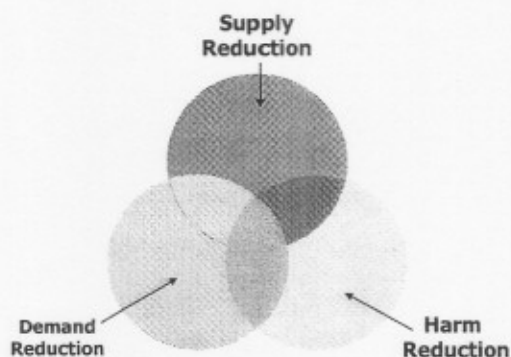

Achievements for the CDA

- The CDA embarked on National Departments and Provincial visits to solicit support of Ministers, Premiers, and MECs.
- CDA participated in Provincial Summits in preparation for the National Summit
- In planning for the 2nd Biennial Anti-Substance Abuse Summit the CDA embarked on community mobilisation at local level with communities

Achievements cont

- Door to door research was conducted in all nine provinces to collect data on trends and types of drugs used and abused. The Local Drug Action Committees identified the sites for conducting research. This was in preparation for the National Summit on Substance Abuse that took place on 15 – 17 March 2011.

Achievements cont

- The research on nature, extent, prevalence and impact of Substance Abuse in Communities has commenced
- National Database and National Clearinghouse has been developed. It is a virtual and electronic substance abuse information storage/warehouse.

Achievements cont

- The CDA has established a reporting tool called Quick Analysis on Substance Abuse Reporting (QUASAR)
- A monitoring tool has been developed and piloted in provinces
- Review of the National Drug Master Plan started and will be further informed by the information from the National Summit

Achievements cont

- Recognising the importance of the resolutions adopted at the Summit, the CDA to prioritise immediate, medium term priorities
- Informing members of the IMC of the resolutions identified as the priorities for their departments
- Review of the NDMP, in preparation for the appointment of the CDA members

Priorities

- To work on a coordinated programme
- To realise our mission
- To support government departments, provincial forums and LDACs
- Continue research, mass mobilisation and dissemination of information

Priorities for 2011/2012

- The CDA strategic priorities are part of the Department of Social Development Strategic Plan
- Review of the National Drug Master Plan 2011/2012
- Monitor the National Departments and Provinces (Substance Abuse Forums and LDACs) to develop the Mini Drug Master Plans and those already developed to be updated

Priorities cont

- The CDA to unpack the Resolutions adopted at the 2nd Biennial Anti-Substance Abuse Summit and monitor their implementation
- Report back to the 9 Provincial Substance Abuse Forums and the Local Drug Action Committees (LDACs)

Priorities cont

- South Africa is at cross-roads due to the Summit and the CDA to ensure continued mobilisation of community structures to implement resolutions
- Monitor implementation of the Resolution by relevant departments and stakeholders
- Advising Minister and Parliament of new trends and types of substances of abuse
- Development of an acceptable definition and protocols for harm reduction in the South African

context
