- For the year ended 2010/11 the department received an adverse opinion on AOPI >> Audit of Reviewed Sufermedor
- The first quarter, while showing some improvements in the management of PI, there are still a few areas of concern:
 - Consistency in reporting format of actual performance differs from the target
 - Reported information not reliable
 - Incomplete and late submissions that impact on evaluating performance

The above areas were the basis for the adverse opinion.

- Adherence to reporting requirements and due date is critical in that it will assist
 - Identification of red flags
 - Timely intervention

WAY FORWARD

- The department has developed an action plan on the audit of performance information. A circular has been drawn setting out action required
- The monthly submission dates have been revised following concerns from the regions
- Monthly meetings have been scheduled with Policy Coordinators to deal with PI – best practices and challenges
