- The key strategic focus areas for Sport and Recreation South Africa are to increase the number of performances in Sport at an International level.
- SRSA continues to make valuable contributions to the strategic outcomes of the Government's Programme of Action such as inclusive citizenship, physical well being, skills development and economic growth
- The main responsibilities of SRSA is to develop National policies and guidelines for sport and recreation in the country. The key implementers are provinces and municipalities as well as SASCOC and the National Federations

## Institutional overview and summary

During the period under review Sport and Recreation South Africa served under the political leadership of the Reverend Dr MA Stofile from 1 April 2010 to 31 October 2010.

Mr FA Mbulala was appointed as Minister of Sport and Recreation South Africa on 1 November 2011.



## Institutional overview and summary

- The Department has an establishment consisting of 220 posts, all of which are funded.
- The Department filled 188 of the 220 posts
- The Department also employed 26 interns during 2010/2011.2 secondments from GIZ
- A draft functional structure was developed in 2010/11 financial year but needs to be reviewed in 2011/12 financial year following the new strategic initiatives documented in the SRSA Road Map and the finalisation of the National Sport and Recreation Plan.
- The position of Director-General became vacant with effect from 27 February 2011, because of the untimely death of Mr V.P. Petersen.



## Institutional overview and summary

- There are two public entities that report to SRSA in specific areas and in terms of the legislative prescripts, namely Boxing South Africa and The South African Institute for Drug Free Sport.
- The Department also received assistance from the German Government/EU Funding – KFW funded the construction of multi-purpose combination courts for Youth Development against Violence through Sports Programmes Youth Development through sport , technical assistance to SRSA and 2010 FIFA World Cup programmes.



## Institutional overview and summary

- SRSA continues to play a major role in the activities of the Supreme Council for Sport in Africa and the establishment of a new sport structure within the AU.
- In terms of Governments 12 Outcomes SRSA is a delivery partner to Outcome 12, - for an efficient , effective and development oriented public service and an empowered , fair and inclusive citizenship.
- Negotiations continues with the Department of Basic Education and good progress was made in the finalising of a draft integrated school sport framework



## Institutional overview and summary

- Audit Committee and Risk Committee meetings have taken place.
- Regular Management, Audit steering committee and Budget Committee meetings took place.
- Unqualified audit report for 2010/2011
- The lease to the building occupied by Sport and Recreation ends in October 2011.
- The process of acquiring new office accommodation began in October 2010.
- The present office space is not sufficient for the present personnel complement, the human resource assistance from GIZ, interns and other stakeholders like the office of the AG who work from the offices of SRSA

- The 2010 FIFA World Cup hosted in South Africa. Seventeen guarantees were successfully managed.

- "Ke Nako" Africa project which was successfully launched at Birchwood on 10 June 2010 in partnership with the European Union and GTZ.

- SRSA Annual Conference that took place in September 2010.

- Golden Games and Indigenous Games that took place during October 2010.

- The stakeholder consultation forum took place on 24 November 2010.

The Sports Heroes Walk against HIV and AIDS took place from 16 November 2010 to 1 December 2010 and 30 000 people participated across all communities. SRSA was a strategic partner in the delivery of the event.

- South African participation in the Zone VI Games.

- The Minister's strategic workshop took place from 10 to 12 January 2011.

## Institutional overview and Summary

- SRSA played a leading role that contributed to the successful hosting in South Africa of the following events: 2010 UCI BMX World Championships, INAS-FID World Football Championships for the intellectually impaired and T20 Champions League (cricket).
- SRSA assisted SASCOC and the IOC in the successful hosting of the 7th World Forum on Sport, Education and Culture. in Durban from 05 to 09 December 2010. Ongoing assistance was offered to SASCOC and IOC for the forthcoming 123rd IOC session to be held in Durban in July 2011.
- SRSA assisted the following National Federations in South Africa:
  - Cricket South Africa that hosted the ICC Women's Cricket Challenge.

- Rollersport SA that hosted the African Speed Championships in Hammanskraal
- The South African Football Association that hosted the CAF African Women's Football Champs
- South African Tennis Association that hosted the SA Tennis Open in Johannesburg.
- Youth development against violence through sport.
- HEADCOM meetings and Sports CEO forum meetings



## Institutional overview and summary

- Six legacy projects were initiated, namely Club Development, My School World Cup, Magnificent Fridays, outreach projects, capacity building and the 2010 Football World Cup legacy audit.
- The Magnificent Friday project was launched in support of three Federations, namely Netball, Cricket and Rugby. The number of participants increased to 29 459 against a target of 20 000 due to the participation in the Magnificent Friday events.



## Institutional overview

- A total of 366 athletes were provided with sport support services. Support to athletes was complemented by basic sport science education for 63 coaches. Services were rendered by means of training camps, medical and scientific interventions and a residential programme for 1 856 national development athletes.
- A total of 60 athletes (30 boys and 30 girls) from South Africa participated in the U/17 COSSASA Athletics Championship in Botswana. South Africa won 38 of the 71 medals. South Africans were also honoured as the best male and female athletes in both track and field events. Four athletes broke records and received individual trophies.



### Challenges

- Insufficient human and financial resources to implement the strategic plan. The finalisation of the Sports plan and the review of the structure should address this.
- Insufficient capacity to monitor the conditional grant given to the provinces to ensure that funds are utilised for its intended purposes.
